

Reflection on the Sunday Gospel by Fr Stephen Coonan



The Book of Exodus tells us of the ratification of the Covenant on Mount Sinai by a sacrificial ritual in which the people proclaim: "We will observe all the commands the Lord has decreed." God has rescued his people from slavery and the people respond by committing themselves to God's Torah or Law or way of acting as a grateful and liberated people. God's gift comes before God's commandments.

The Letter to the Hebrews presents a Christian interpretation of the ritual for the Jewish Day of Atonement, stressing that Jesus is the mediator of a new covenant. The gospel roots this in the final Passover meal of Jesus with his disciples in which Jesus offers his body and his blood of the covenant which will be poured out for many. Jesus becomes both the one who enacts the new covenant and the one who offers his whole life (body and blood) as a covenant meal. Eating the body and drinking the blood of Christ is a commitment to be nurtured by the kind and quality of life embodied by Jesus of Nazareth. His body is given to us under the symbol of bread and his blood is given to us under the symbol of wine, in order to make us by receiving them one body and one blood with him.

Fr Philip celebrated 26 years ordained as a priest during the week.

One of the city's hidden retail gems, the recently reopened Chester Fairtrade Shop (St John street) offers household items, food, quirky gifts and more. Buying Fairtrade goods is an "easy way for the average person to make a difference".

As volunteer Heather Swainston explained "Fairtrade means that producers, usually farmers or craft producers, are being paid a fair price for their goods. Due to world markets the price of goods fluctuate, a coffee famer will do the same amount of work but the price of coffee will change, affecting his income. Fairtrade marked goods mean that producers will be paid a Fair Trade premium so they can plan for any costs they have. It's trying to challenge the unfairness of the trade system." Globally there are over 1.7 million farmers and workers in 1,822 producer organisations across 72 countries participating in the Fairtrade system.

Over the years Chester has hosted 8 Fair Trade producers. Cheshire West was awarded "Fairtrade status" back in 2011 (due for renewal in 2023) and the steering group have held regular pop up events and activities to raise awareness of the Fairtrade principles. "We have been really lucky." says Heather. "We have met Banana farmers from Panama, Costa Rican coffee farmers. A Cocoa farmer's daughter from Ghana who had never been to school until the age of 14 when her parents joined a co-operative. You can see the difference that Fair Trade made to people's lives. "Goods bearing the the Fairtrade symbol must have adhered to strict rules protecting workers and the environment.

The Shop, inside the Wesley Centre offers a wide range of food items including chocolate, coffee, cereal, rice alongside craft and gift items, including a selection for father's day. The team are hopeful that footfall will increase as the city centre steadily returns to life.

Shop volunteer Jackie Chatterton told me: "I love working at the Fair Trade Shop. I meet so many lovely people that come in and that buy our goods. The ladies that volunteer are just as nice, so do come along if you can!"

Below is an e-mail message I have received from Right to Life UK

My name is Daniel and I work for Right To Life UK. Over the past few months, we have been attempting to expand and further develop relationships with churches across the country as well as develop new ones. In this, we hope to encourage more discussion and active prayer for the pro-life movement, as well as equipping the public with a means to support the cause from their own homes.

We may have already contacted you requesting your help in getting the word out about one of our recent campaigns, such as <u>Equally Human</u>, which aims to protect babies with Down's syndrome, cleft lip, and club foot. You may have also received a request to include the unborn and women facing crisis pregnancies in your church's prayers.

Today we are reaching out again in request of prayers from both yourself and your parishioners. We know that it is advised to not include bidding prayers in the Mass currently, and this has called for many churches to be creative in how they encourage the prayers of the faithful to still be offered in different ways. We know some churches have been including these prayers in their newsletters and also through other methods, such as social media.

We'd love for you to include our intentions however you feel is most appropriate. I have written some suggested prayers that could be used over the coming month.

6th - "This week we marked the International Day of Innocent Children Victims of Aggression. Let us remember especially the most vulnerable of all children, the unborn. We pray that as a society we would take on the duty to protect all children from harm, and ensure that they arrive into a world where they are loved and supported by all. Lord hear us"

13th - "We pray for all unborn children diagnosed with disabilities; we pray for protection for them and their mothers from the pressures of society to have an abortion, and that they would instead experience overwhelming support from all who surround them. Lord hear us".

20th - "As we celebrate Father's Day, we pray for all fathers who are expecting a child. That they would find peace in their changing circumstances, and be a source of love and support for the child's mother as they prepare for their child to enter the world. Lord hear us".

27th - "We pray for our Government, that their willingness and ability to support pregnant women would increase and that they would anchor themselves in the desire to protect all human life. Lord hear us".
