From Fr Ravi: Let Peace Flow through us....

Next weekend, Mgr Jack Kennedy has been invited to our parish to lead us in meaningfully celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation and thus prepare ourselves to joyfully sing the Easter Alleluia. The weekend masses will start and conclude at regular times and four priests - Frs Jack, Chris, Denis and myself - will be available after each mass to celebrate the Sacrament individually with you.

This Sacrament is certainly not just about ourselves and our sins! As you know well, we understand sin as 'the deliberate and conscious carrying out of something we know to be wrong,' which can be harmful, as it damages ourselves, our relationship with others in the community, with nature and with the God of love. The Sacrament of Reconciliation, even as it helps us to be aware of our experiences, is primarily about God's love and mercy which is freely and unconditionally given to us. The grace of the Sacrament heals the wounds of both the individual and the community. Peace begins to flow, and it flows through us out into the world helping us experience the joy of relating with the God, who never, ever abandons us, especially when we fail, fumble and falter. There is a rebuilding of relationships, leading us to new hopes, new possibilities, new prayers and new dreams.

I am told there are even 'apps' like *Confession* and *Mea Culpa* that smart phone owners can use! Of course, as many will say, possibly the best 'app' is to sit in silence contemplating the compassionate face of Jesus on the cross...

A LENTEN PASTORAL LETTER "DO NOT BE AFRAID OF CONFESSION"

My dear brothers and sisters,

"I would like to ask you – but don't say it aloud, everyone respond in his or her heart: when was the last time you made your Confession?"

This is the question Pope Francis has recently put to us. The Holy Father continued:

"Everyone think about it ..." Is it "two days, two weeks, two years, twenty years, forty years?... And if much time has passed, do not lose another day. Go, the priest will be good. Jesus is there, and Jesus is more benevolent than priests. Jesus receives you, he receives you with much love. Be courageous and go to Confession!" (General Audience of the Holy Father, 19th February 2014)

This is the call of Pope Francis which I wish to echo at the beginning of Lent in this year which we have dedicated in the Diocese to peace and reconciliation. (Pastoral Letter for Peace Sunday 19th January 2014)

"Do not be afraid of Confession!" Pope Francis says in his simple and direct teaching. "When one is in line for Confession," he reflects, we feel those things which weigh on our hearts; "but when one finishes Confession, one leaves free, grand, beautiful, forgiven, candid, happy. This is the beauty of Confession!"

This is the Sacrament which Christ gives us for our salvation; for the forgiveness of sins after Baptism; and to enable you and me to reach the holiness, the perfection of charity which is the goal of our Christian lives. (Lumen Gentium 40)

So, what is it that holds us back from this Sacrament? I think I know from personal experience what can hold us back. Confession is the moment when I have to put aside all illusions about myself and about the state of my Christian life and be ready to say, "Father, these are my sins." It would be so much easier to say: these are someone else's sins and faults! But, no; this is where I have gone wrong! Confession is a 'reality check' when I recognise how far I still have to go in the Christian life and receive the grace to go forward.

In our Emeritus Pope Benedict's words: "We must accept our frailty but keep on going, not giving up but moving forward and becoming converted ever anew through the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a new start ..." (Pope Benedict XVI 17th February 2007)

This is surely a moment when you and I are "led by the Spirit" (Mt 4:1) to reject the temptations of the Devil, as Our Saviour did in the wilderness. We must never forget the Lord Jesus Himself, God the Son sharing our humanity, was

tempted by the Evil One. We, then, must expect to face the same struggle in our lives. The sincere Confession of our sins is the moment when we put aside the illusions we can all so easily entertain about ourselves.

Before Christmas Pope Francis described how he goes to Confession.

"Priests and bishops too have to go to Confession. We are all sinners" the Holy Father explained, "The Pope is also a sinner. And the Confessor hears what I tell him, he counsels me and forgives me, because we are all in need of this forgiveness."

Pope Francis reminds us that confessing our sins can involve shame. But he calls it a "good shame," for our sins are the one thing of which we should be ashamed! However, it is in the very moment we confess them (in the Holy Father's words) God sends "a brother to bestow his pardon, the certainty of his forgiveness in the name of the Church ..."

Through the ministry of the priest, Pope Francis reflects, God holds us "in a new embrace and regenerates us and allows us to rise again and resume our journey" (General Audience, 20th November 2013)

Today's Gospel ends with these beautiful words: "Then the devil left him, and angels appeared and looked after him" (Mt 4:11)

It is a scene of peace following the struggle in the wilderness. The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation brings us peace: "Go in peace" the priest says to us.

I am sending Pope Francis's words of encouragement to you in a leaflet, together with a simple guide on how to go to Confession. During Lent there will be many opportunities to approach this "great and beautiful Sacrament". I have asked your priests to be especially available on Good Friday, as I will be in the Cathedral. With Pope Francis, I invite you to put this question to yourself: How long is it since I was last at Confession? Please do not lose any time. The Holy Father reminds us:

"It is Jesus Himself who awaits us in this great and beautiful Sacrament: have courage and go to Confession!"

From the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, Department for Christian Responsibility and Citizenship – February 2014

'Assisted dying' is often in the news. There is a Private Member's bill before Parliament to try to legalise it. But just what is 'assisted dying'? What does the law say about it? What do doctors have to say about it? What does the Church say about it and what are the problems with it? What exactly is 'assisted dying'?

'Assisted dying' really means assisting someone to commit suicide. It is the language used by those who want to change the law to legalise assisted suicide. A law permitting 'assisted dying' would licence doctors to supply lethal drugs to terminally ill patients.

Shouldn't everyone have the right to decide when and how they die?

An 'assisted dying' law could easily put vulnerable people at risk. There are real concerns that there is scope for such a law to be abused. For example, some terminally ill people might feel under pressure to end their lives, either from others or from feeling that they should remove a care or financial burden from their families. Others might wish to do so as a result of depression, a common feature of terminal illness. A 'right to die' could become a 'duty to die'.

Why should dying people be forced to stay alive and suffer?

End-of-life care in Britain has advanced hugely since the days when death was commonly associated with pain and suffering. An international survey by *The Economist* in 2010 ranked Britain top among 40 nations, including the United States, for quality of end-of-life care. What is needed is to ensure that everyone has access to the best palliative care available. In contrast, assisted suicide is a counsel of despair.

What's the law on this now?

It's against the law to encourage or assist another person's suicide. This reflects a widely-held view that, while people who attempt suicide should be treated with compassion, helping someone to commit suicide is not something that should be encouraged. Indeed, as a society we go to great lengths to prevent suicides.

What does the Church say about assisting suicide?

In a message addressed to Catholics in Ireland, Scotland, England and Wales, Pope Francis said, "Even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in his own image, destined to live for ever and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect". The Church supports high quality care for the dying and protection for the weak and vulnerable. The Church teaches that life is a gift from God (John 10:10) and that suicide is the ultimate inability to accept the gift of life. Although attempting suicide should be treated with compassion rather than with blame, suicide should never be encouraged or promoted. Moreover the Church teaches that deliberately ending or helping to end someone else's life, even if that person may have requested it, is wrong. Those who take someone else's life take to themselves the power of life and death, which ultimately belongs to God.

What does the medical profession have to say about it?

The BMA and the Royal Colleges of Physicians, General Practitioners and Surgeons are opposed to legalising physician-assisted suicide. And most doctors don't regard it as a proper part of clinical practice - they are all too well aware from experience that dying patients can be vulnerable.

What's wrong with changing the law?

There are powerful practical reasons why the law shouldn't be changed. It's almost impossible to be sure that a request for assisted suicide from someone who is terminally ill reflects a clear and settled wish that has not been influenced by depression or pressure of one sort or another. Changing the law might give a very small number of strong-minded people what they want but it could easily put much larger numbers of vulnerable people at risk of harm.

Wouldn't there be safeguards in any legalised system?

Yes, but what safeguards and how effective would they be? In the tiny number of other countries where assisted suicide has been legalised there is emerging evidence that the safeguards don't work. For instance, some laws seek to restrict access to assisted suicide to terminally ill people who are in full possession of all their faculties and are acting freely. But prognosis of terminal illness is fraught with difficulty: terminally ill people often live for much longer than the predictions they are given when they are diagnosed - occasionally, they even recover. And the evidence from overseas shows that doctors have sometimes failed to spot clinical depression among those who have been supplied with lethal drugs to end their lives

If I can end my life by refusing treatment, why can't I have medical help to end it?

Everyone has the legal right to refuse treatment, but patients who refuse treatment rarely do so in order to end their lives: they do it because they are finding the treatment burdensome and they want to let nature take its course. There's a world of difference, in medical ethics and in law, between accepting that death can't be prevented and seeking assistance to end your own life.

Don't doctors sometimes hasten patients' deaths under the quise of pain relief?

These days pain relief is a sophisticated science. When analgesics are properly prescribed and administered, there is no risk to the patient's life. Research has shown that in Britain illegal action of this kind by doctors is rare or non-existent.

British people are going to Switzerland to get help with suicide. Why should they not be able to get that help here?

Though every 'Swiss suicide' makes the headlines, only around 1 in every 25,000 deaths of Britons in the last 10 years has taken this form. The fact that a very small number of British people choose to seek assisted suicide in another country doesn't mean we should legalise the practice here. We make our own laws, and the legal protection of the weak and vulnerable is a fundamental duty of the state and of society.

OFSTED Inspection

Pupils, staff and Governors at St Winefride's Catholic Primary School, Little Neston are celebrating following their recent Ofsted report where they received 'Good' across the board, with some outstanding features.

The excellent report highly praises the good teaching; all pupils making at least 'good'' progress; a high expectation of behaviour, which is evident throughout the school; good governance and the head teacher's strong resolve to continue the drive for improvement, as well as a clear vision about what needs to be done to build upon the achievements of the school to date.

The inspectors rated the quality of teaching in all classes to be consistently 'at least good' and on occasion, outstanding. They found that children get off to a good start in the Early Years Foundation Stage and make good progress in a well structured environment, leaving St Winefride's, at the end of year 6, with attainment above the National average. children's participation in a version of 'The Young Apprentice.'

This project enabled the children in year 6 to meet a candidate from the television programme and work alongside him to develop 'real-life' skills by setting up their own businesses and raising money. From Fr Ravi... A Home For All!

A PASTORAL LETTER On the Great Challenge for our Generation

My dear brothers and sisters,

I write to you on the Feast of the Apostles Peter and Paul, when we hear in the Gospel the great promise of Our Lord to Simon Peter:

"You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld shall not prevail against it" (Mt 16:18).

The past century has been marked by the emergence of inhuman ideologies and such unprecedented bloodshed and destruction that it often seemed as if "the gates of hell" had prevailed. However, the Successors of St Peter in the Holy See of Rome have stood at the forefront of the defence of human life, the defence of the value of every human person. They have proclaimed the Gospel of Life in the face of what Saint John Paul II described as, "the culture of death". Today, that culture of death is manifested in the hidden destruction of the unborn on an industrial scale, and the threat to the sick and the aged of a killing, which its advocates perversely call "mercy."

Pope Francis continues this unfailing witness in our time, by his words and gestures affirming the eternal value of every human being, especially the weakest and the frailest. In his most recent Exhortation, the Holy Father asks us to be attentive to the new forms of poverty and vulnerability. Pope Francis specifically speaks of those elderly people

"who are increasingly isolated and abandoned" and of the unborn children "the most defenceless and innocent among us" (Evangelii Gaudium n. 210, 213).

I don't need to remind you of the widespread concern about the ill-treatment of the aged and those at the end of life in some of our care homes and hospitals -and this in spite of the many dedicated people working in these fields of care. It seems all the more incomprehensible, then, that we would be considering a change in the law to diminish the protection given to those most vulnerable.

Next month a Bill to legalize "assisted suicide" for those at the end of life will begin its passage through Parliament. This legislation will be presented as a "compassionate" measure, whose sole aim is to relieve the suffering of the

sick and the aged. Yet, it is far from compassionate to remove the legal protections provided for some of the most vulnerable members of society. The proposed change to our laws will license doctors to supply lethal drugs to assist the deaths of those expected to live for six months or less. If Parliament allows exceptions to the laws which protect the very sanctity of human life, it would be impossible to predict where this will end. In 1967, the politicians who legalised the killing of unborn children in limited and exceptional circumstances did not foresee how violating the sanctity of human life would lead to the wanton destruction of millions of lives. It is not surprising that many vulnerable people, including those with disabilities, are today worried by Lord Falconer's "assisted dying" Bill. It might sound reasonable to speak of "choices at the end of life" - as the campaigners for euthanasia do but what choice will be left for many?

The recent commemorations of D-day have reminded us of how an earlier generation was ready to face death in the defence of human life and dignity, in what Britain's war-time Prime Minister, Winston Churchill, described as a battle for the survival of "Christian civilisation" (House of Commons, 18th June 1940). It is the Christian faith which has led us to recognise the sanctity of every human life, the value of every human person. In their quest for the elusive definition of "British values", our political leaders need look no further for the foundations of our society. And whilst we recall the heroism of generations before us, we must not fail to recognise the great challenge for our own generation. We are now being called upon to defend the sanctity of human life amidst the growing threats against it.

Defending the value of the life and dignity of every human person, from their conception until their natural death, represents the great battle of our life-times, a battle we must fight with the weapons of peace. Together with Pope Francis, the Successor of the Apostle Peter, may you and I be able finally to repeat the words of the Apostle Paul:

"I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith ..." (II Tim 4:7).

May it be so, for each one of us.

Ambry at St Winefride's

All of us at some time in our lives have experienced sacramental anointing, whether at baptism, confirmation, or perhaps when we were ill. As the tabernacle houses the Blessed Sacrament, traditionally the ambry is the place where the sacred oils were kept in respect and reverence. In our church the ambry is already beautifully designed in the sanctuary adjacent to the tabernacle and below the Good Shepherd window, possibly to remind us of God's abiding presence and the church's eternal care for each and every one of us.

The Oil of Catechumens (*Oleum Catechumenorum*) is used during baptism (mainly for infants); The Oil of Chrism (*Sacrum Chrisma*) is for baptism, confirmation and ordination (a mixture of oil and balsam); and The Oil of the Sick (*Oleum Infirmorum*) is for anointing those who are ill. Historically olive oil played an integral role in people's lives: it was used in preparation of food, fuel for lamps, welcoming guests, preparing bodies for burial and in the Old Testament it was used for anointing kings and prophets. In the New Testament James writes about the anointing of the sick with oil (James 5:14).

"My head thou dost with oil anoint, and my cup overflows"

In our church the ambry is already beautifully designed in the sanctuary adjacent to the tabernacle and below the Good Shepherd window, possibly to remind us of God's abiding presence and the church's eternal care for each and every one of us.


The Oil of Catechumens (*Oleum Catechumenorum*) is used during baptism (mainly for infants); The Oil of Chrism (*Sacrum Chrisma*) is for baptism, confirmation and ordination (a mixture of oil and balsam); and The Oil of the Sick (*Oleum Infirmorum*) is for anointing those who are ill. Historically olive oil played an integral role in people's lives: it was used in preparation of food, fuel for lamps, welcoming guests, preparing bodies for burial and in the Old Testament it was used for anointing kings and prophets. In the New Testament James writes about the anointing of the sick with oil (James 5:14).

"My head thou dost with oil anoint, and my cup overflows"



From Fr Ravi ... Happy Birthday Everyone!

We can identify many 'founding' moments in the Scriptures to mark the beginnings of the new community of Jesus, the Church – such as when Peter was entrusted with the mission of proclaiming God's reign of love, or at the foot of the cross when unconditional acceptance of the other was experienced and I am sure you can think of other events. Generally, the coming of the Holy Spirit is celebrated as the 'birthday' of the Church; hence, the invitation to pray in a special way for the Church today.

The Pontifical Yearbook, published recently, presents some interesting data: the Catholic presence in the world has risen slightly from 17.3% to 17.5%, as the number of the baptised people around the world rose from 1115 to 1229 million between 2005 and 2012. The 2012 data shows Europe as being home to 23.3% of the world's Catholics (a drop from 25.5% in 2005) while Africa has 16.2%, a significant increase from 13.8% in 2005 – which explains to some extent, the violence against Christians there. There are at present 2,981 dioceses (ecclesiastical districts or similar units).

Ignatius of Laodicea Orthodox Metropolitan, shared the following insight at the 3rd Assembly of the World Council of Churches at Uppasala in 1968, which can inspire us all today: "Without the Holy Spirit, God is distant, Christ is merely an historical figure, the Gospel is a dead letter, the Church is just an organisation, authority is domination, mission is propaganda, liturgy is only nostalgia, and the work of Christians is slave labour. But with the Holy Spirit, Christ is risen and present, the Gospel is a living force, the Church is a communion in the life of the Trinity, authority is a service that sets people free, mission is Pentecost, the liturgy is memory and anticipation, and the labour of Christians is divinised."

Pope Francis' World Communications Day Message

'It's no good trying to communicate the Gospel if we are not open to encounter the lives and the truth of others'.

This is the Pope Francis' first message for World Communications Day and it offers a profoundly personal and Franciscan vision of the way that modern media technology must help us, not just to connect virtually, but to promote a real encounter with people and ideas that are often very different from our own. A culture of encounter demands that we be ready not only to give, but also to receive and the internet, the message says, offers immense possibilities for encouraging encounter and solidarity. Noting the continuing "scandalous gap between the opulence of the wealthy and the utter destitution of the poor", the Pope says media can help create a stronger sense of the unity of the human family.

While acknowledging that the internet can isolate and create barricades between people, Pope Francis says the Church must respond with fresh energy and imagination to the challenges of the ongoing

technological revolution. He uses the parable of the Good Samaritan to explain how we must see ourselves as true neighbours, ready to take responsibility for the needs of others. Returning to one of his favourite themes, the Pope says our streets are teeming with people who are often hurting and looking for a sign of hope and salvation. It's not enough to be passers-by on the streets and digital highways of our world: rather we must keep open the doors of our churches and our digital environments so that people can enter and the Gospel message can reach to the ends of the earth.

World Communications Day Prayer

O God, whose word is truth and in whose light we see light, guide those who tell the story of our times through word and image.

Make them seekers after truth and advocates of human dignity.

Passover Meal - Report from Fr Denis...

Those of us who were lucky enough to be at the Passover meal on Wednesday were delighted with the occasion. The hall was decorated with flowers and candles; as soon as we walked in we knew it was a festive occasion. I have never seen the hall looking so welcoming. David and Teresa were excellent guides; for all of us it was a unique occasion. I would like to offer my thanks and the thanks of all who attended to the team who planned the occasion and cooked the baked potatoes and prepared the salad. The Passover has been around for *thirty-five centuries* which explains why it is complicated and celebrated in different ways in various countries.

The core message is that God saved his people from slavery in Egypt, so it is a service celebrated *at home* with thanksgiving and praise of God. We ate parsley dipped in salt water to remind us of the tears of the Israelites in their slavery – and many other symbols... the offering of a Pascal lamb, which is no longer part of the service, and the unleavened bread may well go back to the time when the Israelites were nomadic shepherd, before the Exodus. The service starts with the mother of the household lighting the candles – as she does every Friday evening. This is soon followed by the youngest child asking four questions: Why is this night different from other nights? - and the father of the household tells the Exodus story – both in words and symbols. There are four toasts; a cup for Elijah is filled and the door opened for him; and we say "next year in Jerusalem!" The service finishes with psalms and songs.

Both David and Teresa were invaluable in explaining the symbols to us. Having a practicing Jew leading us made all the difference. Thanks to both of them it was a night we shall always remember. Virginia Bowes gave us the vote of thanks.

PASTORAL LETTER FROM BISHOP MARK

On the Canonisations of Saint John XXIII & Saint John Paul II

My dear brothers and sisters,

Today in Rome two, great Saints will be recognised by the whole Church. Two saints whose lives belong, not to a distant era, but to our own times: Saint John XXIII who died little more than half a century ago, and Saint John Paul II who died just nine years ago on the eve of this Divine Mercy Sunday. I am aware that much will be said this weekend of the historic events of which they were part. However, I would like us to reflect on how both of these men - from different times and places - responded wholeheartedly to their calling. I want us to glimpse in what their greatness really consisted and how we can hope to imitate the faithfulness of these two new Saints.

I have no doubt history will give to Saint John Paul II the title 'John Paul the Great' in recognition of his part in the momentous events which shaped both the world and the mission of the Church at the end of the last century and the beginning of this Third Christian Millennium. I am sure many miracles will continue to flow from his prayer for us. However, one of his closest collaborators said the greatest miracle of Pope John Paul's life was the way he lived each day: how he worked and used his time, his constant good humour, even during times of stress and suffering (Interview with Dr Joaquin Navarro Valls, 4th April 2014).

"We see the saints praised for their great works," a spiritual writer observed (Dom Eugene Boylan) but the only greatness which mattered to them was to live everyday in union with Christ "by faith, by love, by humility, and by a complete abandonment to His will". It is in such everyday faithfulness that the "miracle" of true holiness is always to be found. The Acts of the Apostles reminds us that it was by such daily faithfulness that the first Christians made so great an impression on a hostile world (Acts 2: 42-47).

After Pope John XXIII's death, his Secretary recorded not a list of public achievements, but rather Pope John's

"radical humility ... superhuman trust sustained by intense prayer ... unquenchable and burning faith and I came to the conclusion" he wrote, "that only with Christians, priests made in this mould could the Second Vatican Council carry out its work, avoid the pitfalls, recognise the voice of the Spirit and light new Pentecostal fires" (Cardinal Loris Capovilla, 'Reflections on the Second Vatican Council'.)

The words of the Apostle Peter could be repeated of both our new Saints: their faith was indeed *"tested and proved like gold – only it is more precious than gold ..."* (1 Peter 1: 7). It was surely in the faithful living of their vocation that we can glimpse their true greatness. Our Lord's words in the Gospel have echoed down the centuries, and been heard anew in many hearts:

"As the Father sent me, so am I sending you" (John 20: 21).

Angelo Roncalli, who was to become Pope John, could never remember a time when he did not want to give his life in the Priesthood. Karol Wotyla, who became Pope John Paul, had other plans; he hoped for marriage, becoming an academic and a teacher. Gradually, however, he recognised amidst the terrors of the Nazi occupation of Poland that God was calling him to the Priesthood. Today we must give thanks that these two men responded wholeheartedly to their vocation.

This Sunday, I ask you to pray for the priests of the future, the priests on whom the future of our Diocese depends. I hope that in our time many young men will - like Saint John and Saint John Paul - be ready to respond wholeheartedly to this wonderful calling. This Easter I have sent prayer cards to all the parishes with some words of Pope Francis and my own prayer for this intention. I announced at the Chrism Mass last week the plan to establish at Shrewsbury Cathedral a 'house for discernment' for men considering a vocation to the priesthood. This house will open its doors in September 2015 creating a community at the heart of our Diocese where the vocation to the Priesthood can be discerned in a year-long programme.

It is, I have been reminded, a brave plan in present conditions. However, it is a venture I entrust to the prayer of Our Lady, Help of Christians and of St John Vianney. Today I also entrust all our hopes for the new evangelisation of our country, for a new generation of priests and for a renewed faithfulness in all our vocations to the prayer of two Popes many of us knew and loved: Saint John XXIII and Saint John Paul II, pray for us! Amen.

Home Mission Sunday - Notes from the Bishops of England and Wales

Today is Home Mission Sunday – the day annually when we are invited to pray for and support the Church's work of Evangelisation in England and Wales.

The theme this year is *Evangelisation 'in the heart of the family'*. We are reminded that the work of evangelisation begins within our own families - in our own homes - and also within the spiritual family of our parish. As we listen to today's Scripture readings during Mass, we reflect very especially on how the Lord might be calling us to reach out to those that we know, in our home and parish family, who are non churchgoing (lapsed) Catholics.

There are four ways of responding to today's Gospel – in our lives, in our families, in our parishes and by reaching out to non churchgoing Catholics. We have to be like the workers in the parable in today's Gospel. We have to allow ourselves to be called by God to whatever acts of witness he wants from us. Pope Francis: evangelisation "is first and foremost the Lord's work, surpassing anything we can see and understand... In every activity of evangelisation, the primacy always belongs to God, who has called us to co-operate with him and who leads us on by the power of his Spirit" (EG 12).

From The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales

Pope Francis has made the fight against Human Trafficking a priority in his papacy. He recently attended a conference in Rome, co-ordinated by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, CBCEW, where he met with victims and described human trafficking as "an open wound on the body of contemporary society, a scourge upon the body of Christ. It is a crime against humanity". Pope Francis has asked that "our strategies and areas of expertise to be accompanied and reinforced by the mercy of the Gospel, by closeness to the men and women who are victims of this crime". The Church places victims at the heart of the efforts to combat human trafficking. For many years women religious have been the pioneers in supporting victims to recover personal and spiritual dignity. Their witness is an inspiration to the rest of the Church to make available its presence and expertise in human and spiritual healing. The Catholic Bishops' Conference has developed a human trafficking project that aims to raise awareness of the scale of human trafficking and develop ways of countering this crime through the use of its global Catholic networks.

Prevention: Awareness-raising about the realities of human trafficking.

Pastoral Care in-country: Pastoral and practical help to victims when they are apprehended by statutory authorities.

Re-integration: Support to help victims resettle into their host country or return to their home state if that is their desire and a secure possibility.

Developing an International Network of Bishops' Conferences and Law Enforcement agencies: Working with policing and prosecuting agencies to raise awareness of this heinous crime and to place victims at the centre of all combating human trafficking work.

From the UK based Religious Leaders on Religious Freedom in Irag:

What we are witnessing in Northern Iraq today is a tragedy of historic proportions in which thousands of innocent people are at immediate risk of death for no other reason than their religious beliefs. Freedom of religion and belief, a right set out in Article 18 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, is being denied in the most gross and systemic way possible through the attempted extermination of religious minorities. There is no religious justification for the violation of this inalienable human right.

Such violations as are currently taking place are crimes against humanity that must be both stopped and punished. The culture of impunity within which these dehumanising atrocities have been committed needs to be challenged most vigorously. Given that Iraq is not a state party to the International Criminal Court, the Government must now work towards a United Nations Security Council Resolution that refers this matter to the International Criminal Court for investigation and where necessary prosecution. The international community must send a clear signal of intent to those who are committing such atrocities that at some point they will be held accountable for their actions.

These violations are, however, sadly part of a wider global pattern of increased societal hostility and government restrictions against freedom of religion or belief. Governments, international institutions and non-governmental organisations need to recognise this wider crisis and commit the necessary time, energy and resources to ensure greater respect for this fundamental freedom in order to attempt to forestall such further tragedies.

RIP: FR DENIS CHARLES MARMION (1930 - 2014)



Please pray for the repose of the soul of Fr Denis Marmion who died peacefully in Arrowe Park Hospital on the evening of Wednesday 13th August 2014.

Father Denis was born on 20th November 1930 in Birkenhead. He was educated at St Gerard's in Bray, Co. Wicklow, and at Ushaw Junior Seminary (1942-49) along with his brothers John and Vincent before he continued his studies for the priesthood at the Venerable English College, Rome (1949-56). He was ordained in the church of the Twelve Apostles (Santi Dodici Apostoli) in Rome on 27th November 1955.

His first appointment was as assistant priest in St Joseph's, Stockport (1956-58), followed by St Mary's, Dukinfield (1958-60), St Alban's, Macclesfield (1960-63), and St Peter's, Hazel Grove (1963-70). In 1970 he was appointed parish priest of Our Lady of the Rosary, Donnington (1970-78) followed by St Mary's, Middlewich (1978-87), Our Lady's, Birkenhead (1987-96), and St Winefride's, Sandbach (1996-2001). He retired in 2001.

Fr Denis was appointed Judge on the Diocesan Tribunal in 1979, a post he continued to actively fulfil right to the end. Fr Denis led a very active retirement being fully involved in parish life and recently wrote a pamphlet on the war poet, Wilfred Owen. As well as planning a parish pilgrimage to Rome next year, he was also starting to write a book on Julian of Norwich. He will be greatly missed.

Bishop Mark Davies' homily at a Requiem Mass for the Fallen of the First world War, Sunday 3rd August 2014

"The names inscribed on the memorials of the Great War should remind people that the cost of conflicts is always measured in human lives".

The Rt Rev. Mark Davies reminded the congregation in Shrewsbury Cathedral that every casualty in war was "always a human person, a brother or sister, of ours".

"Each time we pass through the entrance of the Shrewsbury Cathedral we pass the list of names, the memorial to the men of this parish who perished in the vast conflict which would touch almost every family," Bishop Davies reminded the faithful of how Pope St Pius X strenuously opposed the Great War as "disastrous" at a time when millions across Europe cheered and celebrated when it was declared.

"Pope Pius was asked by the warring parties for his blessing. His response was emphatic: 'I will not bless war, I will bless peace."

The 20th century then became, in the words of St John Paul II, "the century of tears", and one which witnessed "violence and destruction on a scale never seen before".

"It was surely in the minds of those who set up memorials in Shrewsbury and far beyond that a message be left for future generations by the words: 'lest we forget.' It is a message applied to the souls swept up in these conflicts who appeal for our prayer and it carries a moral message for the future.

The listing of names on the memorials of war challenges us still to recognise the person beyond the rank or number. In the Gospel Our Lord never saw anonymous crowds but each and every human soul. He 'took pity on them' St Matthew tells us.

In the tragic drama of the past hundred years it was the eternal value and dignity of every human person which was so often lost sight of. Today as we hear within the 24-hour news cycle of a Syrian refugee, a Palestinian child, a missing Israeli soldier we are invited in faith to recognise not a statistic but always a human person, a brother, a sister of ours."

The Diocese of Shrewsbury is also marking the centenary with a Year of Peace and Reconciliation, recognising anew "how peace begins or is lost within the human heart".

The Year of Peace, the Bishop explained was by the call of Pope Francis to a day of prayer and fasting last September as the world stood on the brink of the escalation of the conflict in Syria into a major regional war.

"Pope Francis invited us to open our hearts to a higher wisdom, a greater mercy and appealed to world leaders and all peoples to look deep into their consciences, and today as we offer this Requiem Mass for all the fallen of the Great War, for those listed on the memorial of our Cathedral and on memorials which stand across the earth we pray that we may not lack the wisdom, the light to recognise what makes for true and lasting peace."



"As the Church in England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales celebrates the 2014 *Day for Life*, the Holy Father expresses his confidence that this annual witness to the sanctity of God's gift of life will inspire the faithful, and young Catholics in particular, to combat the culture of death, not only by working to ensure adequate legal protection for the fundamental human right to life, but also by seeking to bring the merciful love of Christ as a life-giving balm to those troubling "new forms of poverty and vulnerability" (cf. Evangelii Gaudium 210) which are increasingly evident in contemporary society".

"To all involved in the *Day for Life* celebrations, His Holiness imparts his Apostolic Blessing as a pledge of wisdom, joy and peace in the Risen Lord."

Background: Day for Life is celebrated yearly by the Catholic Church in Scotland, England and Wales and Ireland. It's a day dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition.

Protect and Cherish Life: Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales

Pope Francis knows and loves young people. At World Youth Day in Rio last year, to over three million young people, the Pope said, "young hearts want to build a better world." He invited them to be "protagonists of transformation" and urged them not to be mere "observers of life, but to get involved. Jesus did not remain an observer, but he immersed himself. Don't be observers, but immerse yourself in the reality of life, as Jesus did."

We all know heroic young people who are getting involved in the messiness of life – helping the young; the weak, the elderly, the vulnerable - and putting the needs of others above their own. In this year's Message for Day for Life the Bishops of Ireland, Scotland, England & Wales would like to follow in the footsteps of Pope Francis and invite everyone to get involved in caring for, nurturing and protecting life at every stage and in every condition. To young people especially we want to say "#Livelife!" from its beginning to its natural end.

In a 'throwaway' culture, it is easy for life to be undervalued. Last year, Donal Walsh, an extraordinary 16-year-old from Kerry in Ireland, suffering from terminal cancer, taught us how to value every second of life and to show gratitude for all that we can so easily take for granted. Donal had "wanted to live, to play for Munster, to travel the whole world to raise children and die when I'm 100" and instead of reacting with anger and despair at the news of his cancer, he embraced life to promote his anti-suicide #Livelife message. He wrote and spoke widely in the media about young people and suicide – urging teenagers to "appreciate what you have, know that there are always other options and help is always there". His #Livelife message has touched many hearts and changed lives.

Every one of us, young and old alike can play our part in the promotion of life. Our every thought, word or action can promote or extinguish life – we all have a valuable contribution to make.

Pope Francis tells us that being a protector of life is about, "protecting all creation, the beauty of the created world... It means respecting each of God's creatures and respecting the environment in which we live." The pope speaks of "protecting people, showing loving concern for each and every person, especially children, the elderly, those in need, who are often the last we think about." He emphasises the importance of the family, "husbands and wives first protect one another, and then, as parents, they care for their children, and children themselves, in time, protect their parents." And of caring for society by "building sincere friendships in which we protect one another in trust, respect, and goodness. In the end, everything has been entrusted to our protection, and all of us are responsible for it."

Let's all be builders of a better world and protect life.

Holy Mary, Mother of Love, holding in your arms, the fruit of your womb, graciously look upon our earth and remove from it all that hardens our hearts and dims our eyes to the preciousness of human life, from the moment of conception to natural death. Through the example of your tenderness teach us the ways of compassion and love that we may build up the civilisation of love among us and a society that is truly worthy of the human person. Help us to reject all that contributes to a culture of death, and to work with others of goodwill in promoting the culture of life. Bring us ever closer to your Son, so that we may know the fullness of life that he offers us and come to know that life more perfectly, with you, and all the angels and saints, in the eternal life of Heaven. Amen

The Scaffold speech of St John Plessington 19th July 1679

Dear Countrymen.

I am here to be executed, neither for Theft, Murder, nor anything against the Law of God, nor any fact or Doctrine inconsistent with Monarchy or Civil Government. I suppose several now present heard my trial the last Assizes, and can testify that nothing was laid to my charge but Priesthood, and I am sure that you will find that Priesthood is neither against the Law of God nor Monarchy, or Civil Government. If you will consider either the Old or New Testament (for it is the Basis of Religion). St Paul tells us in Hebrews 7:12 that the Priesthood being changed, there is made of necessity a change of the Law, and consequently the Priesthood being abolished, the Law and Religion is quite gone. But I know it will be said that a Priest ordained by authority derived from the See of Rome is by the Law of Nation to die as a Traitor, but if that be so what must become of all the Clergymen or England, for the first Protestant Bishops had their Ordination from those of the Church of Rome, or none at all, as appears by their own writers, so that Ordination comes derivatively to those now living.

As in the Primitive times, Christians were esteemed Traitors, and suffered as such by National Law, so are the Priests of the Roman Church here esteemed, and suffer suc. But as Christianity then was not against the law of God, Monarchy or Civil Policy, so now there is not any one Point of the Roman Catholic Faith (of which Faith I am) that is inconsistent therewith, as is evident by induction in each several point.

That the Pope hath power to depose or give licence to Murder Princes is no point of our Belief. And I protest in the sight of God and the Court of Heaven that I am absolutely innocent of the Plot so much discoursed of, and abhor such bloody and damnable designs. And although it be Nine Weeks since I was sentenced to die, there is not anything of that laid to my charge, so that I may take comfort in St. Peter's words,

I have deserved a worse death, for though I have been a faithful and true Subject to my King, I have been a grievous sinner against God; [others would have lived] in a greater perfection [than] I have done had they received so many favours and graces from him as I have.


But as there was never sinner who truly repented and heartily called to Jesus for mercy, to whom he did not show mercy, so I hope by the merits of His Passion, He will have mercy on me, who am heartily sorry that ever I offended him. Bear witness, good hearers, that I profess that I undoubtedly and firmly believe all the Articles of the Roman Catholic Faith, and for the truth of any of them (by the assistance of God) I am willing to die, and I had rather die than doubt of any Point of Faith, taught by our Holy Mother the Roman Catholic Church.

In what condition Margaret Plat one of the chiefest witnesses against me was before, and after she was with me, let her nearest relations declare. George Massey, another witness, swore falsely when he swore I gave him the Sacrament, and said Mass at the time and place he mentioned, and [I] verily think that he never spoke to me, or I to him, or saw each other but at the Assizes week. The third witness, Robert Wood, was suddenly killed, but of the Dead why should I speak? These were all the witnesses against me, unless those that only declared what they heard from others. I heartily and freely forgive all that have been or are any way instrumental to my Death, and heartily desire that those that are living may heartily repent. God bless the King and the Royal Family and grant his Majesty a prosperous Reign here and a crown of glory hereafter, God grant peace to the Subjects, and that they live and die in true Faith, Hope, and Charity. That which remains is that I recommend myself to the mercy of Jesus, by whose merits I hope for mercy. O Jesus, be to me a Jesus.

From Fr Ravi: British Women show the way...

Recently Pope Francis has formally declared that Mother Mary Veronica of the Passion, a Carmelite nun, had lived a life of "heroic virtue". Born Sophie Leeves, Mother Mary Veronica founded the Sisters of the Apostolic Carmel, a religious congregation of Carmelite nuns based in India. She was born in 1823 in Constantinople to the Rev. Leeves, an Anglican chaplain to the British Embassy, and Marina Haultain, the daughter of a Colonel in British Army. When she was a teenager she felt drawn to the Catholic Church and converted at the age of 27 during a visit to Malta in 1850. She became a nun the following year and in 1863 accepted a teaching post in Kozhikode in India and she went on to found her own teaching order five years later and today it has branches in India. Sri Lanka. Kuwait, Pakistan, Kenya, Rome and Bahrain,

Frances Taylor was a nurse who tended dying soldiers alongside Florence Nightingale in the Crimean War. Frances, the youngest of 10 children of an Anglican vicar from Lincolnshire, was 22 when she volunteered to join Florence in Scutari, Turkey, in 1854. She was deeply impressed by the faith of the dying Irish soldiers she was caring for and she became a Catholic while serving in the field. She established a religious order – the Poor Servants of the Mother of God – which under her direction opened refuges for sex workers and homeless women and children in London before spreading throughout Europe. As Mother Magdalen Taylor, Frances also founded the Providence Free Hospital in St Helens, Lancashire, and she took over the running of St Joseph's Asylum in Dublin. She died in her convent in Soho Square in 1900 after falling ill en route to Rome and she is buried at Roehampton, south west London, after establishing 20 institutions in her own lifetime. Today her order continues to work particularly with the poor, the elderly and the disabled.

Other British women who are being considered for sainthood include Elizabeth Prout, a 19th century Passionist nun who worked in the slums of Manchester; Mary Potter, a Londoner who founded an order of nursing nuns in Nottingham in the same period, and Margaret Sinclair, a 20th century Scottish nun who died of tuberculosis after tending to the poor of Edinburgh. The Vatican is also studying the sainthood causes of London-born Mother Riccarda Beauchamp Hambrough, a Bridgettine nun who helped to hide about 60 Jews from the Nazis in her Rome convent during the Second World War, and Mother Katherine Flanagan, also a London-born Bridgettine.

May these women along with other well known British women saints - Anne Line, Margaret Ward and Margaret Clitherow continue to inspire all of us!



A PASTORAL LETTER ON THE VOCATION AND MISSION OF THE FAMILY

My dear brothers and sisters,

I write to you today in the light of the Child born for us, the Saviour who was given to us within the love and unity of a human family. On this Feast of the Holy Family, as we celebrate the holiness of family life and begin a 'Year for Vocations' in the Diocese, I want to reflect on the 'Vocation and Mission of the Family'. This is the title Pope Francis has given to the Synod of Bishops to take place in October next year. It will be a year for Catholics across the world to reaffirm our faith in God's plan for the family, and to do so amidst the many challenges confronting the holiness of marriage and the life of the family today. In a few, simple words I want to affirm what the Church has always believed about marriage and the family. We believe marriage is no human invention but that "God himself is the author of marriage". The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains: "the vocation to marriage is written into the very nature of man and woman as they came from the hand of the Creator" (CCC 1603).

After the Fall of Humanity, marriage would bear the marks of sin, but Christ Himself restored this Divine calling, raising it to the dignity of a Sacrament. To the astonishment of a people who practised divorce, Jesus reaffirmed that the union of marriage is indissoluble. "What God has united," Our Lord tells us in the Gospel, "man must not divide" (Mt 19:6). We believe that this unbreakable union of man and woman provides both the foundation of the family and becomes for all, the image of the unfailing love of God. This is no small claim to make! St Paul declares this to be "a great mystery ... in reference to Christ and the Church" (Eph 5:32).

We believe that the union of husband and wife, expressed in the union of one flesh, must always be open to new life, to the children God may entrust to the couple. We believe sexual relations belong within marriage alone. And we believe we are all called to chastity according to our state in life.

Indeed, it is by living the beautiful virtue of chastity that we ensure we use this gift of sexuality in accord with God's purpose. We believe that, as is true of the Sacrament of Matrimony, both

virginity for the sake of the Kingdom of God and apostolic celibacy are also God's gifts. We believe that these callings to marriage, to consecrated virginity and to apostolic celibacy - inseparably support each other. Let us be filled with wonder and gratitude for God's plan and purpose in marriage and family life; in the beauty of chastity; in the joy of consecrated virginity and apostolic celibacy. It is God's grace that makes it possible for us to live these vocations faithfully; and if we fall short, that same God-given grace heals us, making it possible to set out once again on the path of conversion.

In the year ahead, Pope Francis invites us all to make a "true, spiritual discernment" in the light of our Catholic faith. To "discern" means to make a right judgment. Pope Francis has made it clear, contrary to many stories circulating in the media, that the Church does not function like a parliament, nor can truth be determined by opinion polls. The Church seeks to live subject to God's Word, certain that the light and beauty of truth - despite our fallen nature - can be recognised by the conscience of every man and woman. In order to assist this spiritual discernment, the Bishops of England and Wales have produced a leaflet, entitled 'The Call, the Journey and the Mission'. In considering the questions contained in this leaflet, you may wish to write in and share the fruits of your own reflection on how we give witness to the Gospel of the Family. This will contribute to the wider discernment within the Church in the year ahead. And so, today, let us pray in the words of Pope Francis: "Jesus, Mary and Joseph, in you we contemplate the splendour of true love, to you we turn in trust ... Holy Family of Nazareth make us once more mindful of the sacredness and inviolability of the family, and its beauty in God's plan."

May the New Year, 2015, lead us to give renewed witness to the Gospel of the Family. I send this message with my blessing for you and for your family.

From Fr Ravi.... Rejoice Sunday!

The 3rd Sunday of Advent is called Rejoice (Gaudete) Sunday and symbolically we light the pink candle today, to remind ourselves that we rejoice because the Lord is very near. The theme 'rejoice' appears in today's entrance antiphon, is at the heart of the First Reading from Prophet Isaiah and St Paul in his letter calls us to 'rejoice in the Lord always'.

Paul, writing the letter to the Philippians from his prison cell mentions 'rejoice' about 17 times - he was no naive optimist. Henry Nouwen, whose writings we are familiar with in our parish, makes a distinction between happiness, which is dependent on external conditions, and joy which is something deeper. It is "the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved and that nothing - sickness, failure, emotional distress, oppression, war, or even death - can take that love away."

A beautiful way to open ourselves to this grace of being joyful is to approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We are delighted to welcome Bishop Brian back to our Parish this weekend to guide us through our 'Reconciliation Sunday'. Mgr Chris Lightbound and I will be available after each mass for confessions and we are grateful to Canon John Marmion (Sat 6.30pm) and Fr Terry Boylan (Sun 8.45am) for helping us this weekend.

We also remember our beloved Pope Francis in our prayers on 17th December, his birthday.

A PASTORAL LETTER ON OVERCOMING THE CRISIS OF MARRIAGE AND THE FAMILY

My dear brothers and sisters,

On this Remembrance Sunday we recall the great crises faced by generations before us in the conflicts of the past century. Last month, Pope Francis invited bishops from around the world to meet with him in Rome to address what we might call a crisis of our time: the crisis of the family. This is experienced in some parts of the world in poverty, war or persecution; but in western countries like our own, it is a crisis most often caused by ideologies opposed to the sanctity of human life and the institution of marriage and the family.

The Catholic Church has long opposed these mentalities and the devastation they have wrought on individuals, societies and especially among the young and most vulnerable. Pope Francis recently declared that the "Christian family and marriage are under great attack," due, he said, to the growing relativism regarding the very concept of marriage (Address to the Schoenstatt Movement, 27th October 2014). God's plan of marriage, which is written into human nature and raised by Christ to be a Sacrament, is being replaced by the idea that we can each make our own truth according to our own ideas and desires (cf. Gaudium et Spes 47).

The first Christians required great courage to overcome and transform a vast, pagan world whose ideas about marriage and sexual morality were not unlike those which prevail in our own culture. Today we need this same, supernatural, courage to give witness to all the Church believes and teaches about marriage, the family and human sexuality. The Synod of Bishops, gathered around Pope Francis, met precisely to consider how "the Church and society can renew their commitment to the family" (Final Synod Report,October 2014).

Yet, I am conscious that there have been many reports since the Synod suggesting the Church is about to change her constant teaching. Cardinal Nichols, who attended the Synod, wrote on his return that it is simply not true that this meeting was ever about changing the teaching of the Church on marriage, family life or sexual morality (Pastoral Letter of the Archbishop of Westminster, October 2014). The bishops considered the challenges being faced by families across the world. They sought a "pastoral response" which offers, in Pope Francis' words, answers "to the many discouragements that surround and suffocate families."

The Church, he added, always seeks "to receive the needy, the penitent and not only the just or those who believe they are perfect!" Pope Francis insisted that we must not only welcome those who are lost amid this crisis, we must be ready to go out and find them!

The Church offers the truth she has received from Christ her Lord, not with hostility towards those who have taken a wrong path, but with the greatest love and concern for every person. The Church on earth is made up of sinners called to become saints; our practice of frequent Confession is, indeed, a constant reminder that every one of us is called along this path! It would be the ultimate failure in pastoral care or charity, to mislead people by encouraging them to remain in sin, or fail to call them to repentance and renewal (cf Lumen Gentium 8). Pope Francis describes such an approach as "deceptive mercy," a false mercy which bandages wounds but fails to heal them.

Today I want to dispel any misleading impression that the Church will abandon her witness to the truth and change her teaching in the face of hostile trends in public opinion or the destructive ideologies of our time. Pope Francis spoke of this as: "the temptation to come down off the Cross, to please the people, and not stay there, in order to fulfil the will of the Father; to bow down to a worldly spirit instead of purifying it and bending it to the Spirit of God."

Pope Francis has set before us the example of Saint John Paul II whom he named "the Pope of the family"; and of Pope Paul VI whom, at the end of the Synod, he declared among the Blessed, not least for his sometimes lonely witness to the truth. In the crisis we face today, let us look to the great inheritance of their teaching. May their courage and prayer inspire us to seek a greater faithfulness and a deeper understanding of what Christ and His Church truly teach about marriage, the family and human sexuality. At the end of the Synod, Pope Francis asked: "please do not forget to pray for me!"

On this Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, which celebrates our unity in faith and love with the Holy See of Rome, may we never fail to pray for our Holy Father as he confirms us in faith amid all the passing crises of time (Luke 22:32).
