From St Win's Justice and Peace Team: This week St. Winefrides' Parish held a Justice and Peace event to celebrate life of Archbishop Oscar Romero, thirty five years after he was killed while saying Mass and two months to the day of his beatification in San Salvador. There was not a seat to spare in our Church Hall so a massive thank you goes to all who supported the event. The evening started with a sung prayer on a theme dear to Romero's heart. Our grateful thanks go to quest speaker Margaret Lillis for a powerful account of the social role of CAFOD in El Salvador. Margaret set in context the courage and sacrifice as Romero stood against oppression under the fiercest pressure and ultimately at the cost of his own life. It was heartening to see how Romero's personal tragedy lives on in a spirit of solidarity and endurance. The talk made Romero's legacy relevant today and showed why his beatification means so much to Christians all around the world, serving as an inspiration to live our faith with active support for dignity and justice and echoing his own words that Peace is generosity, it is right and it is duty.

Archbishop Romero was murdered on 24th March 1980 as he was celebrating the Eucharist. He has become a symbol for all those who struggle for justice and peace in today's world. To celebrate his life, our Justice and Peace representatives, have organised a Romero evening. Margaret Lillis who was in El Salvador recently will share her experiences with us at 7:30pm on Monday 23rd March in the Church Hall. All are welcome. Romero, thanks to Pope Francis, will be beatified on May 23rd 2015 in San Salvador on the day before Pentecost.

GIFT AID SCHEME 2015/16

Weekly envelopes are now available in the boxes for 2015/16 from the rear porch. They are in surname alphabetical order to enable you to select your box quickly after mass. The new yellow envelopes start on Sunday 12th April 2015 i.e. the new tax year, so please do not use them before this date. If you are no longer a tax payer please let Mike Jevons know as soon as possible.

If you are you a tax payer and donate cash each Sunday into the loose plate, please consider joining the Gift Aid Scheme as we can claim 25p back from the Government for every £1 donated at no cost to you! There is a minimum potential sum of over £1,500 that we lose every year.

All you have to do is sign one form declaring you are a taxpayer and then decide whether to donate by a bank standing order or by weekly envelopes. Forms are available to directly from Mike Jevons, Scheme Administrator 336 5026 or online from our website.

SVP ANNUAL APPEAL: Loving thy neighbour-making it happen in our community through the SVP

The St Vincent de Paul Society is an international Catholic voluntary organisation which aims to help all individuals and families in the spirit of justice and charity, helping those who are suffering in whatever form.

SVP at St Winefride's

We have a long history going back over more than 30 years; our group plans its work by meeting every Monday night at 7:30. It has the aim of providing friendship and practical support to any members of our community who may need a helping hand.

We provide companionship and support to the sick or vulnerable, whether at home, in a nursing home or in hospital. In our community, we carried out over 800 visits last year; many of these are to our regular clients, these range from having a chat to helping fill in official forms (and the occasional crossword!). We organise a Christmas party for our clients; an opportunity for them to meet up together.

As well as our work in the parish we support overseas SVP Twinnage projects. In India, we sponsor students to help with their education. Just £15 helps one student with their studies for a year. And in Sudan, we support projects working with local people including a baby feeding programme.

The Furniture Project, run by the Ellesmere Port conference is one way we provide practical help. Volunteers collect unwanted furniture to sell in the SVP shop, the proceeds supporting our work. Please call 0151 355 0689 for details.

We are one of eight 'Conferences' in the Chester and Cheshire West District SVP sharing a holiday home in North Wales. Our sponsored walk and theatre night contribute to meeting the annual running costs. If you know someone who could benefit please contact us.

PEACE SUNDAY, 18 January 2015: Slaves no more but brothers and sisters

Pope Francis describes slavery as 'an open wound on the body of the human family - a running sore on the flesh of Christ'. Someone is considered to be in slavery if they are forced to work – through mental or physical threat

- owned or controlled by an 'employer', usually through mental or physical abuse or the threat of abuse
- dehumanised, treated as a commodity or bought and sold as 'property'
- physically constrained, or with restrictions placed on his/her freedom of movement

Modern slavery takes various forms and affects people of all ages, gender and races.

- Possible links to poverty/indebtedness causing people to act out of desperation to support themselves and their families
- It is also linked to conflict, as many are forced by the violence of war to leave everything behind and seek refuge elsewhere. In
 the process they are taken advantage of by unscrupulous people. Women and children are also 'enslaved' by the violence of
 war: abducted and traded as 'spoils' of war, raped or trained to become child soldiers.
- It reminds us that some people are enslaved in work that they consider to be unethical or immoral, such as the arms trade with little or no alternative

May we all experience the freedom and joy of being God's children by sharing the gift of Peace with everyone!

CHRISTIAN UNITY OCTAVE, 18th - 25th January 2015: The Well is Deep

The theme comes to us from the churches of Brazil. Brazilians, have traditionally been tolerant of their various social classes and ethnic groups and are now experiencing growing intolerance made manifest in high levels of violence, especially against minorities and the vulnerable. The logic that underpins this kind of behaviour is competition for the religious market. Increasingly, some Brazilian Christian groups compete with one another for places in the mass media, for new members and for public funds.

The Brazilian churches have begun to recognise that intolerance should be dealt with in a positive way - respecting diversity and promoting dialogue as a permanent path of reconciliation and peace in fidelity to the gospel. We can share this recognition. Although the competition between churches is less obvious in our islands, we are well aware that competition and violent discrimination lie beneath the surface of our lives together. Jesus challenges us to acknowledge that diversity is part of God's design, to approach one another in trust and to see the face of God in the face of all men and women.
