Next weekend, Mgr Jack Kennedy has been invited to our parish to lead us in meaningfully celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation and thus prepare ourselves to joyfully sing the Easter Alleluia. This Sacrament is certainly not just about ourselves and our sins! There is a rebuilding of relationships, leading us to new hopes, new possibilities, new prayers and new dreams.

I am told there are even 'apps' like *Confession* and *Mea Culpa* that smart phone owners can use! Of course, as many will say, possibly the best 'app' is to sit in silence contemplating the compassionate face of Jesus on the cross...

#### A LENTEN PASTORAL LETTER "DO NOT BE AFRAID OF CONFESSION"

My dear brothers and sisters,

"I would like to ask you – but don't say it aloud, everyone respond in his or her heart: when was the last time you made your Confession?"

This is the question Pope Francis has recently put to us. The Holy Father continued:

"Everyone think about it ..." Is it "two days, two weeks, two years, twenty years, forty years?... And if much time has passed, do not lose another day. Go, the priest will be good. Jesus is there, and Jesus is more benevolent than priests. Jesus receives you, he receives you with much love. Be courageous and go to Confession!" (General Audience of the Holy Father, 19<sup>th</sup> February 2014)

This is the call of Pope Francis which I wish to echo at the beginning of Lent in this year which we have dedicated in the Diocese to peace and reconciliation. (Pastoral Letter for Peace Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> January 2014)

"Do not be afraid of Confession!" Pope Francis says in his simple and direct teaching. "When one is in line for Confession," he reflects, we feel those things which weigh on our hearts; "but when one finishes Confession, one leaves free, grand, beautiful, forgiven, candid, happy. This is the beauty of Confession!"

This is the Sacrament which Christ gives us for our salvation; for the forgiveness of sins after Baptism; and to enable you and me to reach the holiness, the perfection of charity which is the goal of our Christian lives. (Lumen Gentium 40)

So, what is it that holds us back from this Sacrament? I think I know from personal experience what can hold us back. Confession is the moment when I have to put aside all illusions about myself and about the state of my Christian life and be ready to say, "Father, these are my sins." It would be so much easier to say: these are someone else's sins and faults! But, no; this is where I have gone wrong! Confession is a 'reality check' when I recognise how far I still have to go in the Christian life and receive the grace to go forward.

In our Emeritus Pope Benedict's words: "We must accept our frailty but keep on going, not giving up but moving forward and becoming converted ever anew through the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a new start ..." (Pope Benedict XVI 17<sup>th</sup> February 2007)

This is surely a moment when you and I are "led by the Spirit" (Mt 4:1) to reject the temptations of the Devil, as Our Saviour did in the wilderness. We must never forget the Lord Jesus Himself, God the Son sharing our humanity, was

tempted by the Evil One. We, then, must expect to face the same struggle in our lives. The sincere Confession of our sins is the moment when we put aside the illusions we can all so easily entertain about ourselves.

Before Christmas Pope Francis described how he goes to Confession.

"Priests and bishops too have to go to Confession. We are all sinners" the Holy Father explained, "The Pope is also a sinner. And the Confessor hears what I tell him, he counsels me and forgives me, because we are all in need of this forgiveness."

Pope Francis reminds us that confessing our sins can involve shame. But he calls it a "good shame," for our sins are the one thing of which we should be ashamed! However, it is in the very moment we confess them (in the Holy Father's words) God sends "a brother to bestow his pardon, the certainty of his forgiveness in the name of the Church ..."

Through the ministry of the priest, Pope Francis reflects, God holds us "in a new embrace and regenerates us and allows us to rise again and resume our journey" (General Audience, 20th November 2013)

Today's Gospel ends with these beautiful words: "Then the devil left him, and angels appeared and looked after him" (Mt 4:11)

It is a scene of peace following the struggle in the wilderness. The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation brings us peace: "Go in peace" the priest says to us.

I am sending Pope Francis's words of encouragement to you in a leaflet, together with a simple guide on how to go to Confession. During Lent there will be many opportunities to approach this "great and beautiful Sacrament". I have asked your priests to be especially available on Good Friday, as I will be in the Cathedral. With Pope Francis, I invite you to put this question to yourself: How long is it since I was last at Confession? Please do not lose any time. The Holy Father reminds us:

"It is Jesus Himself who awaits us in this great and beautiful Sacrament: have courage and go to Confession!"



# From the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, Department for Christian Responsibility and Citizenship – February 2014

'Assisted dying' is often in the news. There is a Private Member's bill before Parliament to try to legalise it. But just what is 'assisted dying'? What does the law say about it? What do doctors have to say about it? What does the Church say about it and what are the problems with it? What exactly is 'assisted dying'?

'Assisted dying' really means assisting someone to commit suicide. It is the language used by those who want to change the law to legalise assisted suicide. A law permitting 'assisted dying' would licence doctors to supply lethal drugs to terminally ill patients.

## Shouldn't everyone have the right to decide when and how they die?

An 'assisted dying' law could easily put vulnerable people at risk. There are real concerns that there is scope for such a law to be abused. For example, some terminally ill people might feel under pressure to end their lives, either from others or from feeling that they should remove a care or financial burden from their families. Others might wish to do so as a result of depression, a common feature of terminal illness. A 'right to die' could become a 'duty to die'.

## Why should dying people be forced to stay alive and suffer?

End-of-life care in Britain has advanced hugely since the days when death was commonly associated with pain and suffering. An international survey by *The Economist* in 2010 ranked Britain top among 40 nations, including the United States, for quality of end-of-life care. What is needed is to ensure that everyone has access to the best palliative care available. In contrast, assisted suicide is a counsel of despair.

#### What's the law on this now?

It's against the law to encourage or assist another person's suicide. This reflects a widely-held view that, while people who attempt suicide should be treated with compassion, helping someone to commit suicide is not something that should be encouraged. Indeed, as a society we go to great lengths to prevent suicides.

#### What does the Church say about assisting suicide?

In a message addressed to Catholics in Ireland, Scotland, England and Wales, Pope Francis said, "Even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in his own image, destined to live for ever and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect". The Church supports high quality care for the dying and protection for the weak and vulnerable. The Church teaches that life is a gift from God (John 10:10) and that suicide is the ultimate inability to accept the gift of life. Although attempting suicide should be treated with compassion rather than with blame, suicide should never be encouraged or promoted. Moreover the Church teaches that deliberately ending or helping to end someone else's life, even if that person may have requested it, is wrong. Those who take someone else's life take to themselves the power of life and death, which ultimately belongs to God.

## What does the medical profession have to say about it?

The BMA and the Royal Colleges of Physicians, General Practitioners and Surgeons are opposed to legalising physician-assisted suicide. And most doctors don't regard it as a proper part of clinical practice - they are all too well aware from experience that dying patients can be vulnerable.

#### What's wrong with changing the law?

There are powerful practical reasons why the law shouldn't be changed. It's almost impossible to be sure that a request for assisted suicide from someone who is terminally ill reflects a clear and settled wish that has not been influenced by depression or pressure of one sort or another. Changing the law might give a very small number of strong-minded people what they want but it could easily put much larger numbers of vulnerable people at risk of harm.

## Wouldn't there be safeguards in any legalised system?

Yes, but what safeguards and how effective would they be? In the tiny number of other countries where assisted suicide has been legalised there is emerging evidence that the safeguards don't work. For instance, some laws seek to restrict access to assisted suicide to terminally ill people who are in full possession of all their faculties and are acting freely. But prognosis of terminal illness is fraught with difficulty: terminally ill people often live for much longer than the predictions they are given when they are diagnosed - occasionally, they even recover. And the evidence from overseas shows that doctors have sometimes failed to spot clinical depression among those who have been supplied with lethal drugs to end their lives

## If I can end my life by refusing treatment, why can't I have medical help to end it?

Everyone has the legal right to refuse treatment, but patients who refuse treatment rarely do so in order to end their lives: they do it because they are finding the treatment burdensome and they want to let nature take its course. There's a world of difference, in medical ethics and in law, between accepting that death can't be prevented and seeking assistance to end your own life.

## Don't doctors sometimes hasten patients' deaths under the quise of pain relief?

These days pain relief is a sophisticated science. When analgesics are properly prescribed and administered, there is no risk to the patient's life. Research has shown that in Britain illegal action of this kind by doctors is rare or non-existent.

# British people are going to Switzerland to get help with suicide. Why should they not be able to get that help here?

Though every 'Swiss suicide' makes the headlines, only around 1 in every 25,000 deaths of Britons in the last 10 years has taken this form. The fact that a very small number of British people choose to seek assisted suicide in another country doesn't mean we should legalise the practice here. We make our own laws, and the legal protection of the weak and vulnerable is a fundamental duty of the state and of society.

### **OFSTED Inspection**

Pupils, staff and Governors at St Winefride's Catholic Primary School, Little Neston are celebrating following their recent Ofsted report where they received 'Good' across the board, with some outstanding features.

The excellent report highly praises the good teaching; all pupils making at least 'good'' progress; a high expectation of behaviour, which is evident throughout the school; good governance and the head teacher's strong resolve to continue the drive for improvement, as well as a clear vision about what needs to be done to build upon the achievements of the school to date.

The inspectors rated the quality of teaching in all classes to be consistently 'at least good' and on occasion, outstanding. They found that children get off to a good start in the Early Years Foundation Stage and make good progress in a well structured environment, leaving St Winefride's, at the end of year 6, with attainment above the National average. The teachers make learning interesting and stimulating with great opportunities for pupils to practise their skills in reading, writing and mathematics in other subject areas. children's participation in a version of 'The Young Apprentice.'

This project enabled the children in year 6 to meet a candidate from the television programme and work alongside him to develop 'real-life' skills by setting up their own businesses and raising money. The inspectors remarked upon how confident and articulate the children are. The children enjoyed speaking with the inspectors and sharing their learning, which clearly underlined how proud they are of their school and how much they value the warm and trusting relationships that underpin their positive attitudes to learning.

#### From Fr Ravi... Looking ahead!

This weekend we are delighted to welcome all those children who were baptised in 2013 and their families. On this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we especially pray for them at 10.45am mass and also experience the joy of sharing together the life and mission of the Church.

#### From Fr Ravi... A Home For All!

I found the following anecdote helpful in my new year meditation: A monk from Thomas Merton's abbey visited a priory and the superior apologised to him for the many steps as they climbed the stairs. "There are many steps in our abbey, too," the monk replied. Then he added, "I count them as I climb.... This is how I count them: *one*, *one*, *one*, *one*..."

Every step in life is a new beginning, hence it is never too late to begin anew!
