# **SVP IN ST WINEFRIDE'S**

#### Dear Friends of St Winefride's

Our aim is to tackle poverty in all its forms through the provision of practical assistance ing Concern into Action to those in need. The concept of need is broader than financial hardship, a significant proportion of our work is visiting people who are sick, lonely, in hospital, or suffering. The essence of what we do is person-toperson contact and spending time with people is our greatest gift.

Here in St Winefride's, we live our mission through helping others in need in many ways. In the last year, we have made over 800 visits to parishioners and members of the local community either in their own homes or in hospital; the majority of them are to those living alone and unable to leave their homes; and we have made visits to families of all ages. We also help by organising transport to mass and we thank the many Parishioners doing this every week.

Sometimes, more practical help is needed such as food, clothes, furniture, holidays or financial help. Our members are active in supporting our local Foodbank and we regular help with providing funds to families often at times of major upheaval in their lives.

The Chester and Ellesmere Port District SVP own a holiday home at Talacre that is shared amongst the parishes. We have 4 weeks allocated throughout the year (from March to Oct) two of which are in the school holidays, if you know a family who would benefit please let us know. The cost of the holiday home is funded through the theatre night in June, a sponsored walk (to be held on I<sup>st</sup> October) and recycling printer ink cartridges and mobile phones; you can be place these in the box in the parish hall next to the photocopier.

In the summer, we organise an afternoon tea event for our older parishioners, this year we had 45 attend this popular event held at Inglewood Manor, this was a lovely time to meet-up and socialise. And in early December, we hold our SVP Christmas dinner; last year "Britain Has Got Talent" came to Neston and we had two singing stars from our parish who provided much fun and entertainment.

The SVP relies on the generosity of parishioner's in St Winefride's to fund many of our activities; the money raised goes to providing support for the events during the year, providing financial help to families and "Twinnage" supporting overseas SVP conferences. We support two conferences in India & Sudan, this enables them to assist families who are in need. In India each conference has adopted families who receive food, clothing and help with school fees and medical bills as there is no free welfare system in India. In addition, parishioners support two other schemes: the Sudan baby feeding appeal which helps to feed babies and young children in South Sudan through 2 feeding centres; the Indian Student Sponsorship scheme funds student school fees as education is not free. We are looking forward to starting a Tea & Coffee morning every Tuesday in the Parish Hall during Advent, if you are interested in volunteering to help or know someone who would like to come along, please contact us. And look out for more details in the parish newsletter in October.
