Adoremus - Eucharistic Congress 7-9 September 2018, Liverpool. Our parish has been allocated 6 seats for this unique gathering of laity, clergy and religious coming together and celebrating the life and mission of the Church through the Eucharist. Friday's sessions at Hope University have been designed for Parish Catechists, RE Teachers, chaplains, EMHC and musicians. FAIRTRADE, CAFOD AND SAINSBURYS

From CAFOD: Sainsbury's is the largest retailer of Fairtrade products in the UK. They've decided to abandon Fairtrade certification on some of their ownbrand tea products and pilot their own scheme instead, known as 'Fairly Traded'.

Tea farmers in Africa have publicly opposed the move away from the Fairtrade Mark as it takes away their power to decide where to invest the Fairtrade Premium in their communities. We are concerned that this new 'Fairly Traded' tea, and any products that follow it, could mean an unfair deal for poor farmers.

Day of Action - 28 October

On 28 October, we're asking all Fairtrade supporters to take action. Gather members of your parish or community together and use mug props saying 'Ditching Fairtrade: not my cup of tea' outside your local store. Call the press, chat to customers, hand a letter to the store manager. You could even hold a tea party outside your local Sainsbury's!

Take action and tell Sainsbury's not to ditch Fairtrade with these simple steps:

Step 1: Personalise and print our letter to Sainsbury's (https://cafod.org.uk/Campaign/Fairtrade) and get as many people in your parish to sign it

Step 2: Print our 'Ditching Fairtrade: Not my cup of tea' mug and take a group photo with it outside your local Sainsbury's

Step 3: Hand in the letter to the local store manager. You can go one step further by purchasing a box of 'Fairly Traded' tea and then return it immediately with the letter, explaining why you don't want Sainsbury's ditching Fairtrade.
