We are always open to suggestions, to receiving pictures or reports from any groups or to receive any help by joining our webteam!



PASTORAL LETTER At the Close of the Year of Faith Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King

St Luke tells us in the Gospel: "The people stayed before the cross watching Jesus" (Lk 23:35). St Luke is careful to describe for us the reaction of people around the Cross on the first Good Friday: leaders jeer, soldiers mock, a dying man derides Our Lord. We notice in the Gospel that this is something more than ignorance or doubt; there is a real antagonism: "He saved others," they say "let him save himself" (Lk 23:35). This was the scene on Calvary two thousand years ago and it is a drama which continues today wherever the claims of Christ are now rejected and

derided. It is the hour for our faith to be proved amid

the continuing uproar around the Cross of the Lord.

I write to you at the end of the Year of Faith called by Pope Benedict and continued by our Holy Father, Pope Francis. During this Year we have had several reminders of how Christians in many parts of the world face increasing threats of violence and intimidation in order to stand by Christ's Cross ('Persecuted & Forgotten' www.acnuk.org/persecution.) We are aware that during these same months, Christians have suffered violent deaths rather than renounce the name and the love of Christ. All this gives to our celebration of the Year of Faith a new perspective. It also gives perspective to the antagonism we can experience to the claims of Christ and to the witness of Christians in the life of our own society. This situation may at times tempt us to avoid speaking the name of Christ if it makes our contemporaries uneasy, to remove His Cross from view or to understate His claim of Kingship. On Calvary, there was one voice which made a profession of faith. St Luke tells us of a dying criminal who cut through all the fear and intimidation around him to say: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Lk 23:41). This man receives the promise: "Today you will be with me in paradise" (Lk 23:42). This is the faith which leads to the eternal promise St Paul describes in the Mass today: "(The Father) has taken us out of the power of darkness and created a place for us in the kingdom of the Son that he loves, and in him, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins" (Col 1:13).

The celebration of this *Year of Faith* has surely invited us all to raise our own voices calmly and clearly in a renewed profession of our faith.

The first message of Pope Francis was that we can work as much as we want and construct many things, "but if we do not confess Jesus Christ, things go wrong". Pope Francis insists: "We may become a charitable Non-Governmental Organisation but not the Church, the Bride of the Lord ... When we do not confess Jesus Christ, we confess the worldliness of the devil, a demonic worldliness" (Pro Ecclesia Mass, 14th March 2013). You might have noticed a few words inscribed beneath the coat of arms of our Diocese. Every Bishop is asked to choose three or four words from Sacred Scripture to sum-up his hope and purpose. My motto for the years I will serve as bishop is simply this: "Nihil sine Christo" - "nothing without Christ". This is a three-word summary of the words of Our Lord found in St John's Gospel where He tells us: "Without me, you can do nothing" (Jn 15: 5). It is surely the lesson we must constantly re-learn in our own lives. It is the lesson which leads us back to the means of grace entrusted to the Church, above all to Christ Himself truly present in the Holy Eucharist.

I have no doubt that the future of our Diocese will be decided by the courage and constancy of such faith. In my first letter to the Diocese three years ago I echoed the prayer of the first apostles who said to the Lord: "Increase our faith!" (Lk17:5). At the end of this Year of Faith I ask you to renew with me this same prayer in the Mass today where "the sacrifice of Christ offered once for all on the cross remains ever present" (CCC 1364). Before Christ our Lord, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, let us say: "Lord, increase our faith!" Increase our faith so that we may go from Mass every Sunday to give our own courageous and constant witness to Christ the King.

Wishing you the joy of the approaching Season of Advent and a truly blessed celebration of Christmas,

Retiring Collection this weekend: CAFOD's Philippines Typhoon Haiyan Appeal

We have all seen the devastating images of suffering and grief following the typhoon in the Philippines and we are still waiting to see the full impact on communities and individuals. This is reported to be the worst storm ever experienced, killing at least 10,000 people in the city of Tacloban alone and devastating the lives of many others with the widespread destruction of homes, schools and roads. The typhoon hit some of the areas that were affected by an earthquake in October, adding further damage and hampering aid efforts.

CAFOD has been very grateful to receive generous support from parishes, schools and individuals following the recent Harvest Fast Day which ensured that communities around the world can address the scandal of extreme poverty and injustice in their lives. Sadly we need to appeal once again to our Catholic community as we respond in its name to this new emergency. We are now launching the **Philippines Typhoon Haiyan Appeal** which was fully supported by the bishops of England and Wales in their plenary meeting on 11 November.

How CAFOD is responding on behalf of the Catholic community: We are working with Catholic Relief Services and with Caritas Philippines to provide the most urgently needed aid: food, emergency shelter and essential household goods (such as pots, pans, blankets and cooking equipment) for people who have lost everything. With water supplies disrupted in many areas, we shall also provide clean water and sanitation to prevent the spread of disease

In the longer term, donations from the Catholic community will help people to rebuild their homes and to make a living again. Because of the scale of the flooding and because roads have been blocked, some parts of the country remain difficult to reach and we are supporting our Church partners to rapidly scale up their response in the worst hit areas.

Today there will be a special collection after Mass for CAFOD's emergency response to the extensive damage and suffering caused by Philippines Typhoon Haiyan. CAFOD is working with local Church partners to provide emergency shelter, food and water. You can also donate online at cafod.org.uk/typhoon, or by calling CAFOD on **0500 85 88 85**.

CAFOD is appealing as part of a national response by the Disaster Emergency Committee (DEC). In the unlikely event of income exceeding need for this appeal, additional monies will be allocated to other urgent emergencies.

From Fr Denis

On Tuesday we celebrate the feast day of St. Teresa of Avila. St. Teresa reformed the Carmelite Order in Spain in the middle of the 16th century and worked closely with St. John of the Cross. In all, she founded 17 new convents throughout Spain. Teresa was known for her warm personality, charm and common sense - one of her sayings being "God preserve us from stupid nuns". She is one of the 33 "Doctors of the Church" and can serve as a guide for all of us, especially in prayer. A famous story concerning Teresa describes her journey to Burgos. When crossing a ford, the Saint recalls, "The water had risen so high that it had submerged the pontoons ... there was water everywhere and on both sides it was very deep". Eventually they made it through. That night she turned to Jesus in prayer and complained about her perilous journey to Him. He said, "That is how I treat my friends". Teresa retorted, "Yes, My Lord, and that is why you have so few of them". A supporter of St. Teresa was St. Peter of Alcantara, whose feast day we celebrate on Saturday and is one of the patrons of Shrewsbury Cathedral.

In the 20th century Edith Stein, a Jewess, read Teresa's autobiography in a day and said, "This is the Truth". Edith became a Catholic, and then entered Carmel. She died in a concentration camp in World War 2 and was canonised by Pope John Paul II. Let us remember to pray for our Carmelite Sisters in Birkenhead and elsewhere.

From Deacon Mike...

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary mainly because the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th. It was instituted to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful.

The practice of dedicating the entire month of October to the Holy Rosary developed towards the end of the last century. Pope Leo XIII (papacy: 1878-1903) strongly promoted the increase of devotion to the Blessed Mother by encouraging the constant use of the Rosary. Many other popes have contributed to help increase devotion to the Rosary by their writings.

Pope Francis attributes his own devotion to the Rosary from the example of John Paul II: "If I remember well it was 1985. One evening I went to recite the Holy Rosary that was being led by the Holy Father. He was in front of everybody, on his knees. The group was numerous; I saw the Holy Father from the back and, little by little, I got lost in prayer. I was not alone: I was praying in the middle of the people of God to which I and all those there belonged, led by our Pastor.

In the middle of the prayer I became distracted, looking at the figure of the Pope: his pity, his devotion was a witness. And the time drifted away, and I began to imagine the young priest, the seminarian, the poet, the worker, the child from Wadowice... in the same position in which knelt at that moment, reciting *Ave Maria* after *Ave Maria*. His witness struck me. I felt that this man, chosen to lead the Church, was following a path up to his Mother in the sky, a path set out on from his childhood. And I became aware of the density of the words of the Mother of Guadalupe to Saint Juan Diego: "Don't be afraid, am I not perhaps your mother?" I understood the presence of Mary in the life of the Pope. That testimony did not get forgotten in an instant. From that time on I recite the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary every day."

You are invited to join the dedicated parishioners praying the Rosary, one of our best known devotions, during this month of October. Even if you can only join for a "decade" you are most welcome. The Rosary is said directly after daily weekday mass at the back of the church. You are all most welcome!
