

Every morning when I go for a walk, I meet people walking or jogging in the opposite direction. They wave at me and say "hello". I don't know who these people are and they don't know me either. I also wave back and say "hello" in return. This speaks volumes to me. I am not a stranger here, I am a friend and I feel welcomed.

I'd like to say a very big thank you to all the Christians at St Winefride's for your friendship and cooperation. Thank you for coming to Sunday and weekday liturgies and for your lively participation.

I'd like to conclude my thanks with these few notes on prayer.

When you pray, always try to place yourself in God's presence. He is not only everywhere and in all things, but he is present in a most particular manner in your heart.





The Need for Mercy – even at the Olympics

Fr Christopher Jamison joined the BBC Radio 2 Chris Evans Breakfast Show to give his 'Pause for Thought' -Wednesday, 17 August 2016.

The Olympics continues to be as exciting as ever with so many wonderful achievements. But sometimes the Games give rise to sadness as well as joy. The 1984 Games in Los Angeles saw two of the world's great long distance runners competing in the women's 3,000 metres final. The American Mary Decker was a world champion but recently a younger South African had come to prominence, the barefoot runner Zola Budd. To get round the Olympic ban on apartheid South Africa, she was running for Team GB.

Mary Decker led from the start but round the halfway mark, Zola edged ahead. Refusing to concede the lead, Mary kept literally on Zola's heels, clipping her rival's bare foot. This meant Zola lost her balance and Zola's foot then hit the side of Mary's leg, causing Mary to fall. Mary fell so badly that she couldn't even stand. Zola continued in the lead but some of the crowd started to boo. On the last lap, she fell back and finished well outside the medals.

Zola later revealed that she dropped back on purpose as she couldn't face standing on the podium and being booed. Mary blamed Zola, although in later years she withdrew that accusation.

The two runners still competed against each other but never met personally until last vear. They came together to make a film about the race and found they could be friends. They come across as wonderful people and superb athletes. Yet that incident in 1984 showed that neither of them was perfect. They are "flawsome", both awesome and flawed. We're all "flawsome" and need to treat each other with mercy when our flaws begin to

How often must I forgive somebody who wrongs me Jesus was asked. Seven times maybe? Encouragingly for us "flawsome" people, his answer was not seven but seventy times seven. Even Olympians need mercy occasionally and the rest of us certainly do.

In his 'Introduction to the Devout Life', St Francis de Sales gives some practical instructions on prayer. I will just mention some of these and hope they will help us make progress in our prayer life.

Prayer places our intellect in the brilliance of God's light and exposes our will to the warmth of his heavenly love. It is a stream of holy water that flows forth and makes the plants of our good desires grow green and flourish, and quenches the passions within our hearts.

Practice mental prayers, the prayers of the heart which centres on the life of our Lord. You will learn his ways and form your actions after the pattern of his. He is the 'light of the world' and it is by him that we must be instructed and enlightened.


Just as little children learn to speak by listening to their mothers and lisping words with them, so also by keeping close to our saviour in meditation and observing his words, actions and affections, we learn by his grace to speak, act and will like him.

Set aside some time every day, if possible, early in the morning, when your mind is less distracted and fresher after the night's rest. Thirty minutes or one hour should be sufficient.

In the Parish here at St Winefride's we have a wonderful tradition of meditation before the Blessed Sacrament from 8am until 8.30am. This is followed by saying the Divine Office in common. Finally, we conclude with Holy Mass. What a brilliant way to kick start our day. I am happy and grateful to God that so many people attend these spiritual exercises here in Neston, and I am sure the rewards they bring to each individual are many.

The Portiuncula Indulgence.


Some parishioners have been asking about the significance of the Portiuncula Indulgence given on August 2 at the Poor Clare's, Hawarden.

The Portiuncula is an ancient Church dedicated to Mary under the title Our Lady of the Angels and is located in Assisi, Italy.

The Chapel of antique construction and venerated for the apparition of Angels within it, belonged to the Benedictine monks of Subasio. It was on a piece of land called 'Portiuncula' (similar to Italian for a small portion) and later, the name of the land passed to the little Church itself.

It was abandoned for a long time and was restored by St. Francis. It was here that he understood his vocation clearly and here that he founded the Order of Friars Minor. (1209). The land and the Chapel were gifted to him by the Benedictines for making it the centre of his new religious family. The Portiuncula Indulgence originated here in 1216 in a vision in which Francis obtained from Jesus himself the indulgence of the Pardon of Assis that was approved by Pope Honorius III. This plenary Indulgence may originally be gained on August 2 and 15.



From Council for the Pastoral Care of Migrants and Itinerant People: Seated comfortably on the sofa in our living room, we find it difficult to understand how much our daily life is depending on the maritime industry and the sea. If we look around in the places where we live and work, we realize that most of the furniture and IT equipment we are using have been transported by ships, our clothes were shipped in containers from the other side of the world and the fruits we eat were delivered by refrigerated ships from another country while tankers are transporting oil and petrol for our cars. Without seaborne trade the import and export of goods and finished products would not be possible.

Even when we decide to enjoy and relax by going in a cruise we do not think that thousands of seafarers are working hard to make sure that everything will run smoothly and we will have a comfortable vacation.

Furthermore in the recent humanitarian emergency in the Mediterranean Sea the crews of merchant vessels have been in the front line to intervene and rescuing thousands of people trying to sail to Europe on board of overcrowded and unseaworthy vessels, inflatable rafts.

Almost 1,200,000 seafarers of every nationality (many of them from developing countries) on board of 50,000 merchant ships are transporting almost 90 per cent of every kind of cargo. The unforgiving forces of the open sea and of the oceans expose ships to significant risk, and the seafarers are "risking their life"

more than one way.

The physical life of the seafarers is at risk because aside from the hazards of the forces of the nature, piracy and armed robbery, shifting from one area to another and constantly evolving and adapting to new situations, continue to be a major threat to the security of the crew. Their psychological well-being is at risk when after having been at sea for days or weeks they are denied shore leave and prevented to leave the vessel.

The family life of the seafarers is in danger because their contracts force them to stay away from their families and loved ones for many months and often for several years on a row. Children are growing up without a fatherly figure while all the family's responsibilities are on the shoulders of the mother.

The human and working dignity of the seafarers is at risk when they are exploited with long working hours and their wages are delayed for months or in cases of abandonments not paid at all. Criminalisation of seafarers is a serious concern especially considering that in recent years a number of previously considered lawful seafaring activities have been criminalized particularly in relation to incidents such as shipwrecks, pollution, etc.

Encouraged by Pope Francis who called the chaplains and volunteers of the Apostleship of the Sea to "be the voice of those workers who live far from their loved ones and face dangerous and difficult situations"1, as Apostleship of the Sea we stand at the side of seafarers to reiterate that their human and labour rights must be respected and protected.

We would like also to call on Governments and competent maritime authorities to strengthening the implementation of the ILO Maritime Labour Convention (MLC) 2006, especially the Regulation 4.4 whose purpose is: To ensure that seafarers working on board a ship have access to shore-based facilities and services to secure their health and well-being.

Finally, on this occasion of the annual celebration of Sea Sunday we would like to remind to all Christian communities and to each individual how important and essential are the seafarer profession and the shipping industry for our daily life. We would like to call on the bishops, especially the ones of maritime Dioceses to establish and support the Maritime Apostolate as "a visible sign of your affectionate attention to those who cannot receive ordinary pastoral care."

While expressing our gratitude to the seafarers for their work, we entrust them and their families to the maternal protection of Mary, Stella Maris.



A Port Chaplain's Story

"From meeting the guy on security as I board a ship to meeting the rest of the crew and officers I have no idea what will come up when I meet a crew," said Peter Barrigan, Apostleship of the Sea (AoS) port chaplain on the Tees.

Peter, who is also a permanent deacon, became an AoS port chaplain after spending 30 years working for a local brewery. He is supported by a team of volunteer ship visitors and a number of local parishes.

"If I ever make the mistake of saying to myself, 'Ten minutes should do it on this ship,' I'm always proved wrong," he said. "One of the crew will ask, 'Sir, can you help me? I need...' And you are caught up in the needs of that one person or others on the ship. "The challenge is to be open to whatever comes up in conversation. It can range from the need to sort out a personal problem on board, help in dealing with bad news from home, or just being prepared to listen as a seafarer wants to chat about family.

"I enjoy meeting people and engaging with them. It fascinates me, that no matter where in the world people come from, the same basic things are important to them: family, finances, the future for them and their children, football and, for most, their faith."

Being a port chaplain is incredibly rewarding, he said. "I think it's that we do a very simple task. We go on board to ask if we can help the seafarer with anything: it may be with phone cards to keep in touch with their family, or a lift into town for them to purchase some items.

"We also supply hats or gloves or other bits of clothing, rosaries or prayer cards, or help with getting to Mass, the temple, or to a mosque." "Seafarers often want to talk about their families and we are in a very privileged position of being there to listen and share in their lives for a brief time. It's a very simple task and the thanks we receive from the seafarers for the visit is humbling.

As you leave you will often hear, 'Thank you for your visit.' I often think I've done little but whatever we do is appreciated." What impresses Peter about many of the seafarers he meets is their faith. "When you see the crew taking part in the Mass and the reverence with which they receive Holy Communion it makes me realise how lucky I am to be able to get to Mass any day of the week.
