
The Apostles Creed

UNIVERSAL SYNOD 2021- 2023: Your responses are requested! What is a Synod? Why should I be involved? Pope Francis has called a Synod on Synodality: Communion, Participation and Mission. This meeting will provide an opportunity for all bishops to discuss various aspects of "synodality" focussing on these three areas. Pope Francis is keen for each one of us to have the opportunity to participate in some way. For details of the process either visit the diocesan website www.dioceseofshrewsbury.org or the Vatican website www.synod.va Bishop Mark has asked each parish to prayerfully listen, reflect and discern on the themes Pope Francis has given us. To help us through the process the Parish Social and Community Group have created a Synod team comprised of Helen Jones (facilitator), Jacinta Adonis, Marie Branch, Sam Furnkranz and Katharine Powell to guide our parish through this process and create opportunities for us to pray, listen and discern. Due to the ongoing pandemic, we will be offering online meetings during January and February 2022, details to come in next week's newsletter. We have until 1st March 2022 to submit our views to the Shrewsbury Synod Office by email or by post.

The second of the five themes are given here (the questions may be found in full on our website). We suggest you reflect on the questions you are most drawn to. Do consider taking part in order to discern and to listen to others in our community as we travel on our journey 'firm in faith, joyful in hope, active in love'.

6. DIALOGUE IN CHURCH AND SOCIETY- Dialogue requires perseverance and patience, but it also enables mutual understanding.

- a. To what extent do diverse people in our community come together for dialogue?
- b. What issues in the Church and society do we need to pay more attention to?
- c. What experiences of dialogue and collaboration do we have with believers of other denominations, other religions and with those who have no religious affiliation?

7. ECUMENISM - The dialogue between Christians of different traditions, united by one baptism, has a special place in the synodal journey.

- a. What relationships does our Church community have with members of other Christian denominations?
- b. What fruits have we drawn from walking together and what are the difficulties?
- c. How can we take the next steps in walking with each other?

8. AUTHORITY AND PARTICIPATION - A synodal church is a participatory and co-responsible Church.

- a. How is authority or governance exercised within our local Church?
- b. How is co-responsibility put into practice?
- c. Have we had fruitful experiences of synodality on a local level?
- d. How can we foster a more synodal approach in participation and leadership?

9. DISCERNING AND DECIDING - In a synodal style we make decisions through discerning the voice of the Holy Spirit in our whole community.

- a. Do our decision-making methods help us to listen to the wider community?
- b. How do we promote participation in decision-making, transparency and accountability locally and within hierarchical structures?
- c. What is the relationship between consultation and decision-making, and how do we put this understanding into practice?

10. FORMING OURSELVES IN SYNODALITY - Synodality entails receptivity to change, formation, and on-going learning. a. How does our church community form people to be more capable of "walking together," accompanying one another,

- participating in mission, and engaging in dialogue?
- b. What support do we need to continue to grow in synodality?
- c. What formation is needed to foster discernment and the exercise of authority in a synodal way?
