Gaudate et Exsultate: on the Call to Holiness in Today's World



Pope Francis released his latest papal document (exhortation) on Monday 9 April, 2018. The Latin title, "Rejoice and Be Glad", comes from Matthew 5:12, part of the Sermon on the Mount - "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven". The Sermon on the Mount figures heavily into the document, providing a sort of "roadmap" to holiness. A few quotes from Gaudate are below. My modest goal is to re-propose the call to holiness in a practical way for our own time. with all its risks, challenges and opportunities.

Christian joy is usually accompanied by a sense of humour.

The important thing is that each believer discern his or her own path, that they bring out the very best of themselves, the most personal gifts that God has placed in their hearts, rather than hopelessly trying to imitate something not meant for them.

It is not healthy to love silence while feeding interaction with others, to want peace and quiet while avoiding activity, to seek prayer while disdaining service.

Seeing and acting with mercy: that is holiness.

We need to think of ourselves as an army of the forgiven. All of us have been looked upon with divine compassion.

Pope Francis speaks on Baptism

Pope Francis spoke about the sacrament of Baptism on Wednesday, emphasizing the importance of the Catholic practice of baptizing infants, since the grace of the Holy Spirit helps them to grow in virtue.

"Why baptize a child who does not understand?" the pope asked, "When we baptize a child, the Holy Spirit enters that child, and the Holy Spirit makes... the Christian virtues grow in that child, who will then flourish."

Though we hope that when a child grows up he or she will understand and desire Baptism for themselves, to withhold the sacrament from a child "means not trusting in the Holy Spirit," he said.

"We must always give this opportunity to everyone, to all children, to have inside of them the Holy Spirit that will guide them throughout their lives. Do not forget to baptize children!"

Pope Francis spoke about infant Baptism during his weekly general audience in St. Peter's Square. He also emphasized that the graces of the sacrament are not something one earns through understanding, intelligence, or worthiness, but as pure gift.

"Nobody deserves Baptism," he said, "[it] is always a gift for everyone, adults and new-borns. But as happens for a seed full of life, this gift takes root and bears fruit in earth fed by faith."

Baptism also, by the Holy Spirit, "immerses us in the death and resurrection of the Lord," the pope said. In the sacrament the "old man," dominated by sin, gives way to the "new man," who has been recreated in Christ Jesus.

"But for us Christians it must not escape that if the body is immersed in water, it is the soul that is immersed in Christ to receive forgiveness from sin and shine with divine light," he stated.

He quoted St. Paul's reminder to the Christians of Rome:"Or are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life."

Furthermore, Pope Francis spoke about how Baptism, through immersion in Christ, also makes us members of Christ's body and his mission in the world, which is the Church.

"We baptized are not isolated," he said, "the same life, that of the Holy Spirit, flows from Christ to the baptized, uniting them into one Body, crested by holy unction and nourished at the Eucharistic table."

Fr Paul writes...

Please keep in your prayers Pippa Parry, Sara Benjamin, Alfie Hirst and Finn Corbett who will be celebrating their first Holly Communion this Sunday at 10.45am. We also ask the Father's blessing upon their family and friends.

Over the last 18 months several repairs and updates have taken place in our church building and Hall. I thought it would be a good time to update you upon these works. In the Church, the window up in the loft has been repaired. several outside electric boxes have been placed around the church. This helps our 'Christmas Elves' in putting up the lights around the church. I hope we will be able to connect to these electric boxes lights to light up the church building. As you enter the church the lights automatically turn themselves on. This is particularly useful for the group of parishioners who open and close the church in the winter months. A hot water heater has been placed in the sacristy; the coping stones on the church roof as well as broken slats have been replaced. We are replacing the fittings of the church lights from halogen to LED lighting. The out lay for these fittings cost nearly £150 so we replace them when the halogen stops working. Once all the lights have been renewed the electric bill for the church will dramatically come down in price. The security lights around the building, including the car park will be up and running by September.

In the parish hall the sockets in the kitchen have been altered so the microwave can be used safely. In the hall. A new water heater has been fitted. The W.C. a hand dryer has been fitted, so no more paper or cloths are required. In the outside W.C. a light now comes on when you enter and stays on for five or so minutes. Also fitted is a hand dryer, sono more paper or cloths are required.

The Parish graveyard: The Diocese has taken control of the graveyard and grounds. The main reason for this is health and safety. The gardeners come from spring to autumn twice a month and then in the winter they come every three weeks. I would like to thank the 'band of gardeners' who in recent years have worked hard in keeping the church land in a very good state.

I requested the committee from the diocese to come and look at some issues re the graveyard. After their visit a company has been given the job of putting pathways into the graveyard. This work will start this Monday. So, if you are wishing to visit the graveyard please be careful where you walk. It is hoped that the work will be finished by the end of the month. This work is costing around £12000. This money will be paid by the Diocese cemetery Fund.

I will keep you and your families in my prayers remembering especially our young people who have Public Exams over their next month.
