A message from Father Francis.... I believe one of the greatest obstacles or stumbling block to our faith is the fact that God's real presence is hidden in the ordinary realities of our daily lives. It is only by faith that we can look at the ordinary and see beyond. Our faith does not change the reality but it gives us a new perspective on reality. It is all the more true when we come to reflect on the Eucharist.

We find in today's gospel an invitation to move forward on our journey of faith when Jesus declares that he himself is the bread of life, the bread that came down from heaven. And whoever comes to him will never be hungry.

If there is one thing that we all share it is the same hunger – hunger for love, acceptance, recognition, relationship, etc. But there is one hunger that underlines all our other hungers – it is the hunger for eternal life. Jesus tells us plainly that he himself is the bread of life who will satisfy every hunger and it is a promise fulfilled in the Eucharist.

I was so happy to hear from some of our parishioners how delightful they are as the Church is now open for the Weekday Mass and they can also spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament in preparation for the Mass.

Thank you for all you do and I hope that you all have holidays arranged and I wish you all a refreshing time with family and friends in these coming weeks.



We have received a letter from Daniel Turner, Right to Life UK and share the information with you below.

Dear St Winefride's Parish

Firstly, Right To Life UK is very pleased to announce that Cardinal Vincent Nichols, Archbishop of Westminster, has become a patron of our organisation. We are very grateful to His Eminence for his support of our work.

Secondly, we would like to congratulate Lord Alton of Liverpool for being this year's recipient of The Westminster Award for Human Life, Human Rights, and Human Dignity. This award recognises extraordinary and notable work and achievements that safeguard the dignity and right to life of human beings. We are grateful for the many decades he has given to the protection of lives and for the inspiration he is to all those in politics and positions of influence.

Lastly, we would like to thank you for all your prayers and support over the past few months. You will have likely heard of a <u>recent parliamentary win</u>, wherein an attempt to hijack the UK Government's flagship Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill with two extreme abortion proposals failed. This would not have been possible without the support of you and your congregations. By contacting your MPs and sharing your disapproval of these amendments, it was made clear to MPs that these amendments lacked the support of their constituents and so were prevented from becoming law, leading to the likely saving of many lives.

In light of all this, we continue to reach out in request of prayers from both yourself and your parishioners. We'd love for you to include our intentions however you feel is most appropriate. I have written some suggested prayers that could be used over the coming month:

1st - "We pray for all unborn children diagnosed with disabilities, we pray for protection for them and their mothers from the pressures of society to have an abortion, and that they would instead experience overwhelming support by all who surround them. Lord hear us"

8th - "We pray for all women going through unexpected pregnancies, that they would experience peace and support in this circumstance, and recognise the many blessings that motherhood brings. Lord hear us"

15th - Yesterday we celebrated the feast of St Maximilian Kolbe, patron saint of the pro-life movement. On this feast of the Assumption, we ask for his intercession, along with Our Lady's, as we the church seek to support all pregnant mothers through their pregnancies, and that we would become models of support and charity to all in society. Lord hear us."

22nd - "We pray for the families and friends of pregnant women. That they would recognise their responsibility to care for both the mother and child, and that they would shower them with love and support through the journey of pregnancy and beyond. Lord hear us"

29th - "We bring to mind the words from James in our second reading and his call to look after those in need. We pray that, as a church, we would improve how we look after those who are experiencing difficulty in their pregnancies and provide the care and support they need in welcoming their child to the world. Lord hear us"
