A statement from the trustees of Foodbank - 10th September 2019

The risk of food poverty in a Brexit no-deal scenario.

West Cheshire Foodbank helps people experiencing crisis food poverty caused by social and economic policies. However, we are campaigning, as well as a helping, organisation. We are part of a movement of people committed to a flourishing society, where the scandal of hunger alongside affluence is ended. Our strategy is therefore to press for policy change rather than to perpetuate the need for foodbanks. It is not our strategy to expand our operation should government policy create more need for our service. A no-deal Brexit scenario could indeed cause hardship to many people, not least those who are already vulnerable. However, as a Trussell Trust foodbank, we will hold government to account for its performance in creating food security.
