From Fr Francis: We are delighted to be welcoming children in Year 3 and above who wish to receive the First Holy Communion to our Parish Sacramental Programme. For a number of reasons, including the difficulties posed by the current Covid-19 restrictions, the sacramental preparation will take place in church. It is facilitated by a team of catechists from school and parish who will help parents and carers to prepare the children during and after 11am Family Mass on Sundays.

We invite all parents and guardians who wish their children to make their First Forgiveness and First Holy Communion this school year to the welcome Mass and introductory meeting after the Family Mass on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> October at 11am.

I believe parishes are the living communities of the faith and coming together each Sunday is the best preparation for the sacrament, nurtured and nourished. As a parish, we keep all our families, schools, and catechists in our prayers as we welcome them at our Sunday Masses in this year of preparation.

Synod 2021-23: As you may know, Pope Francis has called a Universal Synod dedicated to the theme: "For a Synodal Church: communion, participation and mission" which will help in shaping the future both here in the diocese and in the wider Church. Bishop Mark has asked that this "journeying together" in communion, participation and mission be part of the reflection and discussion at the forthcoming Deanery Conferences in October.

The Holy Father will launch the synod on 9/10<sup>th</sup> October and each diocese will begin its participation from Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> October. #### UNIVERSAL SYNOD 2021- 2023: Your responses are requested!

What is a Synod? Why should I be involved? Pope Francis has called a Synod on Synodality: Communion, Participation and Mission. This meeting will provide an opportunity for all bishops to discuss various aspects of "synodality" focussing on these three areas. Pope Francis is keen for each one of us to have the opportunity to participate in some way. For details of the process either visit the diocesan website www.dioceseofshrewsbury.org or the Vatican website <a href="https://www.synod.va">www.synod.va</a>.

Bishop Mark has asked each parish to prayerfully listen, reflect and discern on the themes Pope Francis has given us. To help us through the process the Parish Social and Community Group have created a Synod team to guide our parish through this process and create opportunities for us to pray, listen and discern. Due to the ongoing pandemic, we will be offering online meetings during January and February 2022. More details of when and how to participate in the new year. We have until 1st March 2022 to submit our views to the Shrewsbury Synod Office by email or by post.

The first five themes of the ten are given here – the next five will follow next week. We suggest you reflect on the questions you are most drawn to.

- 1. **COMPANIONS ON THE JOURNEY** *In the Church and in society we are side by side on the same road.*
- a. In our local Church, who are those who "walk together"?
- b. Who are those who seem further apart?
- c. What groups or individuals are left on the margins?
- 2. **LISTENING** Listening is the first step, but it requires an open mind and heart, without prejudice.
- a. How may God be speaking to us through voices we sometimes ignore?
- b. How are the laity listened to, especially women and young people?
- c. What enables or prevents our listening?
- d. How well do we listen to those on the peripheries and on the margins?
- 3. **SPEAKING OUT** All are invited to speak with courage, freedom, truth, and charity.
- a. What enables or hinders us to speak out courageously, candidly, and responsibly in our local Church and society?
- b. When and how do we manage to say what is important to us?
- c. How is our relationship with the local media (not only Catholic media)?
- 4. **CELEBRATION** "Walking together" is only possible if it is based on communal listening to the Word and the celebration of the Eucharist.
- a. How do prayer and liturgical celebrations inspire and guide our life and mission?
- b. How do they underpin the most important decisions?
- c. What opportunities are there for participating in the ministries of lector, acolyte and in the other liturgical ministries?
- 5. **SHARING RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR COMMON MISSION** Synodality is at the service of the mission of the Church in which all baptised members are called to participate as missionary disciples.
- a. What hinders the baptised from being active in mission?
- b. What areas of mission and service are we neglecting?
- c. How does the community support its members who serve society in various ways (social and political involvement, scientific research, family life, education, business, promoting social justice, protecting human rights, prolife issues, caring for the environment, etc.)?
- d. How does the Church help these members to live out their Christian values and give witness to their faith in their service to society?

More details will be given early in the new year. Do consider taking part in order to discern and to listen to others in our community as we travel on our journey 'firm in faith, joyful in hope, active in love'.
