A PASTORAL LETTER ON THE VOCATION AND MISSION OF THE FAMILY

My dear brothers and sisters,

I write to you today in the light of the Child born for us, the Saviour who was given to us within the love and unity of a human family. On this Feast of the Holy Family, as we celebrate the holiness of family life and begin a 'Year for Vocations' in the Diocese, I want to reflect on the 'Vocation and Mission of the Family'. This is the title Pope Francis has given to the Synod of Bishops to take place in October next year. It will be a year for Catholics across the world to reaffirm our faith in God's plan for the family, and to do so amidst the many challenges confronting the holiness of marriage and the life of the family today. In a few, simple words I want to affirm what the Church has always believed about marriage and the family. We believe marriage is no human invention but that "God himself is the author of marriage". The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains: "the vocation to marriage is written into the very nature of man and woman as they came from the hand of the Creator" (CCC 1603).

After the Fall of Humanity, marriage would bear the marks of sin, but Christ Himself restored this Divine calling, raising it to the dignity of a Sacrament. To the astonishment of a people who practised divorce, Jesus reaffirmed that the union of marriage is indissoluble. "What God has united," Our Lord tells us in the Gospel, "man must not divide" (Mt 19:6). We believe that this unbreakable union of man and woman provides both the foundation of the family and becomes for all, the image of the unfailing love of God. This is no small claim to make! St Paul declares this to be "a great mystery ... in reference to Christ and the Church" (Eph 5:32).

We believe that the union of husband and wife, expressed in the union of one flesh, must always be open to new life, to the children God may entrust to the couple. We believe sexual relations belong within marriage alone. And we believe we are all called to chastity according to our state in life.

Indeed, it is by living the beautiful virtue of chastity that we ensure we use this gift of sexuality in accord with God's purpose. We believe that, as is true of the Sacrament of Matrimony, both

- virginity for the sake of the Kingdom of God and apostolic celibacy are also God's gifts. We believe that these callings to marriage, to consecrated virginity and to apostolic celibacy - inseparably support each other. Let us be filled with wonder and gratitude for God's plan and purpose in marriage and family life; in the beauty of chastity; in the joy of consecrated virginity and apostolic celibacy. It is God's grace that makes it possible for us to live these vocations faithfully; and if we fall short, that same God-given grace heals us, making it possible to set out once again on the path of conversion.
- In the year ahead, Pope Francis invites us all to make a "true, spiritual discernment" in the light of our Catholic faith. To "discern" means to make a right judgment. Pope Francis has made it clear, contrary to many stories circulating in the media, that the Church does not function like a parliament, nor can truth be determined by opinion polls. The Church seeks to live subject to God's Word, certain that the light and beauty of truth - despite our fallen nature - can be recognised by the conscience of every man and woman. In order to assist this spiritual discernment, the Bishops of England and Wales have produced a leaflet, entitled 'The Call, the Journey and the Mission'. In considering the questions contained in this leaflet, you may wish to write in and share the fruits of your own reflection on how we give witness to the Gospel of the Family. This will contribute to the wider discernment within the Church in the year ahead. And so, today, let us pray in the words of Pope Francis: "Jesus, Mary and Joseph, in you we contemplate the splendour of true love, to you we turn in trust ... Holy Family of Nazareth make us once more mindful of the sacredness and inviolability of the family, and its beauty in God's plan."
- May the New Year, 2015, lead us to give renewed witness to the Gospel of the Family. I send this message with my blessing for you and for your family.



Darkness seemed to have preceded and followed Jesus' birth. The star that guided the travellers, we are told. disappeared for a while and the cries of the innocents followed the birth of the Messiah. History seems, sadly, to repeat itself to this day. The Defence Minister of Pakistan tweeted: "the smaller the coffin, the heavier it is to carry."

There is, however, light that shines in the darkness. When some of the residents of Sydney were fearing a backlash recently, a woman on the train tried to take off her head covering. A fellow traveller approached her gently and told her, "No, if you want to wear it, then wear it. I'll walk with you." Humanity at its best! This resulted in the hashtag #illridewithyou (I'll ride with you) going viral and hundreds of Australian citizens accompanied their frightened friends or neighbours to work.

Christmas is God's way of tweeting #illridewithyou or even more than that: God becoming 'one with us' (Emmanuel). This becomes real, especially when we need God most - in all our fears and doubts, hurts and wounds. Fr Chris and Deacon Mike join me in wishing you all a very Merry Christmas: May the blessings of Christmas fill our hearts with joy, our homes with happiness, our communities with love and our world with peace.

From Fr Ravi.... Rejoice Sunday!

The 3rd Sunday of Advent is called Rejoice (Gaudete) Sunday and symbolically we light the pink candle today, to remind ourselves that we rejoice because the Lord is very near. The theme 'rejoice' appears in today's entrance antiphon, is at the heart of the First Reading from Prophet Isaiah and St Paul in his letter calls us to 'rejoice in the Lord always'.

Paul, writing the letter to the Philippians from his prison cell mentions 'rejoice' about 17 times - he was no naive optimist. Henry Nouwen, whose writings we are familiar with in our parish, makes a distinction between happiness, which is dependent on external conditions, and joy which is something deeper. It is "the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved and that nothing - sickness, failure, emotional distress, oppression, war, or even death - can take that love away."

A beautiful way to open ourselves to this grace of being joyful is to approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We are delighted to welcome Bishop Brian back to our Parish this weekend to guide us through our 'Reconciliation Sunday'. Mgr Chris Lightbound and I will be available after each mass for confessions and we are grateful to Canon John Marmion (Sat 6.30pm) and Fr Terry Boylan (Sun 8.45am) for helping us this weekend.

We also remember our beloved Pope Francis in our prayers on 17th December, his birthday.

A PASTORAL LETTER ON OVERCOMING THE CRISIS OF MARRIAGE AND THE FAMILY

My dear brothers and sisters,

On this Remembrance Sunday we recall the great crises faced by generations before us in the conflicts of the past century. Last month, Pope Francis invited bishops from around the world to meet with him in Rome to address what we might call a crisis of our time: the crisis of the family. This is experienced in some parts of the world in poverty, war or persecution; but in western countries like our own, it is a crisis most often caused by ideologies opposed to the sanctity of human life and the institution of marriage and the family.

The Catholic Church has long opposed these mentalities and the devastation they have wrought on individuals, societies and especially among the young and most vulnerable. Pope Francis recently declared that the "Christian family and marriage are under great attack," due, he said, to the growing relativism regarding the very concept of marriage (Address to the Schoenstatt Movement, 27th October 2014). God's plan of marriage, which is written into human nature and raised by Christ to be a Sacrament, is being replaced by the idea that we can each make our own truth according to our own ideas and desires (cf. Gaudium et Spes 47).

The first Christians required great courage to overcome and transform a vast, pagan world whose ideas about marriage and sexual morality were not unlike those which prevail in our own culture. Today we need this same, supernatural, courage to give witness to all the Church believes and teaches about marriage, the family and human sexuality. The Synod of Bishops, gathered around Pope Francis, met precisely to consider how "the Church and society can renew their commitment to the family" (Final Synod Report, October 2014).

Yet, I am conscious that there have been many reports since the end of the Synod, Pope Francis asked: "please do not the Synod suggesting the Church is about to change her forget to pray for me!" constant teaching. The Church, he added, always seeks "to receive the needy, the penitent and not only the just or those who believe they are perfect!" Pope Francis insisted that we must not only welcome those who are lost amid this crisis, we must be ready to go out and find them!

The Church offers the truth she has received from Christ her Lord, not with hostility towards those who have taken a wrong path, but with the greatest love and concern for every person. The Church on earth is made up of sinners called to become saints; our practice of frequent Confession is, indeed, a constant reminder that every one of us is called along this path! It would be the ultimate failure in pastoral care or charity, to mislead people by encouraging them to remain in sin, or fail to call them to repentance and renewal (cf Lumen Gentium 8). Pope Francis describes such an approach as "deceptive mercy," a false mercy which bandages wounds but fails to heal them.

Today I want to dispel any misleading impression that the Church will abandon her witness to the truth and change her teaching in the face of hostile trends in public opinion or the destructive ideologies of our time. Pope Francis spoke of this as: "the temptation to come down off the Cross, to please the people, and not stay there, in order to fulfil the will of the Father; to bow down to a worldly spirit instead of purifying it and bending it to the Spirit of God."

Pope Francis has set before us the example of Saint John Paul II whom he named "the Pope of the family"; and of Pope Paul VI whom, at the end of the Synod, he declared among the Blessed, not least for his sometimes lonely witness to the truth. In the crisis we face today, let us look to the great inheritance of their teaching. May their courage and prayer inspire us to seek a greater faithfulness and a deeper understanding of what Christ and His Church truly teach about marriage, the family and human sexuality. At
