

We have received a letter from Daniel Turner, Right to Life UK and share the information with you below.

Dear St Winefride's Parish

Firstly, Right To Life UK is very pleased to announce that Cardinal Vincent Nichols, Archbishop of Westminster, has become a patron of our organisation. We are very grateful to His Eminence for his support of our work.

Secondly, we would like to congratulate Lord Alton of Liverpool for being this year's recipient of The Westminster Award for Human Life, Human Rights, and Human Dignity. This award recognises extraordinary and notable work and achievements that safeguard the dignity and right to life of human beings. We are grateful for the many decades he has given to the protection of lives and for the inspiration he is to all those in politics and positions of influence.

Lastly, we would like to thank you for all your prayers and support over the past few months. You will have likely heard of a <u>recent parliamentary win</u>, wherein an attempt to hijack the UK Government's flagship Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill with two extreme abortion proposals failed. This would not have been possible without the support of you and your congregations. By contacting your MPs and sharing your disapproval of these amendments, it was made clear to MPs that these amendments lacked the support of their constituents and so were prevented from becoming law, leading to the likely saving of many lives.

In light of all this, we continue to reach out in request of prayers from both yourself and your parishioners. We'd love for you to include our intentions however you feel is most appropriate. I have written some suggested prayers that could be used over the coming month:

1st - "We pray for all unborn children diagnosed with disabilities, we pray for protection for them and their mothers from the pressures of society to have an abortion, and that they would instead experience overwhelming support by all who surround them. Lord hear us"

8th - "We pray for all women going through unexpected pregnancies, that they would experience peace and support in this circumstance, and recognise the many blessings that motherhood brings. Lord hear us"

15th - Yesterday we celebrated the feast of St Maximilian Kolbe, patron saint of the pro-life movement. On this feast of the Assumption, we ask for his intercession, along with Our Lady's, as we the church seek to support all pregnant mothers through their pregnancies, and that we would become models of support and charity to all in society. Lord hear us."

22nd - "We pray for the families and friends of pregnant women. That they would recognise their responsibility to care for both the mother and child, and that they would shower them with love and support through the journey of pregnancy and beyond. Lord hear us"

29th - "We bring to mind the words from James in our second reading and his call to look after those in need. We pray that, as a church, we would improve how we look after those who are experiencing difficulty in their pregnancies and provide the care and support they need in welcoming their child to the world. Lord hear us"

From Fr Francis: In the Gospel of today we hear the conclusion of the "Bread of Life discourse" and this section of John's Gospel is sometimes called the "crisis of Eucharist". Jesus had just delivered the central teaching concerning the gift of his body and blood as a source of life to all, and how we must eat his flesh and drink his blood to have true life within us. If that teaching were only symbolic, it would not have offended those followers as St John tells us that some of those who listened to Jesus turned away at this point and followed him no longer.

Belief in the Real Presence, that bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, presents a moment of crisis for some Christians in every age. We are challenged by Jesus to renew our faith in the Divine Presence, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in the Holy Eucharist just as he challenged his chosen disciples to reaffirm their faith and trust in him.

Spiritual Communion is a Christian practice of desiring union with Jesus Christ in the Eucharist even when one is unable to receive Our Lord sacramentally because of distance or for some other reason.

Act of Spiritual Communion

Reflection on the Sunday Gospel by Fr Stephen Coonan



Jesus returns to his home-town, is rejected by his relatives and says, "A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house." A prophet speaks on behalf of God, as God's messenger and on behalf of those who have no one to speak for them, giving a voice to the voiceless, for example the widow, the orphan, the stranger. A prophet is not a **fore-**teller but a **forth-**teller, who

proclaims with insight the evils that afflict society and can ultimately spell its downfall. Jesus proclaims the nearness of God's reign, urges people to take a second look at their lives and embodies God's mercy by associating with the marginal and suspect people of his day. Jesus' rejection by his family is mentioned by all the gospels. None of his named relatives are among his first disciples. Only John mentions that Jesus' mother is at the cross. Jesus did not fulfil their desire for a nationalistic messiah who would drive out the Roman occupiers but proclaimed instead forgiveness of enemies and acceptance of non-Jews. Because their minds are closed he could work no miracle there.

But first, I would like to take this opportunity to thank Fr Paul for the service he has given to St Winefride's church over the last 5 years and wish him all the best, following the announcement of his retirement last weekend.

Fr Francis comes from the Southern State of India, Kerala and joined the Society of St Paul in 1983. The Society of St Paul, often known as St Pauls or Paulines, was founded by Blessed James Alberione in Italy and is engaged in the mission of media apostolate, especially, publishing and media education.

After completing 12 years of secular and religious studies in Bangalore, Allahabad, Mumbai and Delhi he was ordained in 1995. His first assignment after my ordination was as the Rector/Master of our seminarians doing their 3-year Bachelor's Degree course.

From 1999 he worked as the Director of Import and Export division of St Pauls and regularly attended trade fairs overseas, especially to meet Catholic Publishers of Europe and North America to procure, especially, books in areas of philosophy, psychology and theology for the seminaries in India and to get copyrights for publishing books in India.

In 2004 he moved to St Pauls in Australia and did his Masters in Business Administration and also served as Regional Vicar and General Director of their apostolic activities there. In March, 2014 he came to London as the Superior of the Community and Managing Director of St Pauls, co-ordinating its publishing and multi-media centres in UK and Ireland. In the last 3 years he was also involved in the pastoral service of Salford diocese.



Robert's funeral will take place on Tuesday 27th July at 10am.




This year's Sea Sunday takes place this weekend 10th and 11th July. We are having our collection here at St Winefride's next weekend, 17th/18th July.

The following insert was in the Neston Parish newsletter and was by Reverend Alan Dawson and I felt it was important to share with our parishioners as this is such a growing problem.

JUST SAY NO !!!

Recently, watching an early morning magazine programme on BBC1, it was highlighted how many scams go on these days. Many of these purport to be genuine companies making contact by email and asking you to click on a link. DON'T do it! Only if you really feel it is necessary to make contact with the company do it by a totally different route. The contact details should be available on their public website.

Secondly, scams also come by telephone. Do not respond to anyone unless you know them already. Again, if felt necessary, ALWAYS make contact with the company through a different previously known route. Especially if the contact is guiding you away from doing so!

A current scam purports to be from an organisation sounding very legitimate e.g. Action Fraud or a trusted company such as BT Open Reach. The scammer may have the most genuine, kind and trusting voice you have ever heard, but not always so. Just say NO!! and put down the phone. Wait - and only if you feel it absolutely necessary to make contact, do so through another route. And if possible, on a different phone.

Scammers often do not put their phone down, thus keeping the line open pretending to be the person you call next. You need to switch off <u>and</u> unplug your phone before using that phone again.

I do not like giving this message but with the number of scams tried on parishioners we all need to be alert to the possibility and reality that it does happen and could happen to YOU.

So, if you have a call/email from an unexpected source, think SCAM. Use another trusted route if you really want to follow up. The early morning BBC magazine programme regularly highlights scams so be informed. **Most of all... Just say No !!!**

Let's fight back with good (practice) !!!

CATHOLIC BISHOPS' CONFERENCE OF ENGLAND AND WALES

Statement from the Catholic Bishops of England

Sunday – it is our Day1

On 19th July, the current legislative powers which assist the mitigations against the covid-19 virus transmission will be rescinded by HM Government. Nevertheless, there will be an encouragement to personal and corporate responsibility in this area; as the Prime Minister said in his most recent statement "The pandemic is not over." Even without this legislation in place, the Church in England and Wales will be adopting a cautious approach to capacity and activity within our buildings, especially at corporate acts of worship.

We are mindful of the certain fact that the Covid-19 virus is still circulating in society. Vaccines provide genuine protection against the worst effects of the virus, yet we recognise the legitimate fear on the part of some who otherwise desire to gather for Holy Mass. It is our continuing judgement, therefore, that it is not possible at the present time for all of the faithful to attend Mass on a Sunday thus fulfilling their duty to God.

It is hoped that it will be possible for all Catholics in England and Wales to fulfil this most important Church precept, that of the Sunday Obligation, by the First Sunday in Advent 2021.

In the meantime, all Catholics are asked to do their best to participate in the celebration of the weekly Sunday Mass and to reflect deeply on the centrality of Sunday worship in the life of the Church.

In April, following our Plenary Assembly, we offered a reflection on the experience of the extraordinary long months of the pandemic. It was titled *The Day of the Lord*. We also began to look at the way forward. We spoke about the important invitation to restore the Sunday Mass to its rightful centrality in our lives. We asked for a rekindling in our hearts of a yearning for the Real Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist, as our response to the total, sacrificial love that Jesus has for us. We said: "The Eucharist should be the cause of our deepest joy, our highest manner of offering thanks to God and for seeking his mercy and love. We need to make it the foundation stone of our lives."

May this continue to be our striving during these coming months as we journey back to the full celebration of our Sunday Mass and our renewed observance of *The Day of the Lord*.

1 St Jerome, In Die Dominica Paschae II

A message from Father Francis.... Pope Francis has established a World Day for Grandparents and Elderly People which will take place on Sunday 25th, the nearest day to the Feast of Ss Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus, which is on Tuesday 26th. Grandparents and Elderly have always played a great role to foster, nurture, educate, promote and pass on faith to successive generations. The significance of grandparents and elderly for young people's faith has potentially never been greater. Today we remember with gratitude all our Grandparents and Elderly People who have influenced us in our faith formation and we keep them all in our prayers.

In view of the new regulatory requirement that falls on the Health and Safety, the Risk Assessments for services at St Winefride's is still valid and we need to continue the good practice we have in place. Can I ask everyone coming to Mass to continue using the hand sanitiser, the face covering and social distancing for the moment for the continued safety of us all. I would now encourage you to come to weekday Mass if you can't make it on weekends or spend some time for your private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

This Sunday and for the next four Sunday's we interrupt our regular reading from St Mark's Gospel to read Chapter 6 of St John's Gospel on Eucharist. John's Gospel does not have an account of the institution of the Eucharist. But Chapter 6 of John's Gospel contains Jesus' teaching about himself as the bread of life. It is an opportunity for us during this summer time, to reflect on what the Eucharist is and what it can be in our life. The church teaches that Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life". Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that sacraments are actions of Christ and brings saving grace, but the Eucharist is Christ himself, the author of grace. If you would like to spend some time in the Lord's real presence before the Mass, the blessed sacrament will be exposed from 9 am during the week and 5pm on Saturdays.

I would like to say a special thanks to John, Mike and all the stewards for helping us keep church open and ensure that we are keeping clean and safe.
