HOME MISSION SUNDAY- 15th SEP 2013

Home Mission Sunday is the day in the Church's calendar when Catholic communities in England and Wales pray for, celebrate and support the work of evangelisation.

Bishop Kieran Conry, Chair of the Bishops' Conference Department for Evangelisation and Catechesis, explains the theme of day and asks the Catholic community to embrace Home Mission Sunday and what it stands for:

"I would be most grateful for your support in promoting and celebrating Home Mission Sunday 2013.

"The theme this year is 'Crossing the Threshold: Ministry and Outreach to Non-Churchgoing (lapsed) Catholics'. It has been chosen in response to requests from all tiers of the Catholic community in England and Wales for this to be a significant focus of the work of evangelisation.

"It's estimated that while there are around one million churchgoing Catholics in England and Wales, there are at least four million who rarely or never visit their local parish. In response to this reality the Bishops' Conference Department for Evangelisation and Catechesis is inviting every parish to make ministry and outreach to non-churchgoing Catholics a special priority in the year ahead, beginning on 15 September 2013 – Home Mission Sunday.

"While the lapsation of the baptised is not new within the Catholic community, the worry and anxiety experienced by parents, siblings and grandparents of non-churchgoing baptised, is deep and heartfelt. Praying for Peace, Message from Bishop Mark Davies

Pope Francis has called a universal day of fasting and prayer on Saturday, 7th September. The Holy Father will himself keep a Vigil of fasting and prayer in St Peter's Square from 7pm until Midnight. Pope Francis explained, "we will gather in prayer and in a spirit of penance, invoking God's great gift of peace upon the beloved nation of Syria and upon each situation of conflict and violence around the world."

Let us join the Pope in this prayer of intercession for peace united with our fasting and self-denial. I ask you, even at this short notice, to consider a time of public prayer in the parishes with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Saturday evening around the time of the Vigil Mass and Confessions so that we may be consciously united across the Diocese with the Holy Father's vigil in Rome. "I ask all the local churches," Pope Francis said, "in addition to fasting that they gather to pray for this intention." May the Shrewsbury Diocese be united in this prayer and fasting with Pope Francis on Saturday interceding in particular for a peaceful end to the conflict in Syria and to the terrible suffering of the Syrian people. The Holy Father continues to call upon the international community to make every effort to promote clear proposals for peace. "I appeal strongly for peace," Pope Francis said on Sunday, "an appeal which arises from deep within me." I wish to repeat Pope Francis's appeal in his own words: "How much suffering, how much devastation, how much pain has the use of arms carried in its wake in that martyred country, especially among civilians and the unarmed! I think of the many children who will not see the light of the future. With utmost firmness I condemn the use of chemical weapons: I tell you that the terrible images of recent days are burned into my mind and heart. There is a judgment of God and of history upon our actions which is inescapable! Never has the use of violence brought peace in its wake. War begets war, violence begets violence."

The Gospel teaches that prayer and fasting are great and powerful means to intercede for deliverance from evil. Let us each try to respond to Pope Francis's heartfelt plea to pray and fast for peace on Saturday.

Website Statistics: For those who are interested, some numbers for our visitors to our website. These figures give an overview of its use so far.

Since its launch on 1st Jan 2013 - 31st July 2013 we have had 4,415 visits of which 1,763 are "unique" visits (i.e. unduplicated visits).

In total 35.5% of our visitors to the website over this period are "new/unique" and 64.5% are returning visitors. In this period we have had 19,825 page views (i.e. the total number of pages looked at by our visitors).

The top pages viewed are: home page (i.e. main page), newsletter, parish life, events and history. Our web site has been accessed mainly from the UK (92%), but also from Canada, India, USA, Ireland, Germany, Australia, Spain and Japan among others.

We do hope the website will be used more frequently as a parish resource. From Fr Ravi...

A Lamp at the Lady Altar - in Gratitude for 170 Years of St Winefride's!

On Thursday August 15th, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Blessed Mother. In honouring Mary's Assumption, we celebrate our humanity at its best and our hope in life eternal.

Celebrating our Humanity: Mary was a woman in a world ruled by men, was young in a world that valued age, was poor in a world that considered poverty as God's curse, was a peasant far from the corridors of power. Yet the liturgy on August 15th calls her 'the greatest honour of our human race' because being human has meaning deeper than power, recognition and wealth. Humanity at its best gives and receives, forgives and is forgiven, loves and is loved.

Celebrating our Hope: Seeing Mary in heaven assures us that there is a place **in** God for each one of us and there is a place **for** God in each of us. When Jesus said, "There are many rooms in my father's mansion," our hope leads us to believe that God's love embraces us all. Mary's '**yes**' in a stable in Bethlehem and at the foot of the Cross in Calvary also implies there is a God created cavity in each of us that can be filled by God, and God alone - 'our hearts are restless until they rest in you'.

In this way, Our Blessed Mother leads us to Jesus and "the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians." [Catechism of the Catholic Church, #966].

When the renovated Lady Altar was blessed on 8th December 2012, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, it was suggested that a lamp could help us in focusing more fully as we pray and seek God's closeness through the intercession of our Blessed Mother. As we commemorate 170 years of St Winefride's this year, we will place a blue lamp in the Lady Chapel on the Feast of the Assumption in gratitude for all of God's blessings we have experienced in the church and parish community that we all love so very much. May God bless us all!

Greetings: Pope Francis has chosen this year to send a personal message to Muslims for the close of Ramadan. Usually a message is sent from the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue – a message from the Pope himself is an invitation to us all to dialogue and promote relations with the Muslim community.

Pope Francis' Message to Muslims Throughout the World for the end of Ramadan ('Id al-Fitr)

It gives me great pleasure to greet you as you celebrate 'Id al-Fitr, so concluding the month of Ramadan, dedicated mainly to fasting, prayer and almsgiving. It is a tradition by now that, on this occasion, the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue sends you a message of good wishes, together with a proposed theme for common reflection. This year, the first of my Pontificate, I have decided to sign this traditional message myself and to send it to you, dear friends, as an expression of esteem and friendship for all Muslims, especially those who are religious leaders.

As you all know, when the Cardinals elected me as Bishop of Rome and Universal Pastor of the Catholic Church, I chose the name of "Francis", a very famous saint who loved God and every human being deeply, to the point of being called "universal brother". He loved, helped and served the needy, the sick and the poor; he also cared greatly for creation.

I am aware that family and social dimensions enjoy a particular prominence for Muslims during this period, and it is worth noting that there are certain parallels in each of these areas with Christian faith and practice. This year, the theme on which I would like to reflect with you and with all who will read this message is one that concerns both Muslims and Christians: Promoting Mutual Respect through Education.

This year's theme is intended to underline the importance of education in the way we understand each other, built upon the foundation of mutual respect. "Respect" means an attitude of kindness towards people for whom we have consideration and esteem. "Mutual" means that this is not a one- way process, but something shared by both sides.

What we are called to respect in each person is first of all his life, his physical integrity, his dignity and the rights deriving from that dignity, his reputation, his property, his ethnic and cultural identity, his ideas and his political choices. We are therefore called to think, speak and write respectfully of the other, not only in his presence, but always and everywhere, avoiding unfair criticism or defamation. Families, schools, religious teaching and all forms of media have a role to play in achieving this goal. Turning to mutual respect in interreligious relations, especially between Christians and Muslims, we are called to respect the religion of the other, its teachings, its symbols its values. Particular respect is due to religious

symbols, its values. Particular respect is due to religious leaders and to places of worship. How painful are attacks on one or other of these! It is clear that, when we show respect for the religion of our neighbours or when we offer them our good wishes on the occasion of a religious celebration, we simply seek to share their joy, without making reference to the content of their religious convictions.

Regarding the education of Muslim and Christian youth, we have to bring up our young people to think and speak respectfully of other religions and their followers and to avoid ridiculing and denigrating their convictions and religious practices.

We all know that mutual respect is fundamental in any human relationship, especially among people who profess religious belief. In this way, sincere and lasting friendship can grow. When I received the Diplomatic Corps accredited to the Holy See on 22 March 2013, I said: "It is not possible to establish true links with God, while ignoring other people. Hence it is important to intensify dialogue among the various religions, and I am thinking particularly of dialogue with Islam. At the Mass marking the beginning of my ministry, I greatly appreciated the presence of so many civil and religious leaders from the Islamic world." With these words, I wished to emphasize once more the great importance of dialogue and cooperation among believers, in particular Christians and Muslims, and the need for it to be enhanced.

With these sentiments, I reiterate my hope that all Christians and Muslims may be true promoters of mutual respect and friendship, in particular through education. Finally, I send you my prayerful good wishes, that your lives may dorify the Almighty and give joy to those

lives may glorify the Almighty and give joy to those around you. Happy Feast to you all!

WORLD YOUTH DAY: REFLECTIONS Looking Back at Rio, Looking Ahead to Krakow By Ann Schneible

Now that World Youth Day in Brazil has come and gone, some of those who were there are looking back and reflecting on their favourite moments.

For an entire week, Rio de Janeiro was filled with pilgrims who had journeyed to the South American city from across the globe for an encounter with Pope Francis, as well as with the millions of other young people who share their faith.

The celebration culminated with Sunday's concluding Mass, presided over by Pope Francis on Copacabana beach, which was attended by an estimated 3 million people. As is customary, the pope announced the location of the next WYD during his Sunday Angelus address: Krakow, Poland.

"Everyone seems to be very happy about the fact that WYD is returning to the land of the founder, John Paul II," said Salt and Light producer Deacon Pedro Guevara-Mann. Deacon Guevara-Mann, who has just wrapped up his time in Rio covering the week-long festivities, said WYD 2016 is also significant because it will coincide with the 30th anniversary of the first official WYD in 1986.

One of the characteristics of this year's WYD was the nearly constant rain. Rather than dampening the spirits of the pilgrims, Deacon Guevara-Mann said that, in reality, "no one seems to mind." "People just got wet," he said. "At the Papal Welcome Ceremony the Holy Father, referring to 'cariocos' or people from Rio de Janeiro, he said that he 'had always heard that the Cariocas do not like the cold and the rain but you are proving that their faith is stronger than the cold and the rain.'"

The event which set the tone for the week, said Deacon Guevara-Mann, was the Papal welcome ceremony. He noted how the musical presentation, entitled "Rio of Faith," demonstrated how Brazil is deeply rooted in the Faith. "I'll always remember when Pope Francis called for an applause to Benedict XVI. He assured us that Pope Benedict was watching on TV."

Vigil

On Saturday, some 3 million people filled Copacabana beach to attend a prayer vigil with Pope Francis. "The vigil was one of the most powerful ones that I've ever seen," Deacon Guevara-Mann said. "The music was perfect and prayerful; everything was just right: music, symbols, witnessing, worship, the Holy Father's message. It was truly a night when God was worshipped on Copacabana Beach."

"I'll never forget [the pope] telling the young people that in order to train we have to pray, go to the Sacraments and be loving to others. He made us all repeat those three and then added, 'you're not going to forget, are you? Tomorrow, will you still remember?"

Throughout the week, and culminating with the Mass, Deacon Guevara-Mann noted how "there was much intellectual growth, but also emotional and spiritual growth. There were many emotional moments, such as the family with the little girl born without a brain, who were invited to bring her up during the Offertory at Mass and also during the Vigil when the man who'd suffered an accident and was left in a wheelchair asked us all to take out the cross from our backpacks and hold it up: 'pick up your cross.' It is that Cross that gives us strength."

"At some point, sometimes during the WYD experience, Christ calls us to stop being merely disciples and sends us as apostles. That was exactly the theme of this WYD, 'go make disciples of all nations.' Pope Francis reminded us over and over again to be disciples and also be missionaries. That's what it's all about."

PASTORAL LETTER

To be read in all churches and chapels of the diocese on the 17th Sunday of ordinary time.

My dear brothers and sisters,

Since the first missionaries sent by Pope Gregory arrived on the coast of England in the year 597 AD we could say that Christianity has formed the foundation of our common life and laws. This bedrock of Christian values has remained our nation's mainstay, despite all the upheavals of the past millennium. However, in our life-times we have witnessed a seismic shift from these Christian foundations. Parliament's decision to change the legal definition of marriage is the latest sign of this shift. We are facing together a completely new situation which invites us - with growing urgency - to engage in a "new evangelisation" and a courageous "lav apostolate." always in the closest union with the Successor of the Apostle Peter, Francis our Pope, called to be "the rock" on which the Church is built. These have been the themes of my letters to you over this past year. It is surely when foundations are shaken, the ground taken from beneath our feet, that we need to give renewed attention to the sure basis on which our future can be built. As we prayed in the Mass today: Without you, O God, "nothing has firm foundation" (Collect for the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time).

I am conscious that I write to you when Pope Francis has travelled to Brazil to join millions of young pilgrims for World Youth Day. In recent debates we heard politicians express their hope that new generations might be so secularised in outlook that they will ak: Why was anyone concerned about this guestion? Blessed John Paul II often reminded us that our witness to the truth of the Gospel has a value, not only for the present time, but for all generations to come. In his meeting with the new Archbishop of Canterbury, Pope Francis spoke of the necessity of this Christian witness: "in a world which seems at times to call into question some of the foundations of society" the Holy Father said, "such as respect for the sacredness of human life or the importance of the institution of the family built on marriage" (14th June 2013).

Today I also wish to echo some important words of the Archbishop of Westminster in a message circulated to Catholics across the country. Archbishop Nichols declares that by this deconstruction of marriage, "our society has taken a significant step away from its Judeo-Christian foundations" (The Narrow Gate, A Reflection by the Archbishop of Westminster). The Government's legislation does not, and cannot, change our understanding of marriage. In contrast to the new law, Archbishop Nichols reminds us, Christian teaching holds that marriage is a life-long faithful union of a man and a woman, ordained by God for the creation of the family and future generations. Marriage is the place where sexual relations find their proper place and God-given purpose. It would be hard to over-estimate in these respects the importance of marriage for human well-being and our ultimate good.

It might be easy to be carried along by the confusion in our country. "But this is not" the Archbishop of Westminster insists "the way of the Catholic as a follower of Christ." We may be accused of an outmoded understanding of human relationships, or even of bigotry, when trying to live and present Catholic teaching as it has been given by God. Archbishop Nichols reflects that being out of step with society for the sake of the Gospel should be no cause for discouragement. "This is our calling," he writes, and we are called to "live faithfully by the teaching we have received and to present it robustly and intelligently"- for "this teaching is no human construct but God's gift for our happiness." The re-definition of civil marriage certainly adds to a sense that people of faith are becoming, in Archbishop Nichols's words. "strangers in their own land." Nevertheless we must be ready, with genuine respect for every person, to give our witness as "energetic citizens and contributors to the common good of all."

We look forward to the day when our society rediscovers its Christian roots and the authentic value of marriage as the foundation of the family. The Youth Catechism notes that nothing in the early Church fascinated people more about the "New Way" of the Christians than their homes and families. "In an unbelieving world, islands of living faith were formed," the Catechism explains, and the great cities of antiquity which certainly did not share the Christian vision of morality "were soon permeated with domestic churches" - the Church in miniature, within the home and family. The Youth Catechism reflects that these "were like points of light. Even today families in which Christ is at home are the leaven that renews our society" (YouCat 271). I have no doubt that it is through such witness - your own witness that the Christian foundations, increasingly discarded by the leaders of our society, will be discovered anew.

United with you in prayer today, together with the nine hundred pilgrims from the Diocese in Lourdes, may we give this true and faithful witness for all generations to come,

From Fr Ravi...

St Mary of Magdala - an Apostle to the Apostles!

On Monday [22/07] we celebrate the feast of St Mary of Magdala, one of my favourites of all time and one who has fascinated theologians and artists alike right throughout history. To start with, she was not named, as many of the other women are, in reference to a man [e.g. Mary, wife of Jacob] but is associated with her place, implying that she was a well-known, important person of repute (and wealth) in her town. No wonder, she could generously support Jesus with her gifts and resources.

Unfortunately, medieval art easily identified this woman, with the 'struggling' woman at Simon's banquet in Luke's Gospel or with the one who was saved from stoning in John's Gospel. Biblical scholarship clearly indicates that this link is misleading.

What we do know is that Jesus drove out 'seven demons' from Mary of Magdala and that she along with other women became disciples and benefactors of Jesus. Again, Mary of Magdala's struggle with 'seven demons' has been easily misrepresented. She struggled with wealth, fame and pride that came with her success in Magdala. Jesus' message stirred up her heart: "If you want to find yourself, you have to lose yourself." "It will be so hard for the rich to enter the Kingdom of Heaven - a camel passing through the eye of a needle." "When I was hungry, thirsty, naked, sick or in prison, you weren't there." "The rich man begged Father Abraham to let the poor beggar bring him a drop of water." "You can't serve two masters, God and money." Her heart was so emptied to be open to receive Jesus, to love him and to follow the new commandment of love - 'love one another as I have loved you'. She was there - every step of the way - with Jesus and his mother Mary, to the foot of the cross - when other well-known names fled, her heart was on fire with love.

And on the significant 'third day', when she found the tomb empty, she was ordained to see the Risen One alive and was chosen to be an apostle to the apostles. The love of Jesus freed Mary of Magdala. May the same freedom and joy be ours as we honour our beloved saint and a leader of the early Christian community, Mary of Magdala. May God bless us all!

The Ministry of a Deacon

The origins of the diaconate can be found in the Acts of the Apostles (6: 1-6) at the institution of the "Seven" (men of good reputation!), lapsing somewhat during medieval times, and being restored to a Permanent Diaconate at Vatican II. Three reasons lay behind the restoration of the diaconate as a permanent rank of the hierarchy.

- 1. A desire to enrich the Church with the functions of the diaconate, which otherwise, in many regions, could only be exercised with great difficulty;
- 2. The intention of strengthening with the grace of diaconal ordination those who already exercised many of the functions of the Diaconate;
- 3. A concern to provide regions, where there was a shortage of clergy, with sacred ministers.

The ministry of the deacon is threefold; 'strengthened by sacramental grace the deacon is dedicated to the People of God, in conjunction with the bishop and his body of priests, in the service (diakonia) of the liturgy, of the Gospel and of works of charity.'

My Role as a Deacon at St Winefride's

Along with assisting the priest at the altar and reading the Gospel, I will be involved fully in the administration of the parish; catechising and instructing in conjunction with the various parish groups; assisting and celebrating baptisms, funerals and weddings.

I look forward to working closely with my mentor, Fr Ravi, whose encouragement and enthusiasm have been an inspiration and also our retired 'Elders in the Faith' Fr Denis and Msgr Chris, without whose support, encouragement and instruction over the last four years I could not have managed.
