## How Can We Respond To Food Poverty In Our Community?

Local communities continue to grapple with the hunger on our doorsteps and the issues faced by local people don't seem to be going away. As volunteers who have taken some responsibility for supporting local people in crisis in West Cheshire, the Trustee's at Foodbank take the challenges related to food poverty very seriously.

We have spent some time listening to different voices and considering how Foodbank can most effectively serve the local community. As Trustees, we wanted to share some of the questions that have arisen as we consider how best to do this:

- How can we better listen to Foodbank visitors, volunteers, supporters and local community leaders?
- Why do people need to come to Foodbank in West Cheshire?
- Is our Foodbank here to stay?
- Should Foodbank plan not to be needed in the future and what would need to happen for that to occur?
- What does it mean for us to understand food poverty as a human rights issue?
- How can Foodbank be 'with' and not 'for' hungry people?
- What are the criteria for establishing additional distribution centres?

For the future, the staff and Trustees are working on two documents:

1] A **Development Plan** which looks to the future for West Cheshire Foodbank - volunteers and trustees are being consulted in this process which considers 2015 and beyond. We'll make this public soon.

2] An in-depth study on why people in West Cheshire are going hungry - local academics and service providers are working on a report which is based on local and current statistical evidence and stories of people living with food poverty. The **Research Report** detailing the findings of this study will be published in March 2015.

We share these thoughts whilst wondering, what do you think? What are your concerns and what do you think the local response to food poverty should be? Without your support, time and commitment, Foodbank could not serve the community in the ways it does. We'd really value any input you have - we want to know how best to serve our local community. #### Key Statistics: In December 2014...

**458** people received emergency food from West Cheshire Foodbank. This represents an increase of 17% in the numbers of people referred compared to the same month last year.

Local people generously donated 14195 kgs of food to us, keeping our committed team of warehouse volunteers very busy indeed! The overwhelming generosity of our supporters is humbling and, thanks to them, we have not only met existing demand, but we also have strong reserves of stock going forwards into the New Year.


