Happy Mother's Day Weekend. Just think, as our clocks change to summer time, we have been given an extra hour to celebrate our Mothers. Now, if you have forgotten your mum this extra hour will allow the pain to continue for an extra 60mins!

Today we ask for the prayerful support of the **Mother of the Lord Jesus**. Over the next few weeks we will find her just standing by her Son. She does not use any words but inspires us through her actions. She is united with her Son and accepts that no matter what is to come, the faithfulness of God's promise will be fulfilled.

Last Wednesday evening we had a very fruitful meeting with all groups helping to put together the nuts and bolts in preparation for our Holy Week Liturgies. Over the next two weeks if you are approached by a fellow parishioner and invited to take a part in these liturgies please accept the offer. Also, if you would like to put yourself forward perhaps to be a Reader, a Eucharist Minister, a church cleaner, a collector, a welcomer or a member of the choir the door is always open to new faces. Have a word with myself or Deacon Michael - you can even make contact via the internet.

I'm intending to introduce Holy Communion in the elements of bread and wine over our weekend Masses. This trial will start next Sunday at our 8.45am Mass. To help make this easier, we will be moving a few of the benches and chairs from the church to make more space for movement.

The method that will be used is very simple and I'm sure we will be able to do this successfully. I would be grateful if you could give me a little latitude in this matter - positive suggestions and are always welcome.

The practicalities are as follows:

All who wish to come for Holy Communion or a blessing come up the main aisle in twos. After receiving the Host or a blessing, move to the left to receive the chalice then return to your seat via the left-hand side aisle.

For those who are unable to come up for Communion the priest will come to you with our Deacon or Minister of the Eucharist with the chalice. I really hope this does not cause too much fuss. So, let's give it a qo.

Soup and Sandwiches on Tuesdays from 12.00 to 1.30pm is going down a treat. This is an opportunity for our senior parishioners to come together for to have a bowl of homemade soup and a chance to have a natter. ALL ARE WELCOME, especially the MEN. There is no cost for the meal but there is a donations box if you would like to put something in.

We journey into this third week of Lent. Our reading begins to focus on the coming of Jesus' Passion. Here we have an opportunity to reflect on the mystery of the Father's love for us. As we read or see the news on TV, our world does not seem a happy place. There are wars, famine and social unrest. Yet it is here that we will find the Christ at work. This weekend we have been asked by **CAFOD** to give money to help with their out-reach workers in the field in such places as across South Sudan, Somalia, northern Kenya and Ethiopia. Severe drought, and several compounding problems - lack of food and civil war - means that now over 16 million people are facing starvation. The United Nations warns that the world faces the largest humanitarian crisis in more than 70 years. Please be as generous as you can!

Sr Laurice is not able to be with us this weekend as a member of her family is not well, please do keep her in your prayers.

On Wednesday evening, I attended my first Governors' meeting in our primary school. We are very fortunate to have a wonderful headteacher supported by a strong staff and a talented board of Governors. I brought them some cake as I could not do better than celebrate my birthday with a two-hour meeting - what a lucky man am I!

Please keep in your prayers **John Albert Robinson** and **William James McVicker** who have died. Remember too the Joseph family whose mother has died very suddenly. Please also pray for them because their application for Asylum will be reviewed over the next few weeks.

A date you may like to put in your diary: On **Wednesday 12 April at 7.30pm** there is a meeting in our parish hall, to look at the Holy Days of the Triduum. Here, we will have the opportunity to explore how these 3 days are essentially one sacred event. As we approach these day of liberation be assured of my prayers.

WOMEN'S WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

The Women's World Day of Prayer started in the USA in 1887, as Mary Ellen Fairchild James, wife of Darwin Rush James from Brooklyn, New York, called for a day of prayer for home missions, and Methodist women called for a week of prayer and self-denial for foreign missions. Two years later, two Baptists called for a Day of Prayer for the World Mission. The Day of Prayer initiated by these two women expanded to Canada, then to the British Isles in the 1930s. The movements focus on ecumenism and reconciliation led to growth after World War II. Since 1927 the March day is known as *Women's World Day of Prayer*. Catholic women were allowed to join the movement after the Second Vatican Council, beginning in 1967, and united what had been their May Day of prayer with the March Women's World Day of Prayer in 1969.

Through the World Day of Prayer, women are encouraged to become aware of the other countries and cultures and no longer live in isolation. They are also encouraged take up the burdens of other people, to sympathize with the problems of other countries and cultures and pray with and for them. They are further encouraged to become aware of their talents and use them in the service of society. The World Day of Prayer aims to demonstrate that prayer and action are inseparable and that both have immeasurable influence in the world.

Every year, worship service focuses on a different country and a specific theme. World Day of Prayer National/Regional Committees of that country prepare the order of worship on these themes to be used on the next World Day of Prayer.

On the first Friday of March, in services all over the world that country becomes the focus of prayer and understanding. Through preparation and participation in the worship service, women worldwide learn how their sisters of other countries, languages and cultures understand the biblical passages in their context. They learn of the concerns and needs of those women and to empathize and feel in solidarity with them.

Women's World Day of Prayer locally: Friday 3 March, 2pm at Ss Mary & Helen, High Street, Neston; 7.30pm at St George's United Reformed Church, St George's Way, Thornton Hough. Do join us in the largest act of worship on the planet. In over 170 countries, involving an estimated 3 million people we will be praying right round the world for the whole 24 hours on that day.

The service for 2017 has been devised by the Christian women of the Republic of the Philippines; a sovereign country made up of over 7,000 islands. All round the world each country will be using the same words and music – the service has been translated into 1,000 different languages and dialects. We are all looking forward to sharing the service and the insights of the Christians living in this country. We hope to learn more of their concerns so we can pray in an informed way with and for them. The Day of Prayer is not just for women, all are most welcome, men, children, families. CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING ON REFUGEES – WHAT ARE THE BASIC TEACHINGS?

Catholic Social Teaching approaches questions of human mobility from the point of view of human dignity rather than legal status or national interest. Its key questions are not about legal obligations or defending sovereign territory, but rather how right relationships with self, God, others and creation, would call us — as individuals, communities, nations and international bodies — to respond to people on the move.

Catholic Social Teaching holds that anyone who is forced to move to preserve their lives or human dignity has a moral claim on the hospitality of others. The more vulnerable and needy the person, the greater their moral claim. Beyond responding to immediate needs it also requires the protection of rights and the transformation of the causes of displacement. Because every human person, regardless of one's legal status or geographic location, has a transcendent dignity that must always be respected, people on the move should enjoy the full range of human rights, and others have a duty to see that they are respected, protected and fulfilled.

According to Catholic Social Teaching, nation states exist to serve the human person by fostering, organising and promoting the common good. The dignity of persons comes before the interests of nation states and people must never be treated as means. Addressing the global phenomenon of migration requires all nations and international organisations to work together to ensure that all people and groups are able to meet their needs

and achieve their potential, that is, to share in the common good. Effective expressions of solidarity are needed.

National sovereignty should be respected and supported as long as sovereign states are willing and able to fulfil their responsibilities to respect and protect the dignity and rights of people within their jurisdiction and to promote the common good. The international community has a responsibility to support and assist where this condition is not met. This is how the principle of subsidiarity works. National sovereignty cannot legitimately be used as an excuse to neglect or abuse the human rights of people, no matter what their legal status, or to stand by while this happens. In practice however states do manipulate these concepts to justify their actions, sometimes with deadly results.

SPUC White Flower Appeal: The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children will be holding its annual appeal this weekend. In 2017 SPUC is commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the passing of the 1967 Abortion Act. Over 8.7 million unborn children have lost their lives due to abortion in the last 50 years. "May we find new incentive to work for the growth of a culture of respect for life, health and the environment," he said, and may the day "also inspire renewed efforts to defend the integrity and dignity of persons, not least through a correct approach to bioethical issues, the protection of the vulnerable and the protection of the environment."

The World Day of the Sick is celebrated annually on February 11, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Thanking those who care for the sick, the elderly and those who suffer or are in need, the pope underlined the importance of treating everyone with respect and care because "every person is, and always remains, a human being."

Even those who have serious disabilities or are debilitated "have their own inalienable dignity and mission in life. They never become simply objects. If at times they appear merely passive, in reality that is never the case," he said.

Inspired by the selfless love and obedience of Mary and Jesus, the church continues to serve those who suffer or are in need, the pope said.

"The solidarity shown by Christ," with his birth and then death on the cross for the redemption of humanity, "is the expression of God's merciful omnipotence, which is made manifest in our life — above all when that life is frail, pain-filled, humbled, marginalised and suffering – and fills it with the power of hope that can sustain us and enable us to get up again."

The pope asked that "this great wealth of humanity and faith" not be lost or forgotten.

"It should inspire us to speak openly of our human weaknesses and to address the challenges of present-day health care and technology," he said, leading to greater efforts to build a culture of respect for life, health and the environment.





Fr Paul writes:

This weekend we are **celebrating the feast of the Ascension of the Lord**. It is here that the Lord gives his final command to his disciples **'to go out to the whole world, baptise and proclaim the Good News.'** When the Lord vanishes from the disciples' eyes, an angel is heard saying to the disciples to stop looking up into the sky, but to look out to a world which is thirsting to hear the good news of the Gospel.

The events that have taken place this week in Manchester have rocked the people of Manchester and further afield. Her Majesty the Queen, while visiting the Manchester Children's Hospital, speaks of the event as 'evil'. I believe her to be right. Yet, when we have listened to the news, we are told of how our professional organisations, our 999 services have worked so well. We have also been told of the generosity of the ordinary people on that night. Some people opening their doors and inviting strangers in. Taxi and private cars offering lifts to take people home. One driver took a family home to Birmingham. Hotels opened their doors to provide food and drinks of water. One homeless man is seen holding a young child in his arms. People of faith - or no faith - are moved to have compassion for the stranger who needs reassurance, warmth, shelter and love.

These sad events of life's journey can make us question as to **where God is**. Yet it is in the practical testimony of the Manchester people, we see the concrete action of today's feast. For the faith that we have inherited as gift, has been enacted by the words of the Lord in another text, for the Lord says, "if you are disciples of mine you are to 'look after the stranger, feed the hungry, give shelter to the homeless, look after the sick and come and give solace to the dying and comfort the bereaved".

Yes, the good news of the Word has been played out in so many different and diverse groups of people. I believe that what this 'evil act' has tried to do has failed. But we must continue on our pilgrimage of life and strive to be 'a living Gospel' to all who share with us on the same road.

I've asked a few parishioners in what practical way we could offer support to the families who have lost their children or parents along with the injured. Firstly, we need to have a time for prayer. Next Sunday between 2.00pm and 3.00pm we will have a holy hour in silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. You do not have to commit yourself to the whole hour, 5 mins will do. There will be a book of condolence available from this weekend in the Lady Chapel for you to sign. We will also have a voluntary collection at the end of Mass. I will send both the book and the collected money to the Mayor of Manchester who has opened up a fund to help towards some of the funeral expenses and to aid the survivors in the weeks, months and years ahead.



St Milburga, Abbess of Wenlock, was the daughter of King Merewald of Magonset and his wife, St Ermenburga. Milburga. She became a nun at the monastery of Wenlock (Shropshire), founded by her father and Archbishop Theodore of Canterbury, on the borders of Wales, under a French Abbess, Liobinde of Chelles. Milburga eventually succeeded her in this office. Shortly afterward, a neighbouring prince attempted to compel her to become his wife and, with that a few minutes, the child had recovered. intent, pursued her with an armed force. She fled Milburga's monastery was destroyed by the Danes; across a river, which at once rose into an impassable flood and discouraged her pursuers.

A poor widow came to her in her oratory, bringing the body of her little dead son.

Throwing herself at the feet of the abbess, she besought her to raise the child to life. "You must be mad!" exclaimed Milburga, "How can I raise your child? Go and bury him and submit to the bereavement sent to you by God!". "No," said the sorrowing mother, "I will not leave you till you give me back my son!" The abbess prayed over the little corpse and, while doing so, she suddenly appeared to the poor supplicant to be raised from the earth and surrounded by lovely flames - the living emblem of the fervour of her prayer. Out of the rising white dust, feet tread a shape, and, out of step, another flat sound, stamped between voice and ears, dancing in the gaps, and dodging where words and feet do not fall. When our eyes meet, I see bewilderment (like mine); we cannot learn

this rhythm we are asked to walk,

and what we hear is not each other.

First the sun, then the shadow,

so that I screw my eyes to see

my friend's face, and its lines seem

different, and the voice shakes in the hot air.

Between us is filled up, the silence is filled up, lines of our hands and faces pushed into shape by the solid stranger, and the static breaks up our waves like dropped stones.

So it is necessary to carry him with us, cupped between hands and profiles, so that the table is filled up, and as the food is set and the first wine splashes, a solid thumb and finger tear the thunderous grey bread. Now it is cold, even indoors; and the light falls sharply on our bones; the rain breathes out hard, dust blackens, and our released voices shine with water.



Fr Paul writes...

I have had three wonderful days in Padua - following the spiritual life of its great St Anthony. Along with me were 16 priests of our diocese, plus one deacon. 

Some Interesting Facts

- Saint George stands out among other saints and legends because he is known and revered by both Muslims and Christians.
- It is said Saint George killed the dragon near the sea in Beirut, thus Saint George's Bay was named in his honour.
- Saint George's feast day is celebrated on April 23, but if it falls over Easter, it is celebrated Easter Monday.
- The Russian Orthodox Church celebrates three Saint George feast days each year - April 23 as is expected, November 3, to commemorate the consecration of a cathedral dedicated to him in Lydda, and on November 26 for when a church in Kiev was dedicated to him.
- In Bulgaria, his feast day is celebrated May 6 with the slaughter and roasting of a lamb.
- In Egypt, the Coptic Orthodox Church of Alexandria calls St. George the "Prince of Martyrs" and celebrates on May 1. There is a second celebration November 17, in honour of the first church dedicated to him.
- Saint George is the patron saint of England and Catalonia and his cross can be found throughout England.
- In older works, Saint George is depicted wearing armour and holding a lance or fighting a dragon, which represents Christ's enemies.

Fr Paul writes...

The days seem to go faster and faster and now it is Holy Week. If I was given a £1 for everyone who says that "Christmas is your busiest time of the year" I can assure you that I would be living on Christmas Island soaking up the sun. Yet when I tell them that Easter is the busiest, some of them are quite shocked. Some ask "Why is it?" I simply say that if there were no Easter there would be no Christmas either. On Wednesday evening at 7pm in our Hall I will be giving a short introduction to the Triduum. So, if you can come along, bring also a friend. I promise I will have a little treat for you all.

Over these three days of celebration I ask you all to keep as quiet as you can as you enter and leave the church. This will help us all as we sustain each other in our prayerfulness.

Many thanks for your patience as we try to introduce the reception of Holy Communion with the Host and Chalice at our 8.45am Mass. I have had a couple of people come up with some suggestions. We will carry on with the 8.45am Mass and then slowly introduce this into our other weekend Masses.

Holy Communion practicalities for our 8.45am Mass are as follows: All who wish to come for Holy Communion or a blessing are to come up the aisle, starting from the front in twos. After receiving the Host or a blessing please move to the left where you can and if you wish, receive the chalice. Then return to your seat via the left-hand side isle. For those who are unable to come up for Communion the priest will come to you along with our Deacon or Minister of the Eucharist with the chalice.

Soup and Sandwiches on Tuesdays from 12:00 to 1:30pm. I have asked whether the group would like to carry this on. The feeling of the group is to stop during the summer months and start once more in late October/November. I would like to thank all who made it so successful - from the soup makers to the providers of the lovely fresh daffodils on the tables. Once again be assured of my prayers for you, your family and friends.

Next weekend the collection goes to help offset parish funds for my salary etc.

I would like to thank Dawn Ormes, her staff and the Governors of our Primary school for all the hard work they have put in over the last term. I hope they will have a good rest and be ready to offer their service to the development of our children. It is interesting to note that the vocation that the Lord Jesus took was that of Teacher...

My prayers are very much for you and your family and friends along with the members of our parish community who are in hospital or their own homes because of age or sickness. Let us walk together, with the Lord, through Holy Week 2017. Be his witnesses - and proclaim 'Alleluia He is Risen! Alleluia!'

Fr Paul writes...

It is hard to believe that we are journeying into the 5th week of Lent. I'm finding that when I get to Wednesday the weekend comes rolling in. So when I feel this rush to life I try as hard as I can to find a little space to spend with the Lord. One of the most helpful ways I find this space is to sit down with a cup of tea - drink it slowly, close my eyes and call on the Lord's name. This only takes a few minutes. This helps me to keep in contact with the 'work of the Lord' as opposed to the lord of work. You may like to try this for yourself taking a little time walking with Jesus to the events of his Passion, Death and Rising.

On Tuesday evening, there is an LPA service of reconciliation at Holy Family Pensby starting at 7.00pm. Here we have an opportunity with our neighbouring parishes to come together for healing and forgives.

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday I hope to have enough palms for you all. At our 10.45am Mass we will gather outside the church for the blessing of palms and walk, while singing, in remembrance of the Lord Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. In the afternoon at 2.00pm in our church, we will have a second opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. At this service our children, who are preparing for Holy Communion, will receive the Sacrament of Forgiveness for the first time. Please come along if you can.

At a request from Bishop Mark and several parishioners I'm trying to introduce the possibility Holy Communion in the elements of bread and wine over our weekend Masses. After receiving the Host or a blessing you are to move to the left where you can, if you wish, receive the chalice then return to your seat via the left-hand side aisles. For those who are unable to come up for Communion the priest will come to you along with our Deacon or Minister of the Eucharist with the chalice. I really hope this does not cause too much fuss. So, let us all give it a go.

Soup and Sandwiches on Tuesdays from 12.00 to 1.30pm is going down a treat. I am wondering if you would like to continue this after Easter. If so, we will need a rota of soup and butty makers. ALL OF THEM ARE WELCOME, especially the MEN. There is no cost for the meal but there is a donations box if you would like to put something in. If you would like to become a member of the rota, please pass on your details to Fr Paul. Please pray for our children who will be receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation next Sunday for the first time.

Once again be assured of my prayers for you, your family and friends.

The Joseph Family

comprising of mum, dad and two daughters

As most of you will know, we have been supporting the Joseph Family in their attempts to move from being asylum seekers to have residency here in the UK.

They had to flee from punishment and death threats simply because that are Catholics.

This family comes from Northern India where the life of a Christian is under daily threats, on one occasion having one of their daughters kidnapped. The main protagonists have been an extremist group of the Sikh Community. This community will not accept Christianity in any form. You may ask, as I did, why did they not move to the large Catholic community in South India? The simple answer to this is Northern Indians do not accept anyone into their communities and vice a versa Southern Indians in the North.

Over the last 12 months they have made several attempts to apply for residency- yet every attempt has been turned down.

The family made a recent application. This, once again, has been turned down. They were ordered to move out of their house, and would be only given one more week's benefit of £88.00. Their only way forward was to apply for Judicial Review.

All of these applications for legal status cost money. Given that they only receive £80 per week for living expenses and are not allowed to work, the parish along with our SVP, have been helping to fund their recent applications. For them to place a Judicial Review is £650. This I have paid out of parish funds.

I am also aware that a number of parishioners have offered some practical help.

By making this application we have put a stop to their eviction and restored the small allowance of £80. This will give us some time to involve our local Councillors and Member of Parliament.

In the meantime, all I ask, on their behalf, is to pray for a positive Judicial Review. When you see the family be encouraging and assure them of your personal and prayerful support.

When people come to the Church to "have a Mass said", they are using an ancient practice whereby they have Mass offered for someone who has died or, in general, for the souls in Purgatory.


The Mass is the most perfect prayer we can offer to God. That is why so many of us continue the beautiful practice of "having a Mass said" for someone we love.

Having a Mass offered for **joyous** occasions, like a wedding, an anniversary, a birthday, or nameday, is very much encouraged.

From **this weekend** (2/3 September) if you would like to request that a Mass be offered for an intention, please pick up one of the **new white envelopes** in both porches and by the statue of St Anthony, put the details of your intention on the front and place any offering inside. Please put the envelope in the Mass Offering Box or through the door of the presbytery or hand it to Fr Paul or Deacon Mike. There is no minimum offering.

You may want to request that the Mass be offered on a specific date (such as a birthday or the anniversary of a person's death). You can do this by writing the date and the reason on your Mass offering envelope. We do our best to meet these requests but we cannot guarantee that Mass will be offered for your intention on the day requested because a Mass may already have been booked for that date or the intention may have to be moved to another day to accommodate a funeral. In these cases, the Mass will be arranged as close to the date requested as possible. The intentions for the coming week are published in the newsletter.

Please also note that having a Mass offered for a particular intention does not guarantee that the priest will say the intention out loud at Mass. Whether the priest mentions the name or not, the Mass is still being offered for the published intention and the person being prayed for will receive the spiritual fruits flowing from the Mass. If you have a special reason for wanting an announcement to be made, please do speak to Fr Paul before the Mass begins.

When people come to the Church to "have a Mass said", they are using an ancient practice whereby they have Mass offered for someone who has died or, in general, for the souls in Purgatory.

The Mass is the most perfect prayer we can offer to God. That is why so many of us continue the beautiful practice of "having a Mass said" for someone we love.

Having a Mass offered for **joyous** occasions, like a wedding, an anniversary, a birthday, or nameday, is very much encouraged.

From **next weekend** (2/3 September) if you would like to request that a Mass be offered for an intention, please pick up one of the **new white envelopes** in both porches and by the statue of St Anthony, put the details of your intention on the front and place any offering inside. Please put the envelope in the Mass Offering Box or through the door of the presbytery or hand it to Fr Paul or Deacon Mike. There is no minimum offering.

You may want to request that the Mass be offered on a specific date (such as a birthday or the anniversary of a person's death). You can do this by writing the date and the reason on your Mass offering envelope. We do our best to meet these requests but we cannot guarantee that Mass will be offered for your intention on the day requested because a Mass may already have been booked for that date or the intention may have to be moved to another day to accommodate a funeral. In these cases, the Mass will be arranged as close to the date requested as possible. The intentions for the coming week are published in the newsletter.

Please also note that having a Mass offered for a particular intention does not guarantee that the priest will say the intention out loud at Mass. Whether the priest mentions the name or not, the Mass is still being offered for the published intention and the person being prayed for will receive the spiritual fruits flowing from the Mass. If you have a special reason for wanting an announcement to be made, please do speak to Fr Paul before the Mass begins.

CONGRATULATIONS to all those who received examination results in the past weeks. May your hard work have paid off and as you make decisions for the next weeks, months and years ahead, we keep you in our prayers.

Fr Paul writes:

Our second reading at Mass this weekend lays open for us St Paul's vision of our nature and what it is to be 'Baptised into Christ.' Despite our common understanding that the 'Life of Baptism' takes place when we die to this life, this is only half the picture. When we were or are to be baptised, we, as St Paul tells us, "go into the tomb with Christ". So, from the day of our baptism, we are anointed by the Holy Spirit who dwells within us. This 'new life' starts the day when we become a brother or sister of the Lord Jesus.

Through every moment of our life we are called by Jesus to be a witness to others of the Passion, Death and Resurrection. So, the life we live is an invitation to follow the Lord. Many times, the pilgrim road of our life can feel dry and barren. Our prayer life is disturbed. We even ask, "Where is the Lord?" I believe that these times in our lives can be great moments of growth. The one whom we are called to give witness to has experienced many moments like this. From being let down by his closest friends to the feeling of utter abandonment of the Cross and crying out to his Father, "My God why have you forsaken me?"

Yet in our moment of darkness, we too can find ourselves under the shadow of the Cross. It is the very Cross that is traced on our foreheads, at the start of the rite of baptism, that turns into an ever-abiding sign of hope. As this action is done by the parents and Godparents the ministers says, "I claim you for Christ". St Paul's letter to us today should help to lift our hearts and focus on the one who has paid the price for sin and death. Who has offered each of us all lasting reconciliation so that we can celebrate with the Lord and our fellow pilgrims the risen life we lead to day.

Please keep our school in your prayers as they will be having their RE inspection this week. Be assured of my prayers and remembrance at Holy Mass.

Fr Paul writes...

Communion under both kinds: From next weekend, at both the Saturday Vigil Mass and at the Sunday 10.45am Mass, we will be introducing the availability of receiving Holy Communion on both forms of Bread and Wine. There will two areas in the church where you will be able to receive both forms of the Sacrament: firstly at the front of the church (as normal) and secondly in the church extension by the porch doors. Our parish stewards will be on hand to assist in directing you. For those of you who receive Communion in your seats, please remain there and we will come to you as normal.

I will have to move some benches to make room for us to reverently receive the Eucharist and I am prepared for the inevitable 'hick-ups' over the next Sundays, so I do ask for your patience. I am always open and ready to hear your suggestions to improve our reception of the Eucharist.

Advent: Next weekend we begin the Season of Advent. Before our weekend Masses the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the altar from 5:30 pm - 6:15 pm on Saturday, from 8:00 - 8:35 am and 10:00 - 10:20 am on Sundays. I will be available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation during these times.

Maintenance: Over the recent months, I have added more lights outside the church, presbytery and carpark. I have also started renewing some of the lights in the church. Speaking of lights - I'm most grateful to the band of gentlemen who have put up the festive lights around our buildings.

Parish Hall: There appears to be some concern about the cleanliness of our Parish Hall. After being here for several months the volunteers looking after the parish hall wished to hand over this responsibility and we thanked them for their service. A request was made in the newsletter for parishioners to take this on, but as no offers were forthcoming, I decided to do the job myself (!) Seven months later I employed a cleaner who now comes every fortnight. One of the problems regarding the use of the hall has been that each group has had their own 'sacred space.' Thus, I took on the responsibility of providing, tea, coffee, biscuits, juice and sugar for shared use for all the parish community. Our hall is used about 15 hours a week and each group is asked to leave the hall in good order. However, on Friday, next week, I will start to check the hall and if there are any 'goods' left, these will be collected and taken for recycling as appropriate.

As a number of you will know, I always see positive criticism as a blessing. I encourage it, as it is a positive way of all of us moving forward together along a shared path. But please do be mindful of the damage that ill-informed 'gossip' can do: to paraphrase JFK: 'Do not ask what the Church can do for you. Ask rather what you can do for your Church!'

Pope Francis' Message (abridged) for World Mission Sunday, 2017

Mission at the Heart of the Christian Faith

World Mission Sunday this year gathers us once again around Jesus, 'the first and greatest evangeliser' (Paul VI, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, 7), who sends us out to proclaim the Gospel. We are asked to reflect on mission at the heart of the Christian faith. As believers in a world marked by disappointment, frustration, and torn apart by war, it is important to ask ourselves: What is the *basis* of our mission? What is the *heart* of our mission? What are the *essential approaches* we need to take in carrying out our mission?

Mission: the Way, the Truth and the Life

The Church's mission is based on the life-changing power of the Gospel. Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life (cf. *Jn* 14:6). He is the *Way* who invites us to follow him with courage. Doing this, we experience *Truth* and receive his *Life*, a life that sets us free from selfishness, encouraging us to love. God wants us to be transformed by being open to the Holy Spirit and following Christ, ensuring the Gospel becomes a vital and effective tool to live by.

A contemporary mission

The Church's mission is not to spread a religious or grandiose ideology. Instead, Jesus Christ continues to evangelise and to act. Through the Gospel, the risen Jesus becomes our contemporary. 'Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated the world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force.' (Evangelii Gaudium, 276).

'Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a decisive direction' (Benedict XVI, *Deus Caritas Est*, 1).

The Gospel invites us to live our life participating in the Sacraments. Through *Baptism*, the Gospel becomes a source of new life. Through *Confirmation*, it becomes a fortifying anointing, pointing out new ways for witness. Through the *Eucharist*, it becomes food for new life (Ignatius of Antioch, *Ad Ephesios*, 20, 2).

The world vitally needs the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Through the Church, Christ continues his mission as *Good Samaritan*, caring for humanity's wounds, and as *Good Shepherd*, seeking out those who are lost on paths that lead nowhere. There are countless testimonies as to how the transformative power of the Gospel helps to overcome conflict, while promoting reconciliation.

Mission: a spirit of exodus, pilgrimage and exile

The Church's mission is enlivened by a spirit of constant exodus. We are challenged 'to go forth from our own comfort zone to reach all the 'peripheries' (margins) in need of the Gospel' (Evangelii Gaudium, 20). The Church's mission urges us to undertake a constant pilgrimage across various deserts of life, as we hunger and thirst for truth and justice. The Church's mission inspires a sense of constant exile, as we journey towards our final home in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Mission reminds us that we should not be a self-referential, selfobsessed Church. We should be 'a Church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a Church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security' (*ibid.*, 49).

Young people, the hope of mission

Young people are the hope of mission. 'There are many young people who engage in various forms of activism and volunteering... How beautiful it is to see that young people are "street preachers", joyfully bringing Jesus to every street, every town square and every corner of the earth!' (*ibid.*, 106). The next Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in 2018 is on the theme *Young People*, the Faith and Vocational Discernment.

Mission Societies (Missio)

The Pontifical Mission Societies (Missio) are a precious means of awakening in Christian communities - young people, adults, families, priests, bishops and religious orders - a desire to reach beyond their own confines to proclaim the Gospel to all. World Mission Sunday, promoted by Missio's APF (Association for the Propagation of the Faith), is the ideal way for us all to support the pressing needs of evangelisation through our prayer, our witness and our giving.

Mission with Mary, Mother of Evangelisation

In carrying out our mission, let us draw inspiration from Mary, Mother of Evangelisation. Moved by the Spirit, she welcomed the Word of life. May she help us to say our own 'yes', conscious of the need to make the Good News of Jesus resonate in our time. May she intercede for us so we can discover new ways to bring the gift of salvation to everyone.

By supporting Missio, the Pope's official charity for overseas mission, you will be sharing the peace and love of Christ with all people by helping everyone in need, regardless of background or belief. Today, your prayers and your donation will help a spirit of peace spread across South Sudan and around the world. Please give what you can, and if possible, please use the Gift Aid envelopes if you are a taxpayer. Thank you.

FAIRTRADE, CAFOD AND SAINSBURYS

From CAFOD: Sainsbury's is the largest retailer of Fairtrade products in the UK. They've decided to abandon Fairtrade certification on some of their ownbrand tea products and pilot their own scheme instead, known as 'Fairly Traded'.

Tea farmers in Africa have publicly opposed the move away from the Fairtrade Mark as it takes away their power to decide where to invest the Fairtrade Premium in their communities. We are concerned that this new 'Fairly Traded' tea, and any products that follow it, could mean an unfair deal for poor farmers.

Day of Action - 28 October

On 28 October, we're asking all Fairtrade supporters to take action. Gather members of your parish or community together and use mug props saying 'Ditching Fairtrade: not my cup of tea' outside your local store. Call the press, chat to customers, hand a letter to the store manager. You could even hold a tea party outside your local Sainsbury's!

Take action and tell Sainsbury's not to ditch Fairtrade with these simple steps:

Step 1: Personalise and print our letter to Sainsbury's (https://cafod.org.uk/Campaign/Fairtrade) and get as many people in your parish to sign it

This year, Harvest Fast Day was Friday 6 October (our collection postponed due to SVP appeal last weekend), and focuses on the work our partners are doing in El Salvador.

Edelmira and Martir are farmers in El Salvador. They live on and depend on their land. The harvest they reap is used to put food on the table, and sold to buy essential items such as clothes and medicine.

SVP IN ST WINEFRIDE'S

Dear Friends of St Winefride's



Our aim is to tackle poverty in all its forms through the provision of practical assistance to those in need. The concept of need is broader than financial hardship, a significant

proportion of our work is visiting people who are sick, lonely, in hospital, or suffering. The essence of what we do is person-to-person contact and spending time with people is our greatest gift.

Here in St Winefride's, we live our mission through helping others in need in many ways. In the last year, we have made over 800 visits to parishioners and members of the local community either in their own homes or in hospital; the majority of them are to those living alone and unable to leave their homes; and we have made visits to families of all ages. We also help by organising transport to mass and we thank the many Parishioners doing this every week.

Sometimes, more practical help is needed such as food, clothes, furniture, holidays or financial help. Our members are active in supporting our local Foodbank and we regular help with providing funds to families often at times of major upheaval in their lives.

The Chester and Ellesmere Port District SVP own a holiday home at Talacre that is shared amongst the parishes. We have 4 weeks allocated throughout the year (from March to Oct) two of which are in the school holidays, if you know a family who would benefit please let us know. The cost of the holiday home is funded through the theatre night in June, a sponsored walk (to be held on 1st October) and recycling printer ink cartridges and mobile phones; you can be place these in the box in the parish hall next to the photocopier.

In the summer, we organise an afternoon tea event for our older parishioners, this year we had 45 attend this popular event held at Inglewood Manor, this was a lovely time to meet-up and socialise. And in early December, we hold our SVP Christmas dinner; last year "Britain Has Got Talent" came to Neston and we had two singing stars from our parish who provided much fun and entertainment.

The SVP relies on the generosity of parishioner's in St Winefride's to fund many of our activities; the money raised goes to providing support for the events during the year, providing financial help to families and "Twinnage" supporting overseas SVP conferences. We support two conferences in India & Sudan, this enables them to assist families who are in need. In India each conference has adopted families who receive food, clothing and help with school fees and medical bills as there is no free welfare system in India. In addition, parishioners support two other schemes: the Sudan baby feeding appeal which helps to feed babies and young children in South Sudan through 2 feeding centres; the Indian Student Sponsorship scheme funds student school fees as education is not free.
