# News from St Winefride's Catholic Primary School:

Staff and children returned to school last week and will be celebrating their first mass of the New Year this **Thursday 17**th **January in school at 9.10am**. All welcome to attend.

A date for your diary – **PTFA** are holding a meeting at the **Royal Oak at 7pm this Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> January**. If you have children or grandchildren at the school and would like to be involved, then please come along. Further details can be found under the community section on the school website.

Speaking during his homily at Mass on Thursday morning, **Pope Francis** said that in order to love God concretely, one must also love one's brothers and sisters – all of them: both those we like and those we don't like.

The Pope also said good Christians must not neglect to pray even for "the enemy", nor give way to feelings of jealousy or engage in harmful gossip.

At the heart of his message was an encouragement to overcome a deceitful and divisive "worldly" spirit with the strength of faith.

The spirit of the world is deceitful.

Taking his cue from the First Reading of the Day, the Pope noted that St. John the Apostle speaks of "worldliness" when he says that "whoever is begotten by God conquers the world".

He explained that this refers to our everyday struggle against a worldly spirit that is deceitful and lacks in consistency while "God's spirit is truthful".

"The spirit of the world is a spirit of vanity, of things that have no strength, no foundation and that are destined to fall" he said.

The spirit of the world divides families, communities, society

The Pope said the Apostle shows us the way reminding us that if we go by God's spirit, we will do good things.

Concretely, he says that "If anyone says, 'I love God' but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen".

"If you are unable to love something you see" the Pope explained, "why would you love something you do not see?" Describing this as fantasy, he urged us to love "what you see, what you can touch, what is real. Not the fantasies that you do not see".

Francis also said that if one does not show his love for God in a concrete manner, it is not true love.

He then spoke of the spirit of the world which he said can be divisive and create splits in families, communities and society.

"When divisions multiply, they bring hatred and war" he said.

Pope Francis went on to dwell on three signs that indicate that one does not love one's brother.

The first, he said, is actually a question we must all ask ourselves: "Do I pray for others? For those whom I like and for those whom I dislike?".

The second pertains to feelings of envy and jealousy and wishing someone ill: "Don't let these feelings grow" he said, "They are dangerous".

The third, he said, has to do with engaging in chatter - or gossip - that is harmful to others: "If I do this" he said, "I do not love God because with my words I am destroying another person".

Faith is victorious in the fight against the spirit of the world

Pope Francis concluded saying that the spirit of the world is conquered with the spirit of faith: believing that God is really in the brother and sister who are close to me.

Only faith, he said, gives us the strength to tread the path of true love.

**Fr Paul writes:** As you well know Pope Francis has called together all the episcopal conferences of the catholic world, first to listen to those survivors of abuse, reflect upon them and offer concrete guidelines for the bishops of the world. Today we have a letter from Cardinal Vincent Nichols and is below for you to read. Please keep him in your prayers.

# 19th February 2019

Tomorrow, Wednesday, I travel to Rome to take part in the meeting called by Pope Francis to address the protection of minors within the Catholic Church worldwide in the light of the abuse suffered by them within the communities of the Church. I write to ask for your prayers and those of your people, for the positive outcome of this meeting and for all survivors of such abuse who will find these days particularly difficult as so much public attention is given to this reality.

The broad themes of the meeting are those of responsibility - knowing what is to be done; accountability - the ways in which we are responsible to each other; and transparency – the determination that there are no hiding places in these matters. These are the virtues, the qualities of our life together, that need to be renewed and strengthened.

An excellent website provides detailed information about this event: <a href="www.pbc2019.org">www.pbc2019.org</a>. On Saturday evening there will be a Penitential Liturgy. I ask that at Mass on Saturday evening, you add a prayer or a comment uniting your parish to Pope Francis and all taking part in that liturgy so that together we ask the Lord's pardon for our failings. On Sunday morning, at 8.30 UK time, we will gather in Rome for the celebration of Holy Mass, seeking the Lord's blessings on the work accomplished and for the challenges ahead. Please do unite your parish celebration of Mass with this intention. I am sure you will know the best ways in which to respond to these requests.

Finally, at a very personal level, please do keep me in your own prayers. These will be difficult and painful days and I need your prayers.

# **News from St Winefride's Catholic Primary School:**

On Tuesday St Winefrides Primary School held a Fairtrade breakfast to which all the children were invited. There was lots of delicious food to sample including hot chocolate, chocolate spread and banana cake made by Mrs Ormes and Mrs Dee. Louise, from Sainsbury's, also attended the event and brought lots of Fairtrade food with her! The event raised almost £100 which will be given to CAFOD. Many thanks to all involved.

The children received ashes on Wednesday to mark the start of Lent. They also reflected upon what holiness means. One of the definitions shared with the children was -"Holiness is made up of little things done with great love for God and for others."

Fr Paul writes: As you know we started the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday. It was good to see many of you at Mass and receiving the Ashes as a public sign in support of the Lord's invitation to pray, fast and support the poor. Let us pray for one another during this Holy Season. As is now our tradition the Eucharist will be placed on the alter before our weekend Mass for reflection and prayer. During this time, there will be an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Recollection. Unfortunately, I am no longer allowed to use the confessional box as this is a small confined area. It does not fit the criteria of safe guarding. I will be sitting in the hall of the house. In time the Diocese will look at a new area for the Sacrament to place, a new confessional in the church.

Last Tuesday we celebrated the funeral Mass of Cynthia Wainwright. It was good to see many parishioners coming along to this Mass. Please keep Cynthia's family in your prayers.

At our 10.45am Mass on Sunday we welcome our young people who are preparing the Sacrament of Reconciliation which will take place on Palm Sunday.

The Church Development: Last week an electrician wired in our new 'heat curtain' over the entrance doors. Hopefully this will help to keep the church warmer. Over the next week the two recesses in the sanctuary will tastefully light to bring a little life to our Patron's statue along with St Joseph. In the well of the alter and the readers desk some lighting is to be fitted where from time to time we can use to highlight our celebration of Word and Eucharist.

This week the main work will begin. The church will be painted and carpeted. The raised area behind the readers desk will be taken out. The sanctuary floor will be extended across to the bench where the Lenten banner is placed. This will take away the sharp corners which have caused many people to fall. I can assure you that when you fall you land on a very hard service! The entrance to the sacristy will be through the old confessional doors. A stonemason is drawing up some suggestions to reuse our Readers desk and shorten it to a common size. So that both tall and small people will be able to use it without vanishing behind it. As you know we won a Neston award for the lights on the church building and its garden. We are going to have fitted internal lights to illuminate the stained glass from dusk to dawn. Once again this will enhance the outside of the Church. At the rear of the Church, where the Sacred Heart statue is, we have removed two benches. Firstly, the bench by the support pole for the organ loft this is seen as a health safety issue. The second bench is covering up one of the blow heaters. Hopefully the church in that area will feel a little warmer. The statue of the Sacred heart will be returned to its place. In this area it will enable us to spend some time in prayer, without felling crushed. I'm very grateful for those who normally use these benches. The statues in the church are to be sent away to be repaired and painted. A new sign will replace the existing one which is on the church wall. The new sign will be placed by the tree so that the church details are easily seen. Just a little point about the church sign on the wall. If you stand by the road at entrance of the church, you cannot see the sign because it is hidden by the tree! Hopefully this work will be completed within three weeks. During this period the Church will remain closed. We will have daily Mass or service of Word and Sacrament in the Parish Hall. I bet you are wondering, where is the money for this work coming from. Simply after meetings with the advisers the Trustees have giving us a budget of £42.000. Now it is looking to be around £50,000. I know when things get changed it can create some anxiety. Hopefully the outcome will put these fears to rest. I am very grateful for those, of our Parish Pastoral and Finance group who are the group who represent our three weekend Masses. Thanks too, to all who came to the meetings last week. Also, to the many parishioners for their suggestions and advice. Let our prayer be, during this first week of Lent to help us all to respect one another so that we are known as a community of faithful love in Christ Jesus. Be assured of my prayers for you and your families. Fr Paul.

# News from St Winefride's Catholic Primary School:

Vital humanitarian aid is needed for the millions of people made homeless and our priority is to reach the most vulnerable with food and clean water, basic shelter and hygiene kits. The scale of the crisis is such that the Disaster Emergency Committee, of which CAFOD is a member, has launched a full-scale humanitarian appeal. You can read more about our Cyclone Idai Appeal on our website.

We are so thankful for your support of our recent Family Fast Day, which we rely on for our planned projects over the next year around the world. We don't make this request lightly, but the situation is so urgent, we are suggesting a second collection on the weekend of the 30/31st March after Masses.

Pray for the people affected by the Cyclone. Most of all, I ask you please to keep the people of Mozambique, Zimbabwe and Malawi in your prayers.
