



# Introduction

As seen in many walks of our daily life, COVID-19 has also had a far-reaching effect on the way we go to Mass. St Winefride's have prepared this leaflet to answer some questions which you may be asking yourselves.

## Changes

- All Holy Water stoups are dry to prevent transfer of infection.
- Hand sanitiser dispensers have been fitted and you are expected to use these on entry to and exit from the church.
- You will be greeted by a one-way system, shown by markings on the floor, cordoned off areas within the church and allocated seating points.
- Please follow the directions from the stewards.
- Kneelers are covered in fabric and harder to sanitise. Please be seated and stand only during mass.
- Any worship aids (missalettes etc.) should be for single use and taken with the user when the Mass ends. They should **NOT** be left in the church at the end of Mass.
- Do **NOT** bring in your own Missals etc. into church for the time being.

## How many people are allowed in church?

- The maximum occupancy of this church is 64 (individual) 70 (including household/social bubble).
- All seating within the church will be on a first come, first served basis, allocated by volunteer stewards.
- If queues start to develop to enter the church, please respect a 2m distance between one another whilst you are being sorted.
- If you are asked to queue please follow the disabled ramp at 2m spacing, proceeding towards the corner of the house and towards the road, on the pathway, if necessary.

## Will I have to wear a facemask?

Face **coverings** are compulsory for everyone 11 years old and over except in the following circumstances:

- People with breathing difficulties
- People with disabilities
- Anyone with someone who relies on lip reading
- Young children should have adult supervision when wearing a face covering





## How long will the Mass last?

• Due to restrictions imposed, there will be no congregational singing at Mass. The Mass length will be about 30 minutes

#### How often will the church be cleaned?

• The volunteer stewards will clean the church after each Mass

#### How will the offertory work?

• There will be no offertory procession of the gifts of bread and wine to the altar, though a collection box for cash offerings to be placed at the entrance to church. However parishioners are encouraged to make their donation to the church online or via standing order.

#### How will Communion work?

- Communion will be given at the usual position within the Mass.
- Parishioners from individual benches will then be guided by stewards.
- Please wait for the steward's invitation before going for communion or to exit the church.
- Please make sure you wear your face covering apart from when receiving the host.
- Standing, the communicant, with outstretched arms and flattened, stacked hands will receive the host.
- The communicant will then follow the one-way system back to their seat.

#### Toilets

• In line with government guidelines, **no** toilet facilities will be available at church.
