ST WINEFRIDE'S PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

All the children of St Winefride's, from reception class to Year 6, took part in a poetry recital in school recently. The event was very well attended by parents, carers, grandparents and friends who enjoyed some fantastic poetry and some amazing performances. Thank you to Mrs Hoskinson for organising the event and to all the staff for their hard work. Well done to the children. Some of the poetry was written by the children themselves including the following poem written by all the children of Year 5.

WHERE GOD IS FOUND

He is in the green leaves at the top of the tallest tree He is in the breeze that gently kisses my face. He is the sun, shining with happiness over us all. In the thick snow, we see a bright glow, with him guiding us. He is heard in every baby's cry. He is in my toy box having fun.

He is heard in the laughter of everyone. He is in my heart, when I am sad. He is like my Father, when he looks after me. He is seen beside us, when the road is long. He is in my heart and yours - giving us life. He is right here now - in our school and community. Fr Paul writes...

Communion under both kinds: From next weekend, at both the Saturday Vigil Mass and at the Sunday 10.45am Mass, we will be introducing the availability of receiving Holy Communion on both forms of Bread and Wine. There will two areas in the church where you will be able to receive both forms of the Sacrament; firstly at the front of the church (as normal) and secondly in the church extension by the porch doors. Our parish stewards will be on hand to assist in directing you. For those of you who receive Communion in your seats, please remain there and we will come to you as normal.

I will have to move some benches to make room for us to reverently receive the Eucharist and I am prepared for the inevitable 'hick-ups' over the next Sundays, so I do ask for your patience. I am always open and ready to hear your suggestions to improve our reception of the Eucharist.

Advent: Next weekend we begin the Season of Advent. Before our weekend Masses the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the altar from 5:30 pm - 6:15 pm on Saturday, from 8:00 - 8:35am and 10:00 - 10:20 am on Sundays. I will be available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation during these times.

Maintenance: Over the recent months, I have added more lights outside the church, presbytery and carpark. I have also started renewing some of the lights in the church. Speaking of lights - I'm most grateful to the band of gentlemen who have put up the festive lights around our buildings.

Parish Hall: There appears to be some concern about the cleanliness of our Parish Hall. After being here for several months the volunteers looking after the parish hall wished to hand over this responsibility and we thanked them for their service. A request was made in the newsletter for parishioners to take this on, but as no offers were forthcoming, I decided to do the job myself (!) Seven months later I employed a cleaner who now comes every fortnight. One of the problems regarding the use of the hall has been that each group has had their own 'sacred space.' Thus, I took on the responsibility of providing, tea, coffee, biscuits, juice and sugar for shared use for all the parish community. Our hall is used about 15 hours a week and each group is asked to leave the hall in good order. However, on Friday, next week, I will start to check the hall and if there are any 'goods' left, these will be collected and taken for recycling as appropriate.

As a number of you will know, I always see positive criticism as a blessing. I encourage it, as it is a positive way of all of us moving forward together along a shared path. But please do be mindful of the damage that ill-informed 'gossip' can do: to paraphrase JFK: 'Do not ask what the Church can do for you. Ask rather what you can do for your Church!'

Be assured of my prayers for you and your families.
