Reflection on the Sunday Gospel by Fr Stephen Coonan



The vine is one of the most powerful images in the Bible for God's relationship with his people. Israel is the vine brought out of Egypt and a choice vine planted by God. She is also a vineyard planted and tended by God. Jesus builds on this image by calling himself the 'true' vine and his Father the vinedresser. This image is profound, since the vine and the branches unlike a tree trunk and its limbs are often virtually indistinguishable, and since there is a mutual interchange of life between them.

The vine must be both nurtured and pruned, symbolising the inevitable suffering of the disciples in imitation of Jesus. The vines must bear fruit that will lead the full

discipleship, and unfruitful vines wither and are used only for firewood. This reflects the double image of vine/vineyard in the Old Testament. Despite the tender care the vineyard owner (God) lavished on the vineyard in Isaiah, sadly it yields the wild grapes of bloodshed rather than justice, and outcries rather than righteousness. Jesus abiding presence is not static but must be nurtured and it can wither. Not even John's great vision of the union of God and humanity takes away the mystery of human freedom and the need to grow in responsive love.

Please welcome Fr Phil McGovern to St Winefride's he will celebrating Mass for us from this weekend.


Please do let me know any news you may have, with most of us working from home and not meeting up, any news is lovely to hear. A birthday, anniversary, new member to the family, baby or pet!!




With Mass numbers increasing each week, which is fantastic, it has been decided that the 11.00 am Mass will restart.

In October 2020, I wrote to inform you that Mrs Ormes will be retiring at the end of the current academic year. Following this announcement, the Governing Board started a rigorous selection process for her replacement. However, this was initially delayed due to COVID-19 restrictions. Further to this, the pandemic and resulting country-wide lockdowns have impacted upon the selection processes and this has resulted in unavoidable delays.

The Governing Board have made the decision to appoint Mrs. Davies to the role of Acting Head Teacher and I am delighted to announce that she has accepted this offer and will be starting as our school Head Teacher in September 2021.


