Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2018 – THAT ALL MAY BE FREE

Your right hand, O Lord, glorious in power (Ex 15:6)

The themes for 2018 raise some of the contemporary issues addressed by the churches of the Caribbean and use Exodus 15, a song of triumph over oppression, as the motif of the Week of Prayer. Abuses of human rights are found across the region and we are challenged to consider our manner of welcoming of the stranger into our midst. Human trafficking and modern-day slavery continue to be huge issues. Addiction to pornography and drugs, continue to be serious challenges to all societies. The debt crisis has a negative impact upon the nations and upon individuals - the economies of the nations and people have become precarious. Family life continues to be challenged by the economic restrictions which lead to migration, domestic abuse and violence.

The Caribbean Churches work together to heal the wounds in the body of Christ. Reconciliation demands repentance, reparation and the healing of memories. The whole Church is called to be both a sign and an active agent of this reconciliation.

REFLECTION

We are good because we are loved, not loved because we are good. If it was up to each one of us to earn it, we might not be loved very much. Too much goat and not enough sheep. And yet loved we are, since God is in all things, even the bits we think are ugly and unmentionable.
We are loved, but God wants us to give some love back, giving and receiving in a mutual relationship. Love makes us better holds us together reaching out to the other.
Being in relationship with God means being with other people, doing some good. Looking after the creation and not seeing everything as being there for our enjoyment.

RACIAL JUSTICE

On this day Catholics are called to pray for those who experience unjust discrimination or are marginalised because of their race and ethnicity. We think in particular of those who feel they do not belong within our society or our communities because of this discrimination.

Gaudate et Exsultate: on the Call to Holiness in Today's World



Pope Francis released his latest papal document (exhortation) on Monday 9 April, 2018. The Latin title, "Rejoice and Be Glad", comes from Matthew 5:12, part of the Sermon on the Mount - "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven". The Sermon on the Mount figures heavily into the document, providing a sort of "roadmap" to holiness. A few quotes from Gaudate are below. My modest goal is to re-propose the call to holiness in a practical way for our own time. with all its risks, challenges and opportunities.

Christian joy is usually accompanied by a sense of humour.

The important thing is that each believer discern his or her own path, that they bring out the very best of themselves, the most personal gifts that God has placed in their hearts, rather than hopelessly trying to imitate something not meant for them.

It is not healthy to love silence while feeding interaction with others, to want peace and quiet while avoiding activity, to seek prayer while disdaining service.

Seeing and acting with mercy: that is holiness.

We need to think of ourselves as an army of the forgiven. All of us have been looked upon with divine compassion.

Pope Francis speaks on Baptism

Pope Francis spoke about the sacrament of Baptism on Wednesday, emphasizing the importance of the Catholic practice of baptizing infants, since the grace of the Holy Spirit helps them to grow in virtue.

"Why baptize a child who does not understand?" the pope asked, "When we baptize a child, the Holy Spirit enters that child, and the Holy Spirit makes... the Christian virtues grow in that child, who will then flourish."

Though we hope that when a child grows up he or she will understand and desire Baptism for themselves, to withhold the sacrament from a child "means not trusting in the Holy Spirit," he said.

"We must always give this opportunity to everyone, to all children, to have inside of them the Holy Spirit that will guide them throughout their lives. Do not forget to baptize children!"

Pope Francis spoke about infant Baptism during his weekly general audience in St. Peter's Square. He also emphasized that the graces of the sacrament are not something one earns through understanding, intelligence, or worthiness, but as pure gift.

"Nobody deserves Baptism," he said, "[it] is always a gift for everyone, adults and new-borns. But as happens for a seed full of life, this gift takes root and bears fruit in earth fed by faith."

Baptism also, by the Holy Spirit, "immerses us in the death and resurrection of the Lord," the pope said. In the sacrament the "old man," dominated by sin, gives way to the "new man," who has been recreated in Christ Jesus.

"But for us Christians it must not escape that if the body is immersed in water, it is the soul that is immersed in Christ to receive forgiveness from sin and shine with divine light," he stated.

He quoted St. Paul's reminder to the Christians of Rome:"Or are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life."

Furthermore, Pope Francis spoke about how Baptism, through immersion in Christ, also makes us members of Christ's body and his mission in the world, which is the Church.

"We baptized are not isolated," he said, "the same life, that of the Holy Spirit, flows from Christ to the baptized, uniting them into one Body, crested by holy unction and nourished at the Eucharistic table."



Fr Paul writes...

Please keep in your prayers Pippa Parry, Sara Benjamin, Alfie Hirst and Finn Corbett who will be celebrating their first Holly Communion this Sunday at 10.45am. We also ask the Father's blessing upon their family and friends.

Over the last 18 months several repairs and updates have taken place in our church building and Hall. I thought it would be a good time to update you upon these works. In the Church, the window up in the loft has been repaired. several outside electric boxes have been placed around the church. This helps our 'Christmas Elves' in putting up the lights around the church. I hope we will be able to connect to these electric boxes lights to light up the church building. As you enter the church the lights automatically turn themselves on. This is particularly useful for the group of parishioners who open and close the church in the winter months. A hot water heater has been placed in the sacristy; the coping stones on the church roof as well as broken slats have been replaced. We are replacing the fittings of the church lights from halogen to LED lighting. The out lay for these fittings cost nearly £150 so we replace them when the halogen stops working. Once all the lights have been renewed the electric bill for the church will dramatically come down in price. The security lights around the building, including the car park will be up and running by September.

In the parish hall the sockets in the kitchen have been altered so the microwave can be used safely. In the hall. A new water heater has been fitted. The W.C. a hand dryer has been fitted, so no more paper or cloths are required. In the outside W.C. a light now comes on when you enter and stays on for five or so minutes. Also fitted is a hand dryer, sono more paper or cloths are required.

The Parish graveyard: The Diocese has taken control of the graveyard and grounds. The main reason for this is health and safety. The gardeners come from spring to autumn twice a month and then in the winter they come every three weeks. I would like to thank the 'band of gardeners' who in recent years have worked hard in keeping the church land in a very good state.

I requested the committee from the diocese to come and look at some issues re the graveyard. After their visit a company has been given the job of putting pathways into the graveyard. This work will start this Monday. So, if you are wishing to visit the graveyard please be careful where you walk. It is hoped that the work will be finished by the end of the month. This work is costing around £12000. This money will be paid by the Diocese cemetery Fund.

I will keep you and your families in my prayers remembering especially our young people who have Public Exams over their next month.





Giving young people a voice

As the Church gears up for the Synod of Bishops, Youth Ministry worker, Megan Cox who participated at the Pre-Synod meeting in March says "young people were at the forefront of that conversation."

The countdown maybe on to the Synod of Bishops on Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment which begins on Wednesday, but it was in March that the youth of the world came together in Rome to have their say. Youth Ministry Development Worker, Megan Cox represented the Archdiocese of Birmingham in England at the Pre-Synodal meeting.

Speaking about her experience to Vatican News, she says, "automatically the attention was turned straight to young people, with the idea of, if we are going to talk about young people, we probably need to ask them." "That really impressed me to start with, that the point of the Synod wasn't lost from the get go and actually young people were at the forefront of that conversation."

Megan herself works in Youth Ministry and points out that although youth ministry in her own diocese is very active, that can't be said for other parts of the UK. She adds, that it is in a "revolution period" and is gaining speed but, it hasn't yet reached its full potential. **Global Youth Issues**

The Pre-Synod, Megan notes, saw participation from all over the world and she describes this as very important. "If we're talking in terms of a universal Church, it needs to be universal; we need to have the opinions of young people from across the globe. She goes on to say, that it is clear from the document that came out from the Pre-Synod meeting, that there are "issues shared by young people across the world, things that we all have in common."

Social Justice and Social Media

Megan recalls that during the meeting, what came out strongly was the theme of Social Justice and what it meant to young people, depending on where they were from. Another key theme, she says, was the issue of social media in the lives of young people. Megan comments "it is such a great tool but can also be so damaging, so where is the balance...?" What came out of discussions was that, "if you've got a generation looking down at their phones all the time rather than looking up at what is going on around them, what can you do about that?" She says, if that is the case, let's harness that and let's use it as a resource for the Church.

Asked what she would like to see coming out of the upcoming Synod of Bishops, Megan expresses the hope that, they will "remain faithful to what they've heard young people say, the documents that have been given to them from the Pre- Synod meeting, the conversations that have been held around the world, that when they eventually produce their document that it is just true to what they've been told..." Megan says, the Catholic Church has had its trials and tribulations, but despite that it is an amazing community to be a part of with enthusiastic young people who want it to thrive.

I thought you may like to read one of the homilies that Pope Francis gave during this week.

Pope at Mass: Be careful around rigid Christians

"Salvation is a gift from God," He gives us "the spirit of liberty."

Pope Francis based his homily on the day's Gospel, which tells how Jesus did not observe the prescribed cleansing when He was invited to dine at the home of a Pharisee. The Gospel relates the harsh response of lesus at the "amazement" of the Pharisees. Doctors of the Law scandalized by lesus. The Pope emphasized the difference between the love of the people for Jesus, who loved Him because He touched their hearts, and a little bit because of their own interest; and the hatred of the doctors of the Law, the scribes, the Sadducees, the Pharisees, who followed Him in order to catch Him in an error. They were the "pure": They were truly an example of formality. But they lacked life. They were, so to speak, "starched." They were rigid. And Jesus knew their soul. This scandalizes us, because they were scandalized by the things lesus did when He forgave sins, when He healed on the Sabbath. They rent their garments: "Oh! What a scandal! This is not from God, because He should have done this" [instead]. The people didn't matter to them: The Law mattered to them, the prescriptions, the rubrics." Whitened sepulchres.

lesus, though, accepts the invitation of the Pharisee - because He is free - and He goes to him. The Pharisee was scandalized by His behaviour which went beyond the rules. But Jesus says to him, "You Pharisees cleanse the outside of the cup and the dish, [but] inside you are filled with plunder and evil." They are not beautiful words, eh? Jesus spoke clearly, He was not a hypocrite. He spoke clearly. And he said to them, "But why do you look at what is external? Look at what is within." Another time He said to them, "You are whitened sepulchres." Nice compliment, eh? Beautiful on the outside, all perfect... all perfect... but within, full of rottenness, therefore of greed, of wickedness, He says. Jesus distinguishes between appearances and internal reality. These lords are "doctors of appearances": always perfect, always. But within, what is there? Hypocrites interested only in appearances

Pope Francis recalled other passages in the Gospel when lesus condemned such people, as He did in the parable of the Good Samaritan, or when He denounced their ostentatious manner of fasting and almsgiving. This, he said, is because they were interested only in appearances. "Jesus describes these people with one word: hypocrites." They are people with greedy souls, capable of killing: "capable of paying to kill or calumniate, as happens every day. It happens today: they are paid to give bad news, news that smears others. "Behind rigidity there are grave problems".

In a word, Pope Francis continued, the Pharisees and doctors of the Law were rigid people, not disposed to change. "But always, under or behind rigidity, there are problems, grave problems," the Pope said. We intend to have the appearance of being a good Christian; we intend to appear a certain way, we put make-up on our souls. However, Pope Francis said, behind these appearances, "there are problems. Jesus is not there. The spirit of the world is there." Do I open my heart?

Jesus calls them "foolish" and advises them to open their souls to love, in order for grace to enter. Because "grace is a freely-given gift from God. No one saves himself, no one. No one saves himself, even with the practices of these people. "Finally, the Pope warns us to be careful around those who are rigid. Be careful around Christians - be they laity, priests, bishops - who present themselves as so "perfect," rigid. Be careful. There's no Spirit of God there. They lack the spirit of liberty. And let us be careful with ourselves, because this should lead us to consider our own life. Do I seek to look only at appearance, and not change my heart? Do I not open my heart to prayer, to the liberty of prayer, the liberty of almsgiving, the liberty of works of mercy?
