Statement on the Refugee Crisis by the Bishops of England and Wales

Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine. you did for me (Mt 25:40)'

At last Sunday's Angelus, Pope Francis invited every parish, religious house and monastery in Europe to respond to the growing refugee crisis by offering a place of sanctuary to families fleeing from war and persecution in their home countries. The Pope calls on our generosity and solidarity to recognise and act upon our common humanity.

The UK government has agreed to receive and resettle up to 20,000 Syrian refugees from the camps in neighbouring countries over the next five years. The Catholic Church in England and Wales will work alongside Government and local authorities to offer welcome and support to those in need. The refugee crisis is a huge challenge, not only in Europe and the Middle East, but in many others parts of the world where large numbers of refugees live deeply uncertain and perilous lives. Consequently, as a Catholic community, and as a country, we need to be committed to helping refugees over a long period. To sustain that effort we need moral imagination.

We recognise that we can all contribute and play a part in helping to support the most vulnerable of refugees. Such assistance includes: Prayer ; Financial support ; Time and professional skills (eq language teaching, legal help) ; Shelter and accommodation.

We can all be attentive to those who are vulnerable and newly arrived in our local communities and parishes. A warm welcome can be the most simple yet effective of gifts we can all offer.

Practically, we are working to ensure, as far as possible, that every diocese has a contact nominated to co-ordinate your parish/individual response; they will liaise with the local authority and other faith groups to match offers of time, talents and accommodation with the pressing humanitarian needs of the local area. From Fr Ravi... Pastoral Care of the Sick

As many of our Eucharistic ministers would affirm, those being visited, eagerly look forward to our visits, wait to read our newsletter, ask interesting questions about the various activities of our parish and keep us all in their daily prayers. While we pray and celebrate the sacrament with them, they, in turn, enrich us with their hope, their wisdom and with their deep and lively faith.

I am sure you may have seen in recent times our Eucharistic ministers approaching the altar just before the thanksgiving prayer, to collect their pyx's containing consecrated hosts. It is to remind us of the continuation of the sacrament during their visits and also to show the real communion that exists with the worshipping community of those not able to be present in church. We are made One, by the One Bread and One Chalice.

My communion visits are on Wednesday mornings and our Eucharistic ministers visit mainly on Sundays or according to the availability of those being visited. If anyone is in hospital, every effort is made to visit them as soon as I get to know from the hospital or from those concerned. However, if someone is at home or in a care home, the practice is that a visit is requested by the person concerned or by the immediate family. This is to follow established procedures in this regard. Please do not hesitate to contact me or our Communion Visits Coordinator, Tony Topping or the Eucharistic Ministers Coordinator, Joe Tunstall.

We remember the birth of Mary on September 8th and in many places around the world, special prayers are offered for the sick as our Blessed Mother is honoured that day as 'Our Lady of Good Health'. At least two million people of all faiths, congregate every year about this time at a shrine dedicated to her, not far from my home in India, which St Pope John Paul II described as 'the Lourdes of the East'.

May the Eucharist make us all One and may Our Lady of Good Health intercede for us as we trust in God's healing love for everyone!

SEPTEMBER 1st WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION

Pope Francis has established an annual day of global prayer for creation. It will be celebrated on 1 September. In a letter to the heads of the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace and the Pontifical Council for the Promotion

of Christian Unity, Pope Francis said:

"The annual World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation will offer individual believers and communities a fitting opportunity to reaffirm their personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of creation as well as his pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live."

The Day of Prayer is in unity with Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew of Constantinople, who began a similar day of prayer for the Orthodox Church in 1989.

"The celebration of this Day, on the same date as the Orthodox Church, will be a valuable opportunity to bear witness to our growing communion with our Orthodox brothers and sisters."

Over 50% of the results were grades A* - B, with a record number of students gaining grades A* and A. This confirms the school's continuing trend of success for its A level students.

GCSEs

The staff have been delighted to see records broken by the most successful Year 11 cohort ever.

'Our mission is to provide the best Catholic education for all our students,' said the Headteacher. 'We have young people who have secured straight A* and A grades, and others who will be delighted to have passed their examinations in English and Mathematics. I am really proud of all of them and what they have achieved.'

The score that schools are judged on include the percentage achieving 5 or more A*- C grades including English and Maths, and this year 68% of the year group secured this figure. The percentage of A*-C grades in English was almost 90%, and 80% secured at least a C grade in RE.

(Cf LS n.155) Yet he does so precisely because his appeal for an "ecological conversion" is based firmly on faith in the Creator and the order of creation which we will shortly stand to affirm in the words: "I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.'

Pope Francis uses a hymn composed by Saint Francis of Assisi which speaks of how all creatures exist in relationship to each other. This awareness allowed the great Saint of Assisi to sing of the earth, the seas and rivers as related to us as a sister, a brother, a mother (Cf. LS n.11). This 'Canticle of the Creatures' leads Pope Francis to echo the beautiful words of the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "God wills the interdependence of all creatures.
