Reflection on the Sunday Gospel by Fr Stephen Coonan



Jesus prays that his disciples may experience the unity he shares with his Father. that they may share in his joy, and that they will be consecrated in truth. Jesus also prays for their protection in a hostile world. His own life is a pattern for the lives of those who believe in him. He comes from above, from presence with God, to an alien world that does not accept him and then returns to the Father. The believer in John, is born from above, lives in a hostile and alien world and, as Jesus returns to the Father, the destiny of his followers is to be with him.

The ambiguity of "the world" echoes throughout John's Gospel. The world was made through the Word but did not recognise him. Jesus takes away the sin of the world and God so loved the world that he gave his only Son. He is the living Bread that will be the life of the world. Yet the world often symbolises the power of evil organised against Jesus and his followers. Though other New Testament writings have a more positive attitude to the world, and though the contemporary Church is summoned to be engaged in the world and to discern the manifestations of goodness among non-Christians, in John Jesus and the disciples come to the world to challenge its values.

THE GOOD SHEPHERD WINDOW

Jesus said," I am the good shepherd"

There are twelve windows in our lovely church which have beautiful stained glass. I have spoken previously about the one dedicated to Saint Charles Borremeo of whom many people seem to know little about, but there is another window which seems almost a secret for it cannot be seen from the main body of the church. It is in the corner of the sanctuary where Saint Joseph stands but it is on the wall facing the sacristy. It is an inspiring picture of the good shepherd, Jesus with his shepherd's crook, kneeling helping one of his sheep which seems to be trapped in a bush. Every day, during mass, Jesus is referred to as the "Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world", but he is also the shepherd. As Jesus who is God, shook off his omnipotence and took on the vulnerability of man to save us, so the shepherd, the protector, became the sacrificial lamb to save his flock.

I have seen other pictures of the Good Shepherd where Jesus is shown carrying a sheep on his shoulders or cuddling one in his arms. I love those images for they remind me of photos I have of my sons carrying their children and grandchildren in like manner. They are joyful photographs which bring back memories of times long ago when I too have carried my own children like that. I have always tried to have a special relationship with each member of my family. If I can have so much love for my family, how much greater is the love that Jesus has for us. He has a special relationship with each one of us if we can only recognise it and appreciate it. He is always there for us in happy times or in sad times. When we are in difficulties and can find no way to turn, he is there to show us the way; when we fall, he is there to pick us up; when we feel we cannot carry on, he is there to carry us. We have only to put our trust in him and say to him "help me".

My grandchildren sometimes tease me and ask me who is my favourite. I always answer with a smile for I love them all, I have no favourites. God has no favourites. "Think of the love that God has lavished upon us by letting us be called God's children, for that is what we are". (letter of St. John 3:1) Every one of us is the apple of His eye no matter what colour, race, or creed. Every inhabitant of Earth is a child of God. Rich or poor we need one another. Covid 19 has surely proved that. We cannot beat the virus without the cooperation of countries throughout the world and unless the vaccine is available to all and people are educated and taught how to protect themselves. It is in the interest of rich countries to improve the conditions of those less fortunate. We must strive to bring an end to poverty not only in our own country but in the poor countries around the world. David Attenborough and others have been telling us for some time how our actions are endangering wildlife and fauna and which in turn is endangering the planet. If animals and plants are so important how much more important are people.

> O Jesus, our good shepherd, help us in all our needs. You alone can reconcile men and create a new spirit within them: End the conflicts that divide our world. Lord, stay always with us.



Welcome: Today we hear how Jesus prayed for his disciples - asking God to protect them and to help them to follow his word. Let us think a bit more about this means for us today.

Opening prayer: Loving God, watch over us, keep us from harm and help us to follow your word and go out into the world to share it with others through our actions. Amen.
