Many of you must have heard already about the Vatican's first cricket team, who notched up two impressive wins in five matches on their first foreign tour, but ended their campaign by losing to the formidable Church of England side. The team, was comprised of seven Indians, two Sri Lankans, one Pakistani and an Englishman (who obviously captained the side!) Pope Francis, an avid football fan, even signed a cricket bat for them. They began their five-match series in England on September 13th by thrashing the Army Chaplains in a 20-over match at Aldershot. The following day they were beaten in Brighton by a club team and then they recorded their second win in a 30-over match against the Authors XI in Bucks. They were then defeated by the Royal Household in the grounds of Windsor Castle. The concluding Twenty20 showdown was at the St Lawrence Ground in Canterbury, a city to which, 1,400 years ago, St Augustine was sent by an earlier pontiff to establish the English church. Maybe St Winefride's could send a few players next time!

I am sure you will join me in congratulating all our young people who have had their GCSE and A level results and wish them and our children who have begun a new academic year, the very best in their studies.

Home Mission Sunday - Notes from the Bishops of England and Wales

Today is Home Mission Sunday – the day annually when we are invited to pray for and support the Church's work of Evangelisation in England and Wales.

The theme this year is *Evangelisation 'in the heart of the family'*. We are reminded that the work of evangelisation begins within our own families - in our own homes - and also within the spiritual family of our parish. As we listen to today's Scripture readings during Mass, we reflect very especially on how the Lord might be calling us to reach out to those that we know, in our home and parish family, who are non churchgoing (lapsed) Catholics.

There are four ways of responding to today's Gospel – in our lives, in our families, in our parishes and by reaching out to non churchgoing Catholics. We have to be like the workers in the parable in today's Gospel. We have to allow ourselves to be called by God to whatever acts of witness he wants from us. Pope Francis: evangelisation "is first and foremost the Lord's work, surpassing anything we can see and understand... In every activity of evangelisation, the primacy always belongs to God, who has called us to co-operate with him and who leads us on by the power of his Spirit" (EG 12).

From The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales

Pope Francis has made the fight against Human Trafficking a priority in his papacy. He recently attended a conference in Rome, co-ordinated by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, CBCEW, where he met with victims and described human trafficking as "an open wound on the body of contemporary society, a scourge upon the body of Christ. It is a crime against humanity". Pope Francis has asked that "our strategies and areas of expertise to be accompanied and reinforced by the mercy of the Gospel, by closeness to the men and women who are victims of this crime". The Church places victims at the heart of the efforts to combat human trafficking. For many years women religious have been the pioneers in supporting victims to recover personal and spiritual dignity. Their witness is an inspiration to the rest of the Church to make available its presence and expertise in human and spiritual healing. The Catholic Bishops' Conference has developed a human trafficking project that aims to raise awareness of the scale of human trafficking and develop ways of countering this crime through the use of its global Catholic networks.

Prevention: Awareness-raising about the realities of human trafficking.

Pastoral Care in-country: Pastoral and practical help to victims when they are apprehended by statutory authorities.

Re-integration: Support to help victims resettle into their host country or return to their home state if that is their desire and a secure possibility.

Developing an International Network of Bishops' Conferences and Law Enforcement agencies: Working with policing and prosecuting agencies to raise awareness of this heinous crime and to place victims at the centre of all combating human trafficking work.

From the UK based Religious Leaders on Religious Freedom in Irag:

What we are witnessing in Northern Iraq today is a tragedy of historic proportions in which thousands of innocent people are at immediate risk of death for no other reason than their religious beliefs. Freedom of religion and belief, a right set out in Article 18 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, is being denied in the most gross and systemic way possible through the attempted extermination of religious minorities. There is no religious justification for the violation of this inalienable human right.

Such violations as are currently taking place are crimes against humanity that must be both stopped and punished. The culture of impunity within which these dehumanising atrocities have been committed needs to be challenged most vigorously. Given that Iraq is not a state party to the International Criminal Court, the Government must now work towards a United Nations Security Council Resolution that refers this matter to the International Criminal Court for investigation and where necessary prosecution. The international community must send a clear signal of intent to those who are committing such atrocities that at some point they will be held accountable for their actions.

These violations are, however, sadly part of a wider global pattern of increased societal hostility and government restrictions against freedom of religion or belief. Governments, international institutions and non-governmental organisations need to recognise this wider crisis and commit the necessary time, energy and resources to ensure greater respect for this fundamental freedom in order to attempt to forestall such further tragedies.

RIP: FR DENIS CHARLES MARMION (1930 - 2014)



Please pray for the repose of the soul of Fr Denis Marmion who died peacefully in Arrowe Park Hospital on the evening of Wednesday 13th August 2014.

Father Denis was born on 20th November 1930 in Birkenhead. He was educated at St Gerard's in Bray, Co. Wicklow, and at Ushaw Junior Seminary (1942-49) along with his brothers John and Vincent before he continued his studies for the priesthood at the Venerable English College, Rome (1949-56). He was ordained in the church of the Twelve Apostles (Santi Dodici Apostoli) in Rome on 27th November 1955.

His first appointment was as assistant priest in St Joseph's, Stockport (1956-58), followed by St Mary's, Dukinfield (1958-60), St Alban's, Macclesfield (1960-63), and St Peter's, Hazel Grove (1963-70). In 1970 he was appointed parish priest of Our Lady of the Rosary, Donnington (1970-78) followed by St Mary's, Middlewich (1978-87), Our Lady's, Birkenhead (1987-96), and St Winefride's, Sandbach (1996-2001). He retired in 2001.

Fr Denis was appointed Judge on the Diocesan Tribunal in 1979, a post he continued to actively fulfil right to the end. Fr Denis led a very active retirement being fully involved in parish life and recently wrote a pamphlet on the war poet, Wilfred Owen. As well as planning a parish pilgrimage to Rome next year, he was also starting to write a book on Julian of Norwich. He will be greatly missed.

Bishop Mark Davies' homily at a Requiem Mass for the Fallen of the First world War, Sunday 3rd August 2014

"The names inscribed on the memorials of the Great War should remind people that the cost of conflicts is always measured in human lives".

The Rt Rev. Mark Davies reminded the congregation in Shrewsbury Cathedral that every casualty in war was "always a human person, a brother or sister, of ours".

"Each time we pass through the entrance of the Shrewsbury Cathedral we pass the list of names, the memorial to the men of this parish who perished in the vast conflict which would touch almost every family," Bishop Davies reminded the faithful of how Pope St Pius X strenuously opposed the Great War as "disastrous" at a time when millions across Europe cheered and celebrated when it was declared.

"Pope Pius was asked by the warring parties for his blessing. His response was emphatic: 'I will not bless war, I will bless peace."

The 20th century then became, in the words of St John Paul II, "the century of tears", and one which witnessed "violence and destruction on a scale never seen before".

"It was surely in the minds of those who set up memorials in Shrewsbury and far beyond that a message be left for future generations by the words: 'lest we forget.' It is a message applied to the souls swept up in these conflicts who appeal for our prayer and it carries a moral message for the future.

The listing of names on the memorials of war challenges us still to recognise the person beyond the rank or number. In the Gospel Our Lord never saw anonymous crowds but each and every human soul. He 'took pity on them' St Matthew tells us.

In the tragic drama of the past hundred years it was the eternal value and dignity of every human person which was so often lost sight of. Today as we hear within the 24-hour news cycle of a Syrian refugee, a Palestinian child, a missing Israeli soldier we are invited in faith to recognise not a statistic but always a human person, a brother, a sister of ours."

The Diocese of Shrewsbury is also marking the centenary with a Year of Peace and Reconciliation, recognising anew "how peace begins or is lost within the human heart".

The Year of Peace, the Bishop explained was by the call of Pope Francis to a day of prayer and fasting last September as the world stood on the brink of the escalation of the conflict in Syria into a major regional war.

"Pope Francis invited us to open our hearts to a higher wisdom, a greater mercy and appealed to world leaders and all peoples to look deep into their consciences, and today as we offer this Requiem Mass for all the fallen of the Great War, for those listed on the memorial of our Cathedral and on memorials which stand across the earth we pray that we may not lack the wisdom, the light to recognise what makes for true and lasting peace."



"As the Church in England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales celebrates the 2014 *Day for Life*, the Holy Father expresses his confidence that this annual witness to the sanctity of God's gift of life will inspire the faithful, and young Catholics in particular, to combat the culture of death, not only by working to ensure adequate legal protection for the fundamental human right to life, but also by seeking to bring the merciful love of Christ as a life-giving balm to those troubling "new forms of poverty and vulnerability" (cf. Evangelii Gaudium 210) which are increasingly evident in contemporary society".

Background: Day for Life is celebrated yearly by the Catholic Church in Scotland, England and Wales and Ireland. It's a day dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition.

Protect and Cherish Life: Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales

Pope Francis knows and loves young people. At World Youth Day in Rio last year, to over three million young people, the Pope said, "young hearts want to build a better world." He invited them to be "protagonists of transformation" and urged them not to be mere "observers of life, but to get involved. Jesus did not remain an observer, but he immersed himself. Don't be observers, but immerse yourself in the reality of life, as Jesus did."

We all know heroic young people who are getting involved in the messiness of life – helping the young; the weak, the elderly, the vulnerable - and putting the needs of others above their own. In this year's Message for Day for Life the Bishops of Ireland, Scotland, England & Wales would like to follow in the footsteps of Pope Francis and invite everyone to get involved in caring for, nurturing and protecting life at every stage and in every condition. To young people especially we want to say "#Livelife!" from its beginning to its natural end.

In a 'throwaway' culture, it is easy for life to be undervalued. Last year, Donal Walsh, an extraordinary 16-year-old from Kerry in Ireland, suffering from terminal cancer, taught us how to value every second of life and to show gratitude for all that we can so easily take for granted. Donal had "wanted to live, to play for Munster, to travel the whole world to raise children and die when I'm 100" and instead of reacting with anger and despair at the news of his cancer, he embraced life to promote his anti-suicide #Livelife message. He wrote and spoke widely in the media about young people and suicide – urging teenagers to "appreciate what you have, know that there are always other options and help is always there". His #Livelife message has touched many hearts and changed lives.

Every one of us, young and old alike can play our part in the promotion of life. Our every thought, word or action can promote or extinguish life – we all have a valuable contribution to make.

Pope Francis tells us that being a protector of life is about, "protecting all creation, the beauty of the created world... It means respecting each of God's creatures and respecting the environment in which we live." The pope speaks of "protecting people, showing loving concern for each and every person, especially children, the elderly, those in need, who are often the last we think about." He emphasises the importance of the family, "husbands and wives first protect one another, and then, as parents, they care for their children, and children themselves, in time, protect their parents." And of caring for society by "building sincere friendships in which we protect one another in trust, respect, and goodness. In the end, everything has been entrusted to our protection, and all of us are responsible for it."

Let's all be builders of a better world and protect life.

The Scaffold speech of St John Plessington 19th July 1679

Dear Countrymen.

I am here to be executed, neither for Theft, Murder, nor anything against the Law of God, nor any fact or Doctrine inconsistent with Monarchy or Civil Government. I suppose several now present heard my trial the last Assizes, and can testify that nothing was laid to my charge but Priesthood, and I am sure that you will find that Priesthood is neither against the Law of God nor Monarchy, or Civil Government. If you will consider either the Old or New Testament (for it is the Basis of Religion). St Paul tells us in Hebrews 7:12 that the Priesthood being changed, there is made of necessity a change of the Law, and consequently the Priesthood being abolished, the Law and Religion is quite gone. But I know it will be said that a Priest ordained by authority derived from the See of Rome is by the Law of Nation to die as a Traitor, but if that be so what must become of all the Clergymen or England, for the first Protestant Bishops had their Ordination from those of the Church of Rome, or none at all, as appears by their own writers, so that Ordination comes derivatively to those now living.

As in the Primitive times, Christians were esteemed Traitors, and suffered as such by National Law, so are the Priests of the Roman Church here esteemed, and suffer suc. But as Christianity then was not against the law of God, Monarchy or Civil Policy, so now there is not any one Point of the Roman Catholic Faith (of which Faith I am) that is inconsistent therewith, as is evident by induction in each several point.

That the Pope hath power to depose or give licence to Murder Princes is no point of our Belief. And I protest in the sight of God and the Court of Heaven that I am absolutely innocent of the Plot so much discoursed of, and abhor such bloody and damnable designs. And although it be Nine Weeks since I was sentenced to die, there is not anything of that laid to my charge, so that I may take comfort in St. Peter's words,

I have deserved a worse death, for though I have been a faithful and true Subject to my King, I have been a grievous sinner against God; [others would have lived] in a greater perfection [than] I have done had they received so many favours and graces from him as I have.


But as there was never sinner who truly repented and heartily called to Jesus for mercy, to whom he did not show mercy, so I hope by the merits of His Passion, He will have mercy on me, who am heartily sorry that ever I offended him. Bear witness, good hearers, that I profess that I undoubtedly and firmly believe all the Articles of the Roman Catholic Faith, and for the truth of any of them (by the assistance of God) I am willing to die, and I had rather die than doubt of any Point of Faith, taught by our Holy Mother the Roman Catholic Church.

In what condition Margaret Plat one of the chiefest witnesses against me was before, and after she was with me, let her nearest relations declare. George Massey, another witness, swore falsely when he swore I gave him the Sacrament, and said Mass at the time and place he mentioned, and [I] verily think that he never spoke to me, or I to him, or saw each other but at the Assizes week. The third witness, Robert Wood, was suddenly killed, but of the Dead why should I speak? These were all the witnesses against me, unless those that only declared what they heard from others. I heartily and freely forgive all that have been or are any way instrumental to my Death, and heartily desire that those that are living may heartily repent. God bless the King and the Royal Family and grant his Majesty a prosperous Reign here and a crown of glory hereafter, God grant peace to the Subjects, and that they live and die in true Faith, Hope, and Charity. That which remains is that I recommend myself to the mercy of Jesus, by whose merits I hope for mercy. O Jesus, be to me a Jesus.

From Fr Ravi: British Women show the way...

Recently Pope Francis has formally declared that Mother Mary Veronica of the Passion, a Carmelite nun, had lived a life of "heroic virtue". Born Sophie Leeves, Mother Mary Veronica founded the Sisters of the Apostolic Carmel, a religious congregation of Carmelite nuns based in India. She was born in 1823 in Constantinople to the Rev. Leeves, an Anglican chaplain to the British Embassy, and Marina Haultain, the daughter of a Colonel in British Army. When she was a teenager she felt drawn to the Catholic Church and converted at the age of 27 during a visit to Malta in 1850. She became a nun the following year and in 1863 accepted a teaching post in Kozhikode in India and she went on to found her own teaching order five years later and today it has branches in India. Sri Lanka. Kuwait, Pakistan, Kenya, Rome and Bahrain,

Frances Taylor was a nurse who tended dying soldiers alongside Florence Nightingale in the Crimean War. Frances, the youngest of 10 children of an Anglican vicar from Lincolnshire, was 22 when she volunteered to join Florence in Scutari, Turkey, in 1854. She was deeply impressed by the faith of the dying Irish soldiers she was caring for and she became a Catholic while serving in the field. She established a religious order – the Poor Servants of the Mother of God – which under her direction opened refuges for sex workers and homeless women and children in London before spreading throughout Europe. As Mother Magdalen Taylor, Frances also founded the Providence Free Hospital in St Helens, Lancashire, and she took over the running of St Joseph's Asylum in Dublin. She died in her convent in Soho Square in 1900 after falling ill en route to Rome and she is buried at Roehampton, south west London, after establishing 20 institutions in her own lifetime. Today her order continues to work particularly with the poor, the elderly and the disabled.

Other British women who are being considered for sainthood include Elizabeth Prout, a 19th century Passionist nun who worked in the slums of Manchester; Mary Potter, a Londoner who founded an order of nursing nuns in Nottingham in the same period, and Margaret Sinclair, a 20th century Scottish nun who died of tuberculosis after tending to the poor of Edinburgh. The Vatican is also studying the sainthood causes of London-born Mother Riccarda Beauchamp Hambrough, a Bridgettine nun who helped to hide about 60 Jews from the Nazis in her Rome convent during the Second World War, and Mother Katherine Flanagan, also a London-born Bridgettine.

May these women along with other well known British women saints - Anne Line, Margaret Ward and Margaret Clitherow continue to inspire all of us!


